

How should I prepare for making my Will?

To enable you to make your Will quickly and easily it will help to have thought about the following before going online:

- Try to estimate the likely value of your estate, including property, savings, shares and significant debts (e.g., any outstanding Mortgage).
- Decide on your executors and any guardians you need to appoint, for example for any children in your care.
- Decide what should happen to any pets you may own at the time of your death.
- Think about any specific personal items you'd like to leave to family and friends.
- Think about any family, friends or charities you may wish to leave cash sums of money to and how much. Have their details (names, addresses, registered charity numbers) to hand.
- Decide how you would like the residue of your estate to be shared out; this is what is left when all debts have been paid and specific items and cash sums have been distributed. This can be shared out amongst family, friends and charities in whatever percentage you choose.
- Think about your funeral wishes such as burial or cremation and whether you would like donations to charity instead of flowers.
