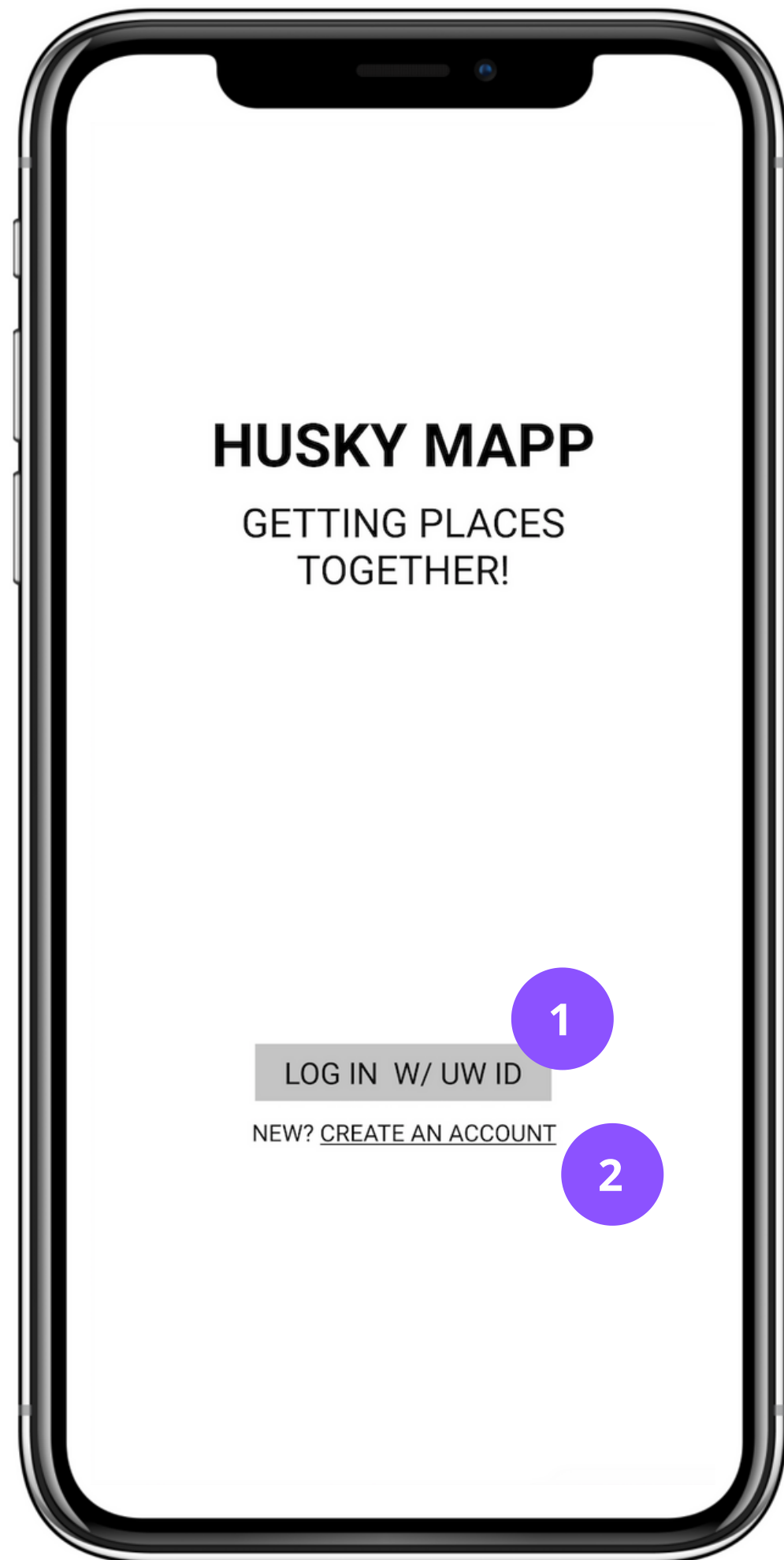


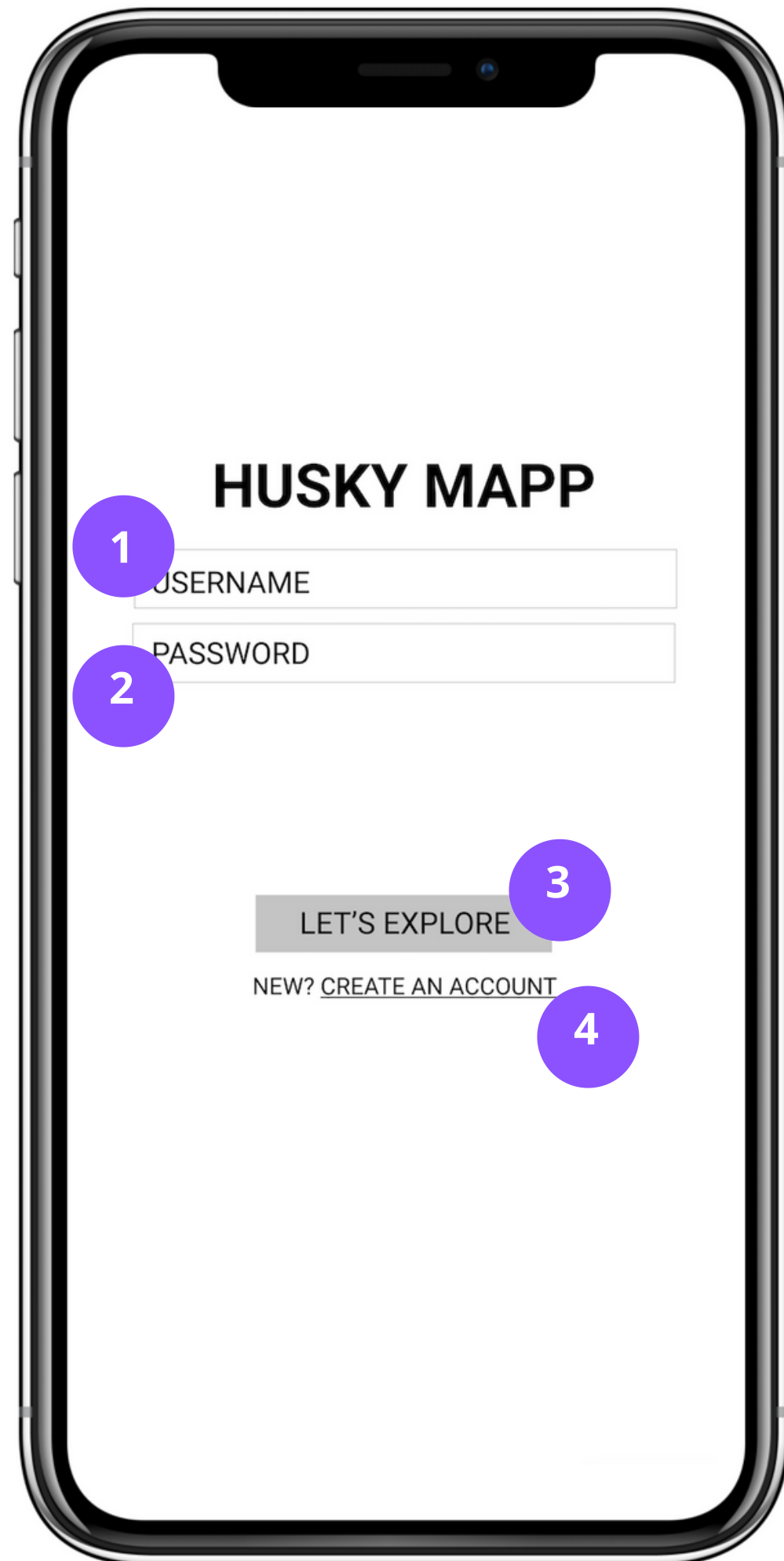

Log In / Sign In Page

- 1 Log-in button for existing users. University of Washington students have the option to login with their UW Net ID
- 2 Option to create an account for new users



Log In/Sign In Page: Login W/ UW ID

- 1 Username allows users to input a personalized name/tag
- 2 Password sets up a password to protect the user's data and preserve privacy
- 3 "Let's Explore" Navigates a user to the Home Map Page
- 4 User is still able to create a new account if they realize they do not have an account

