

LIFEgroups: Feb 2020 – Growing in Faith

Connect's focus in 2020 is for us to grow in faith as disciples of Jesus Christ, personally and as a church family. There are a number of aspects to this and we'll explore these over the course of the year.

REFLECTION: Take a few minutes in your LIFEgroup to consider these initial questions:

- Are you praying for 3 people how's it going?
- What does it mean to you to "grow in faith?"
- In what ways would you be able to identify that there has been growth in your faith?
- How do you plan to be accountable for growing in your faith?

DISCUSSING THE MESSAGE:

If we are going to grow in our faith, then we need to know where we are at on our journey in faith

Read Eph 2:8; Rom 12:3; 1 Tim 1:14; Acts 3:16

- What do these passages tell us about how we get faith?
- How have you encountered faith in your own life?

1. Faith is a gift from God

The Cambridge English Dictionary defines faith as "Great trust or confidence in something or someone" In the original form of Greek that the New Testament was written in faith is the translation of the word "pistis" which is in noun form (a noun is a naming word: a person, place or thing.) The word for belief is "pisteuo" which is a verb form (a verb is a doing word: an action)

- What does the difference between a noun and a verb indicate about the difference between faith and belief?
- How have you acted on faith and belief in your own life?

Read Heb 11:1; Rom 12:2

- What do these passages tell us about what faith is?
- What changes do you expect or do you think God expects of someone who has faith?

2. FAITH: is a gift that expects a response...

The Billy Graham Association makes the statement that: "Faith has two parts"

- 1. Belief that God exists, that He loves us & sent His Son into the world to save us
- 2. A definite decision not only to believe in our minds that Christ can save us, but to put our lives into His hands and trust Him alone for our salvation.



- Discuss whether you agree or disagree and why?
- What are some ways in which the church is or can be deficient by this definition?

It was stated that: FAITH is invisible & made visible when what we BELIEVE is demonstrated by how we ACT on what we believe

Read Luke 17:5; Mark 9:24

- What do these passages tell us about faith?
- How do you think your faith can develop and grow?
