Growing up without a father, Matt had no stable role model to guide him. He fell in with the wrong crowd and developed harmful addictions and behaviors that took control of his life. He experienced times of sobriety – even developing a relationship with God and preaching the gospel. But over time he relapsed and continued down the same destructive path.

Finally, when he permanently lost custody of his precious young daughter because of his drug use, he was heartbroken. And he asked the Lord to help him change his life. “It was the beginning of my surrender to Jesus Christ,” he says. He came to the Mission to continue his journey in our Christ-centered program.

“I wanted to pursue God in prayer... in meditation... and in His Word,” Matt says, “and I have found all that here.” And as he embraces God’s forgiveness for his past transgressions, “I’m learning to love myself the way God loves me,” he says.