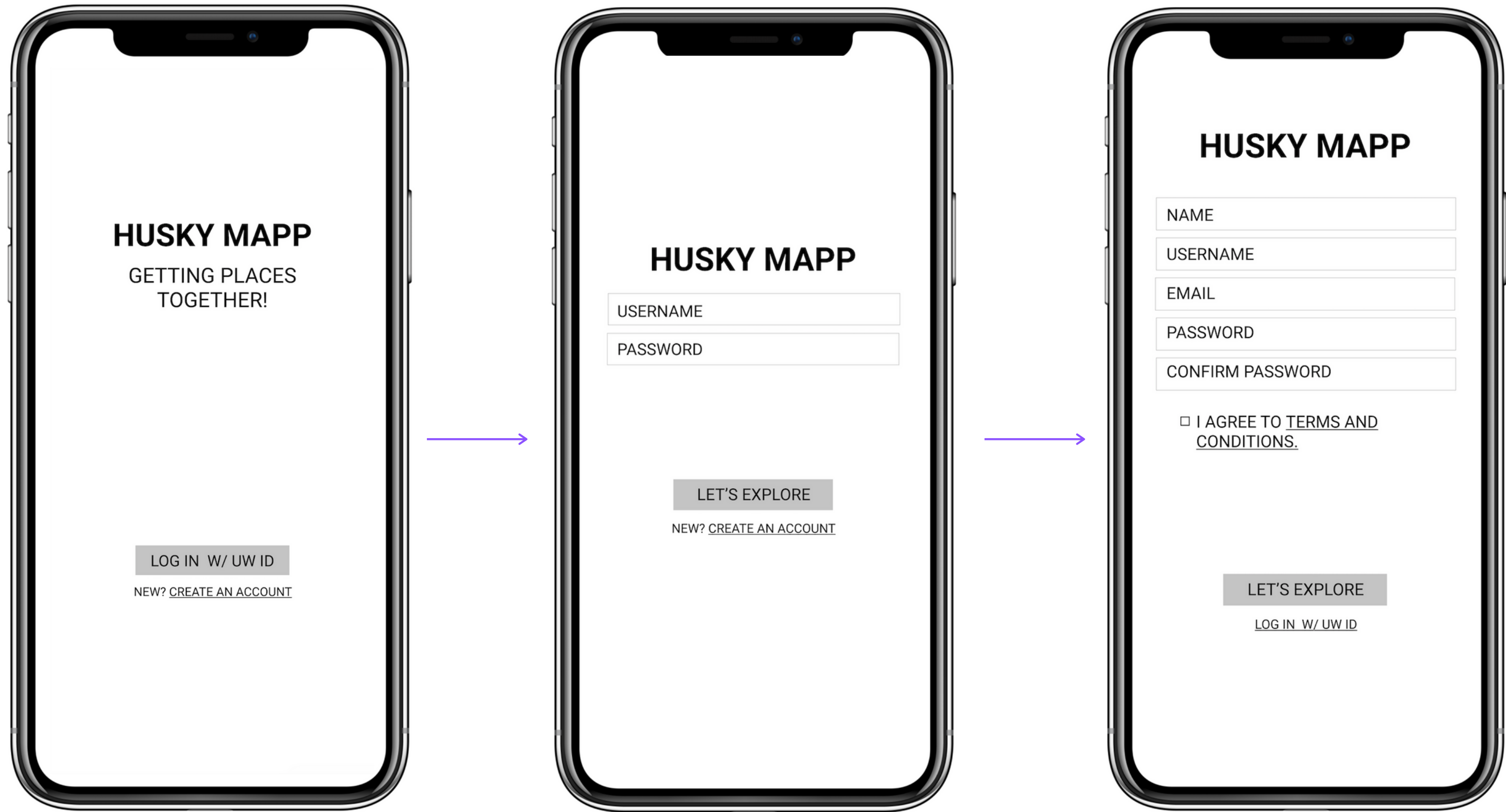

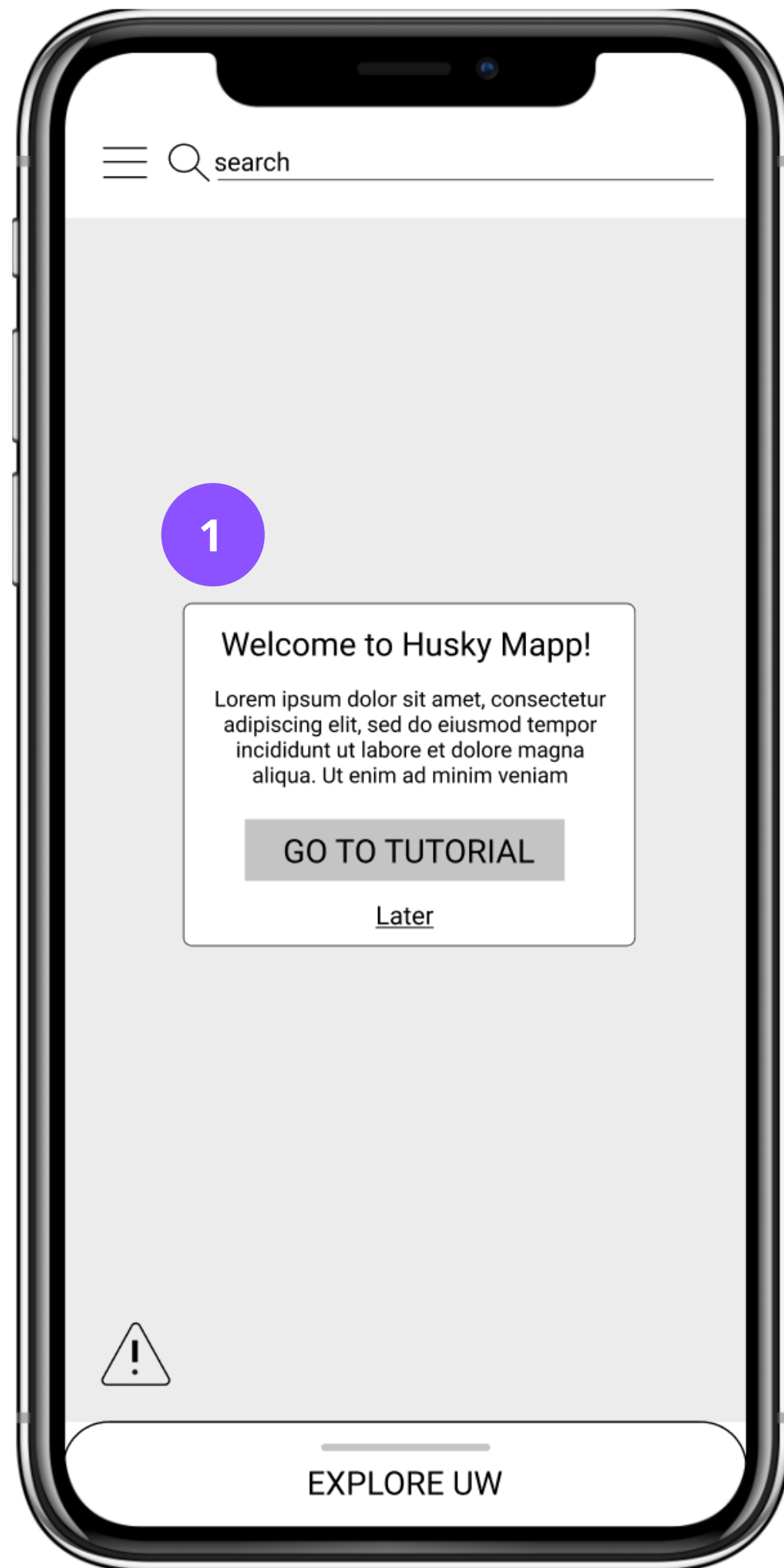
Log In/Sign In Page: Create an Account

- 1** Users type in information to create their account:
 - Name: users type in a name for their account
 - Username: allows user to input a personalized name
 - Password: set up a password to protect the user's data and preserve privacy
 - Password Confirmation: To assure user has inputted the password they intended
- 2** User has to agree to Terms and Conditions for data collection and location while using the app
- 3** "Let's Explore" Navigates a user to the Home Map Page
- 4** User is still able to log in with their UW Net ID if they realize they already have an account

