# Certificate III in Individual Support



This qualification reflects the role of workers in the community and/or residential setting who follow an individualised plan to provide person-centred care to people who may require support due to ageing, disability or other reasons. Work required involves using discretion and judgement in relation to individual support as well as taking responsibility for own actions. Workers will have a range of factual, technical and procedural knowledge, as well as some theoretical understanding of the concepts and practices to provide holistic person-centred support.

## Pathways & Further Study

Upon successful completion of the Certificate III in Individual Support students will be offered advanced standing into the Certificate IV in Ageing Support. Students may also use the qualification to assist them in gaining entry level employment.

## Course Requirements

To be awarded a Certificate III in Individual Support, competency must be achieved in thirteen (13) units. Elective subjects selected will provide students with two specialisations: Ageing and Home & Community. Students will also be required to undertake 120 hours of practical placement in the workplace.

# Certificate IV in Ageing Support



This qualification readies students for the role of support workers who complete specialised tasks and functions in aged services; either in residential, home or community based environments. Students learn how to take responsibility for their own actions within defined organisation guidelines and maintain quality service delivery through the development, facilitation and review of individualised service planning and delivery.

This qualification provides skills and knowledge for an individual to work primarily in residential care facilities and disability support centres under direct or regular supervision within clearly defined organisation guidelines and service plans.

## Pathways & Further Study

The recommended pathway to this qualification is completion of CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support. Candidates may progress to higher level qualifications within and/or across the community sector. After successful completion of the program, the student may gain employment in aged care services, disability support centre, residential group homes, training resource centres, day respite centres and open employment services, other community settings and clients' homes.
