







Launch meeting

TNM 2 AcHopInt Launch Meeting could not be organized in Ireland as planned because of force majeure reasons (COVID-19). Therefore, Launch Meeting has been organized online by BUU with the attendance of all partners on April, 30th 2020. This TNM contributed to the development Intellectual Outputs no. 3, 4, 5 & 6 of AcHopInt. The newsletter covers the agenda and outcomes of this meeting.



International Coaching System Methodology

UMHAIHL presented the International Coaching System that they have been working on since the kick off meeting. Generated system has been approved by all partners. UMHAIHL had also conducted a pilot study in their high school and presented the results to the consortium.

The outcomes of the presentation were that International Students Coaching does not provide an International Output, however it is an important part of the Academic Hospitality Model. Therefore, ISC will highly contribute to the IO 4 Academic Hospitality Model which will be generated by BUU.

Acahos Online Platform

Joe Coll from LYIT presented the latest structure of Acahos Online Platform after the last updates. After consortium discussion about the translation of the web site to the consortium institutions' languages it has been decided that LYIT will translate the web site to partners' which are benefiting from weglot program languages and all partners will provide control for the translation.

Work plan for A4.4, A4.5, **A4.6**

Jenny Chen from BDF presented the updated workplan for "Designing training modules for academic and non academic staff", LTT activity & "Organizing workshops for academic and non academic staff". The consortium discussed

and agreed to decide the date of LTT activity (which should happen in October 2020) in June 2020 according to the COVID-19 crisis. If the crisis do not let the consortium to travel in October 2020, the LTT activity will be organized in January 2021. Jenny Chen also presented the lastest version of the creation of content for IO3 which was contributed by consortium. Moreover, in order to reach and communicate with HEIs in Freisland "Designing training modules for academic and non academic staff" activity deadline has been extended until October 2020.

Work plan for A4.9, A4.10

Aylin Poroy Arsoy from BUU informed about updates of "Designing Hospitality Model and generating flow charts for every stage" & "Developing guidelines for academic and non academic staff". These activities lead to reach IO4 - "Academic Hospitality Model" and IO5 - "Guidelines for academic and non academic staff".

BUU and the vice leading partner HBVU are studying on literature review for both - the model and the guideline. lt has emphasized that BUU and HBVU will revise the guidelines after the LTT activity.

Dissemination & sustainability strategies

Audrone Rackauskiene from KTU presented the dissemination plan of AcHopInt followed consortium discussion about dissemination opportunities during COVID-19 crisis.

As the outcome, possibilities of organizing webinars and online dissemination strategies will be considered as well as social media tools will be used more effectively.