Log-in/Sign-in Pages Flow



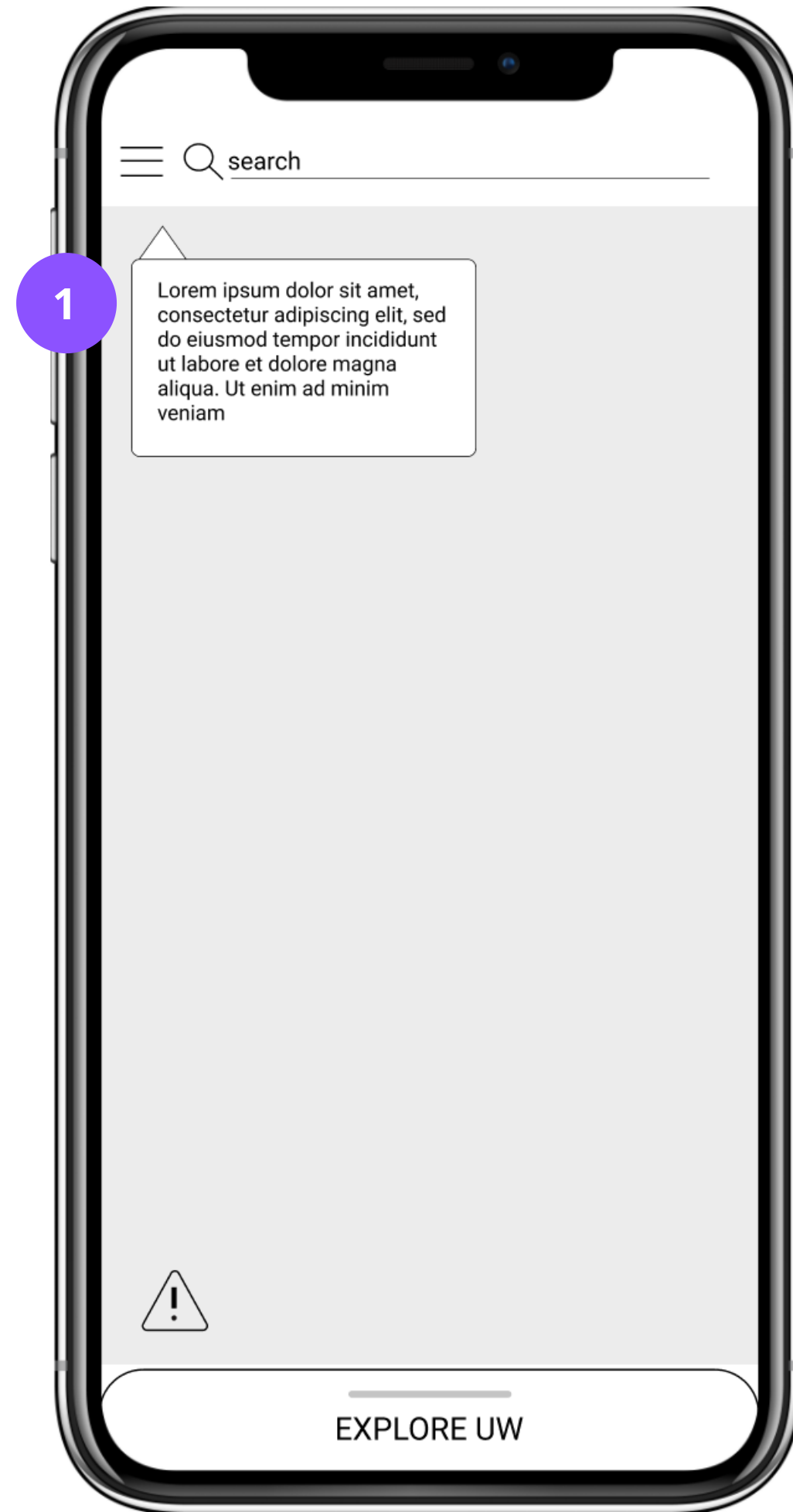
Tutorial For Home Page

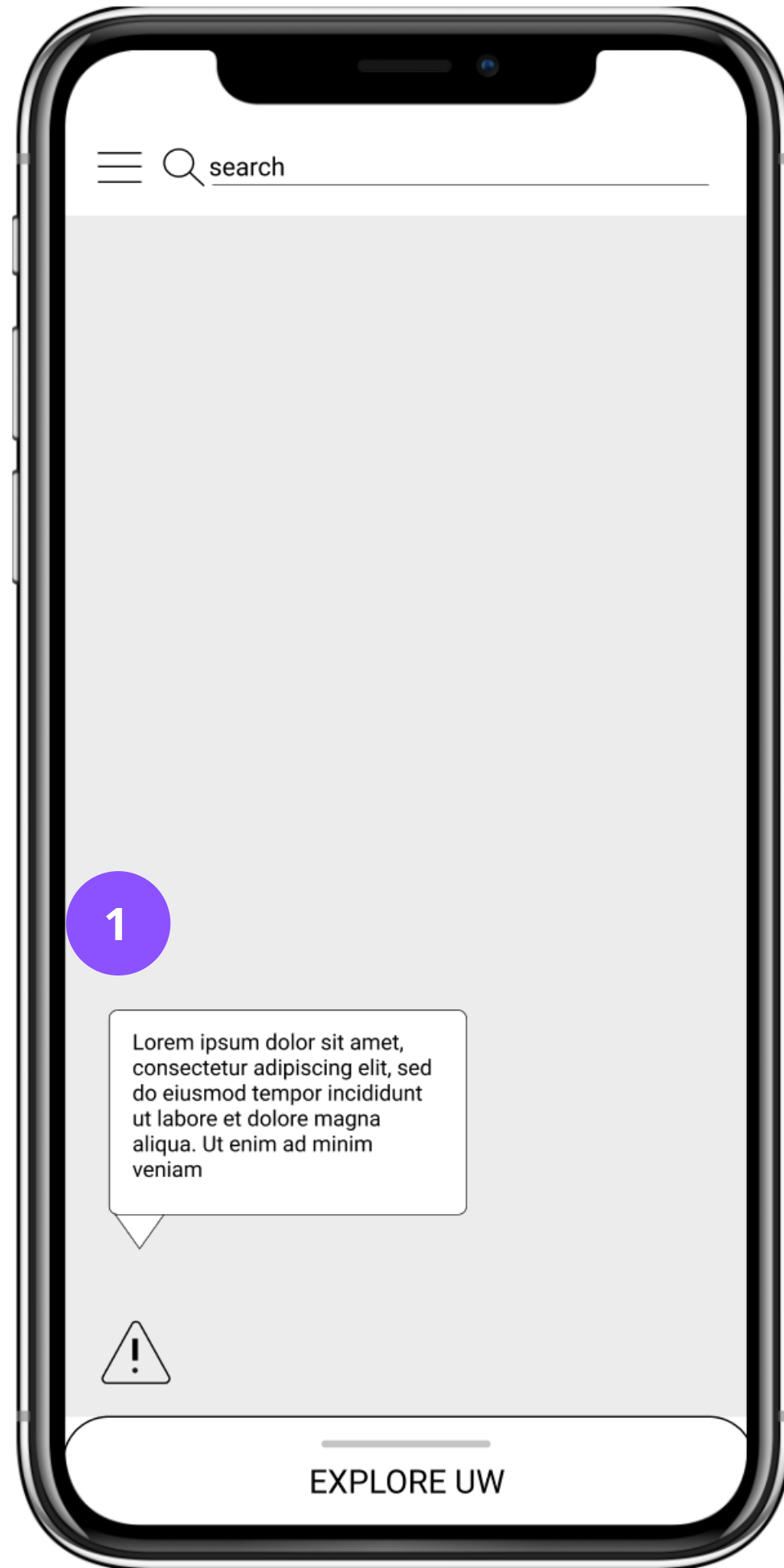

- 1 First part of tutorial introduces users to the drop-down menu. The drop-down menu has the settings, calendar and find friends feature

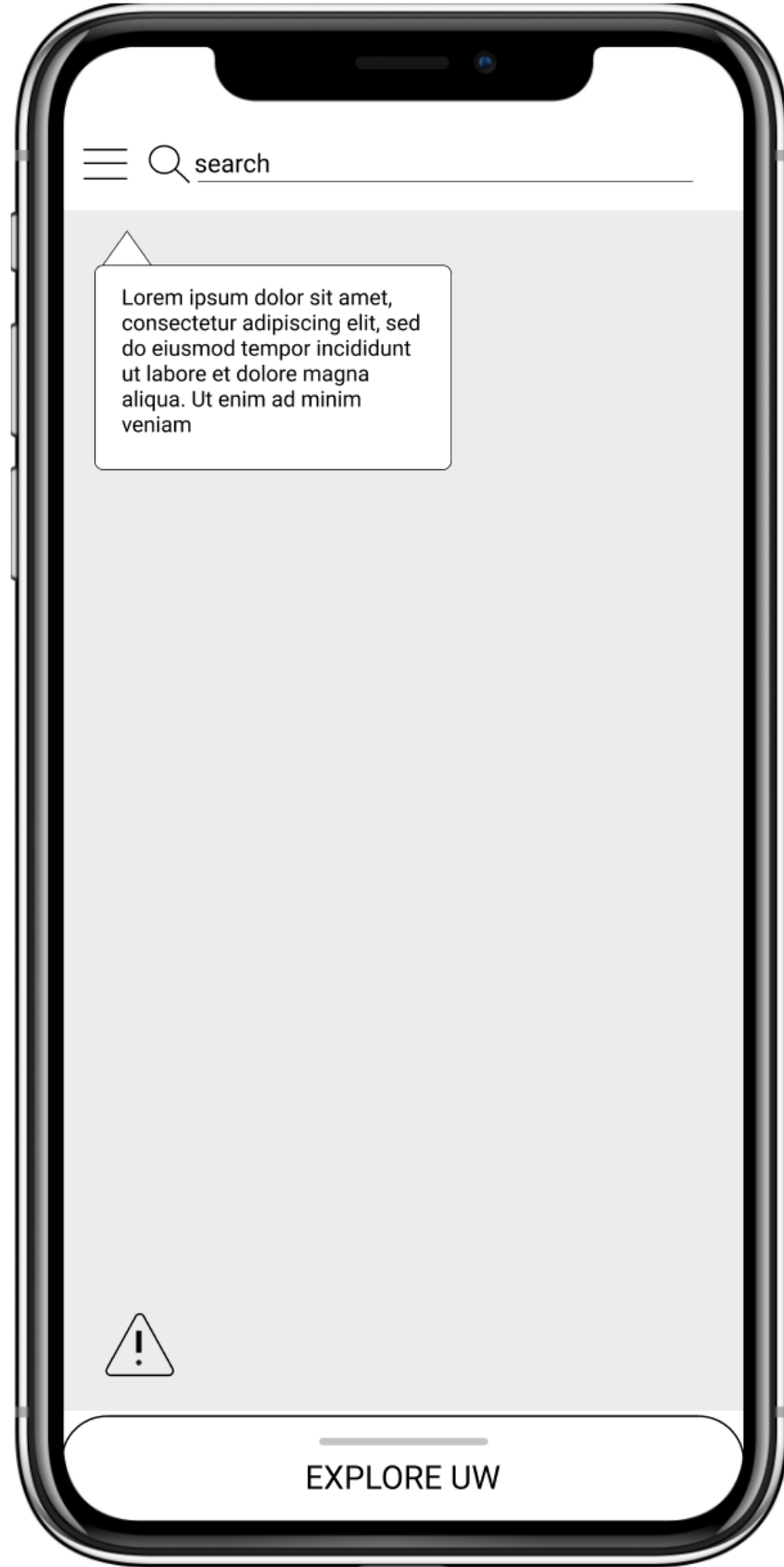
Tutorial For Home Page: Report Feature

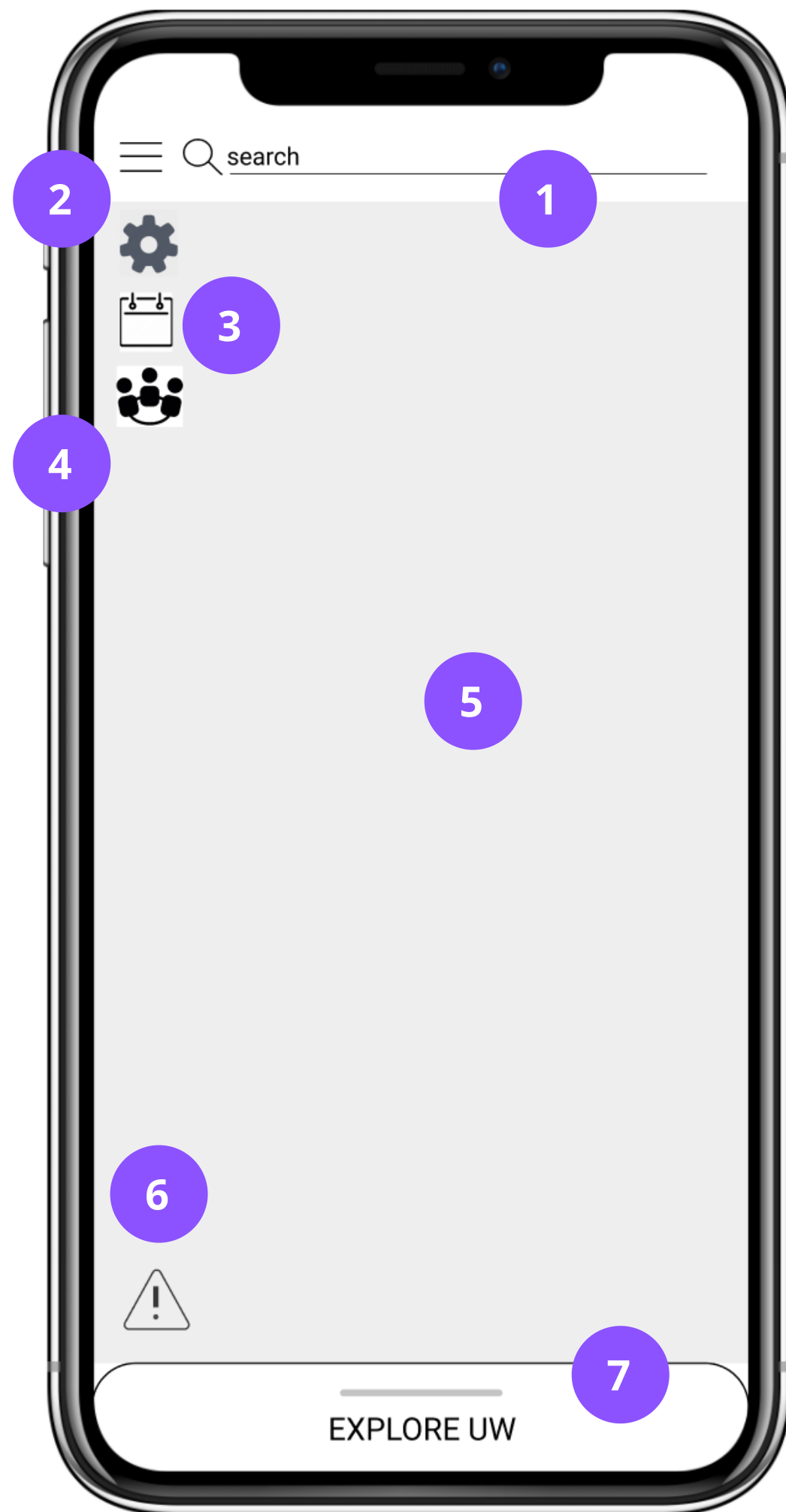

Second part of tutorial introduces users to the Report Incident feature. If a user encounters an incident they can report it by tapping on this alert icon

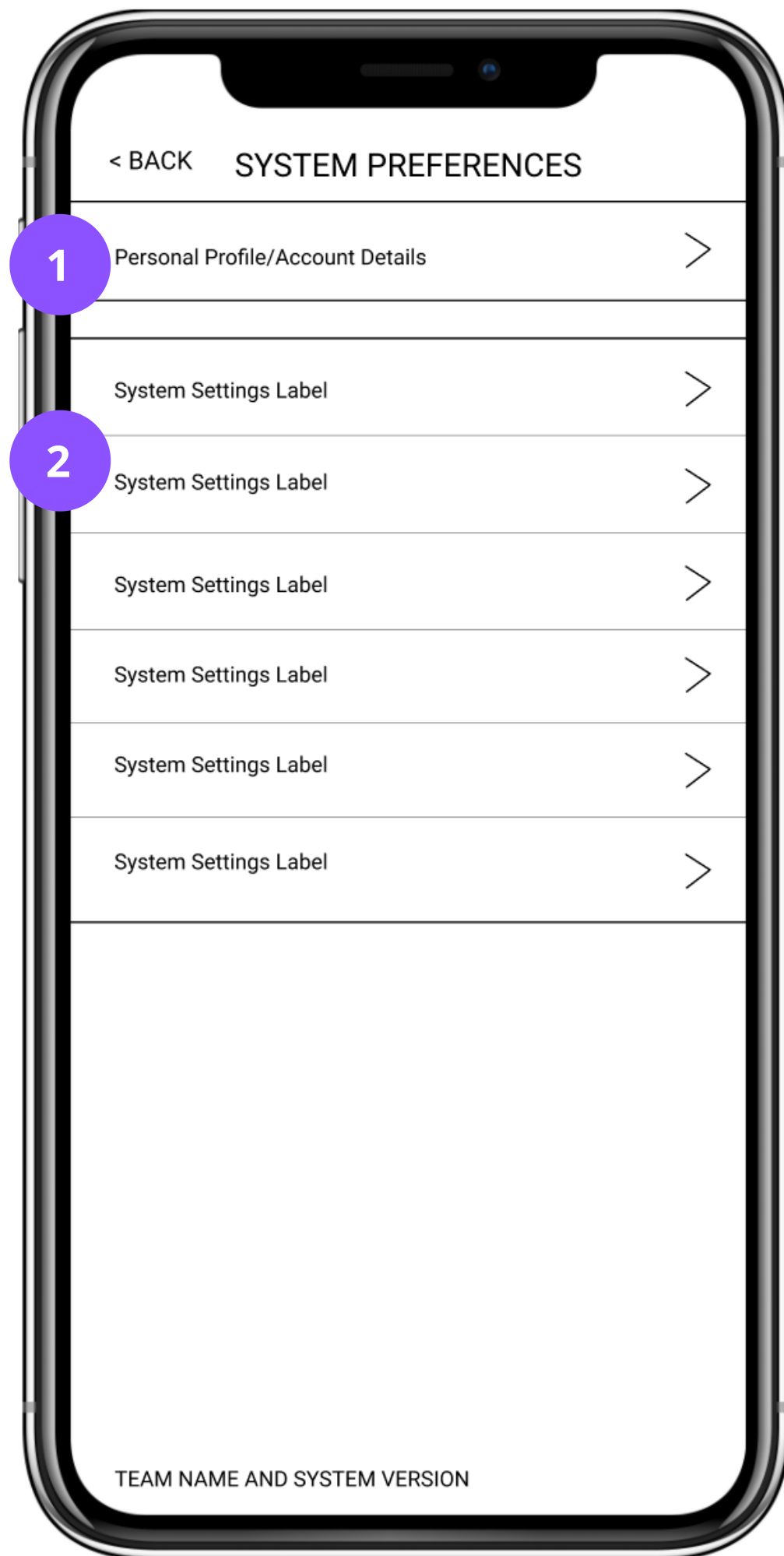

Home Page

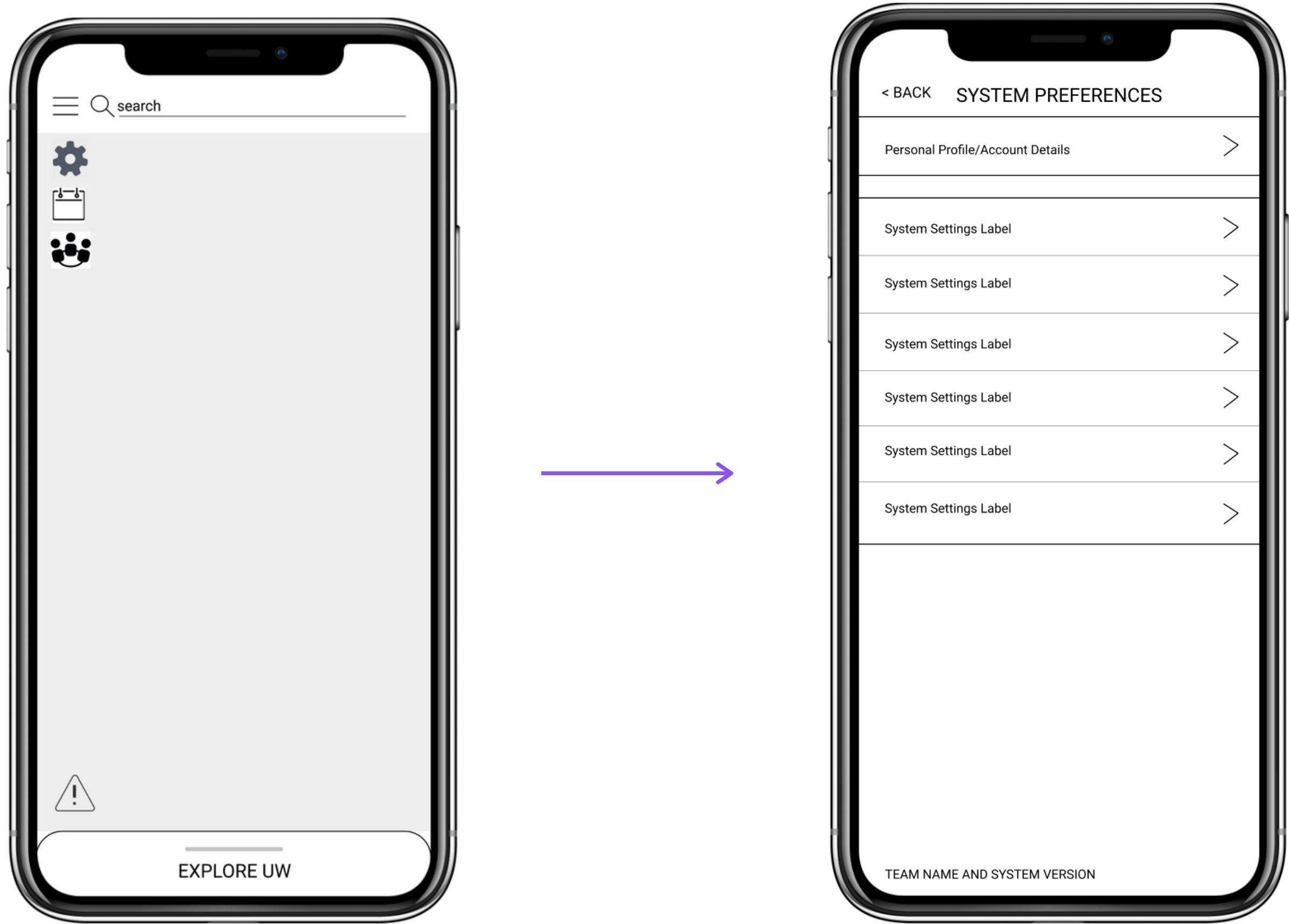
- 1 Search bar will show history searches and recommended locations to search, allows user to search
- 2 Dropdown menu shows additional features
- 3 Calendar icon, allows user to sync and access their personal calendars
- 4 Access to the community function, which allows user to put themselves on the map and see their friends' location and destination
- 5 Map View: shows user location and navigation
- 6 Users can report incidents and events on campus from this button
- 7 Explore UW functions allows users to browse locations without searching

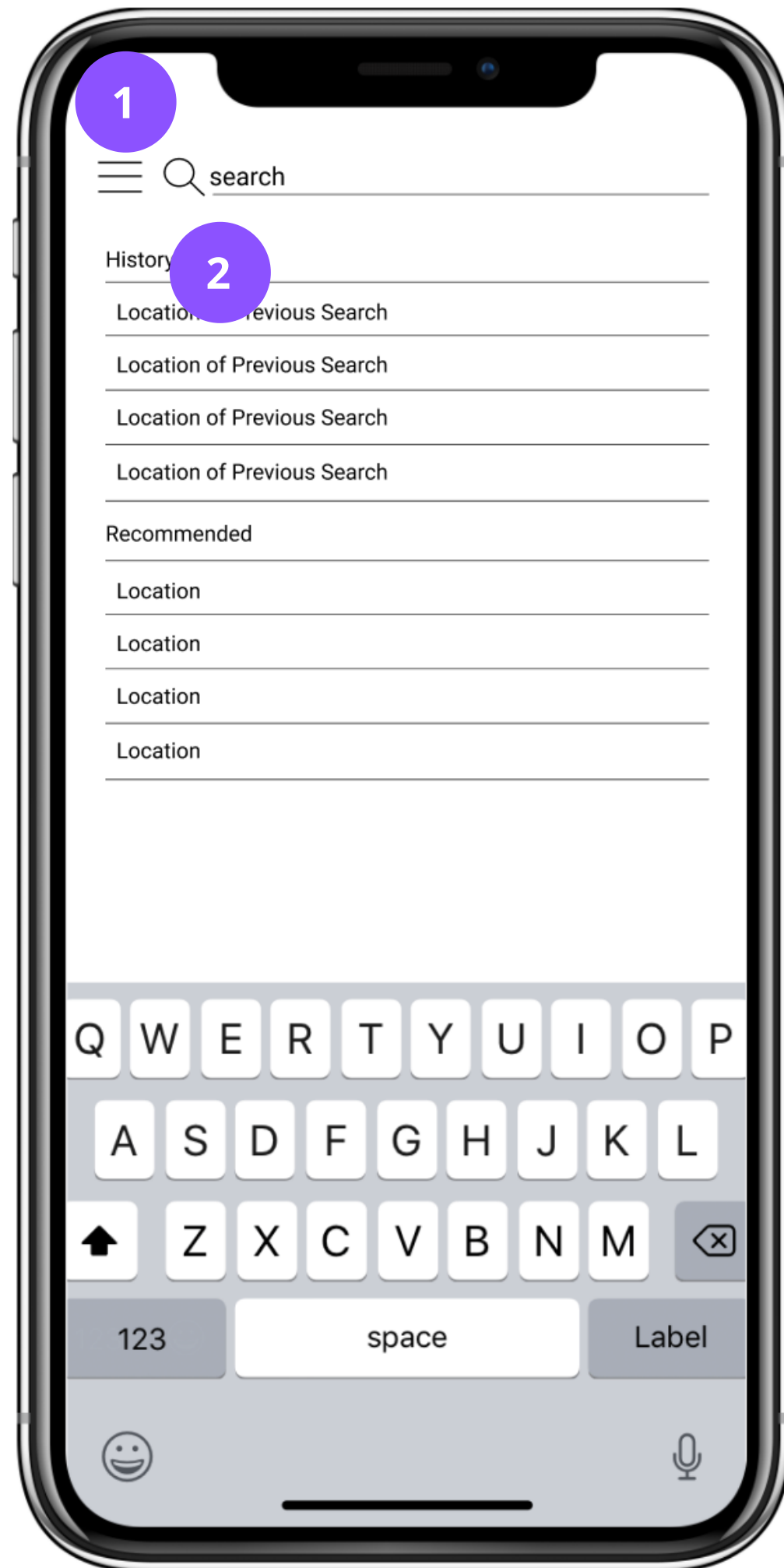


System Preferences

- 1 Personal Settings (emails, username, profile). User can customize their information and profile
- 2 System Settings allows users to update themes/colors, notifications and other system features

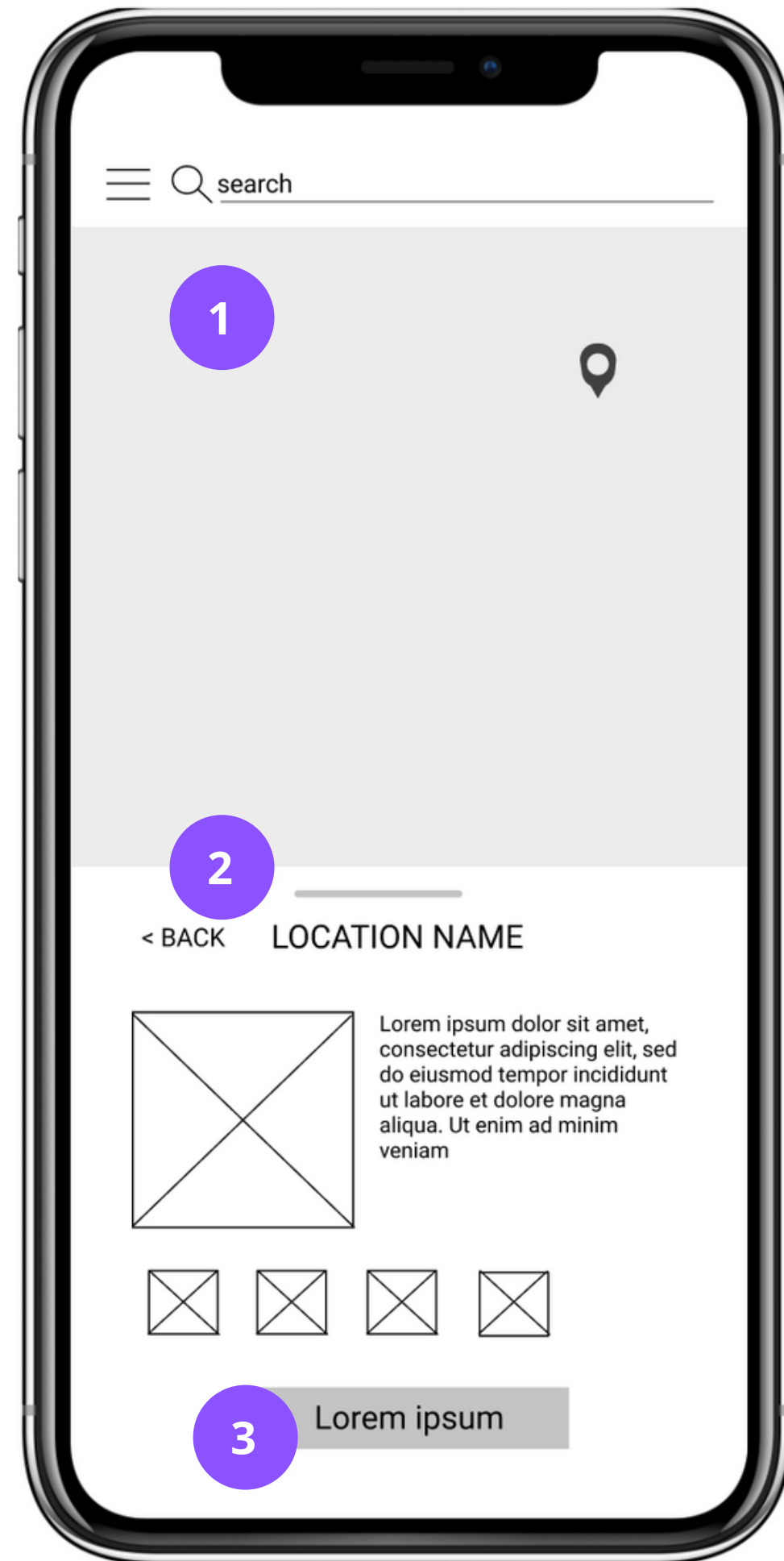
System Preferences Flow





Search Bar and Suggestions

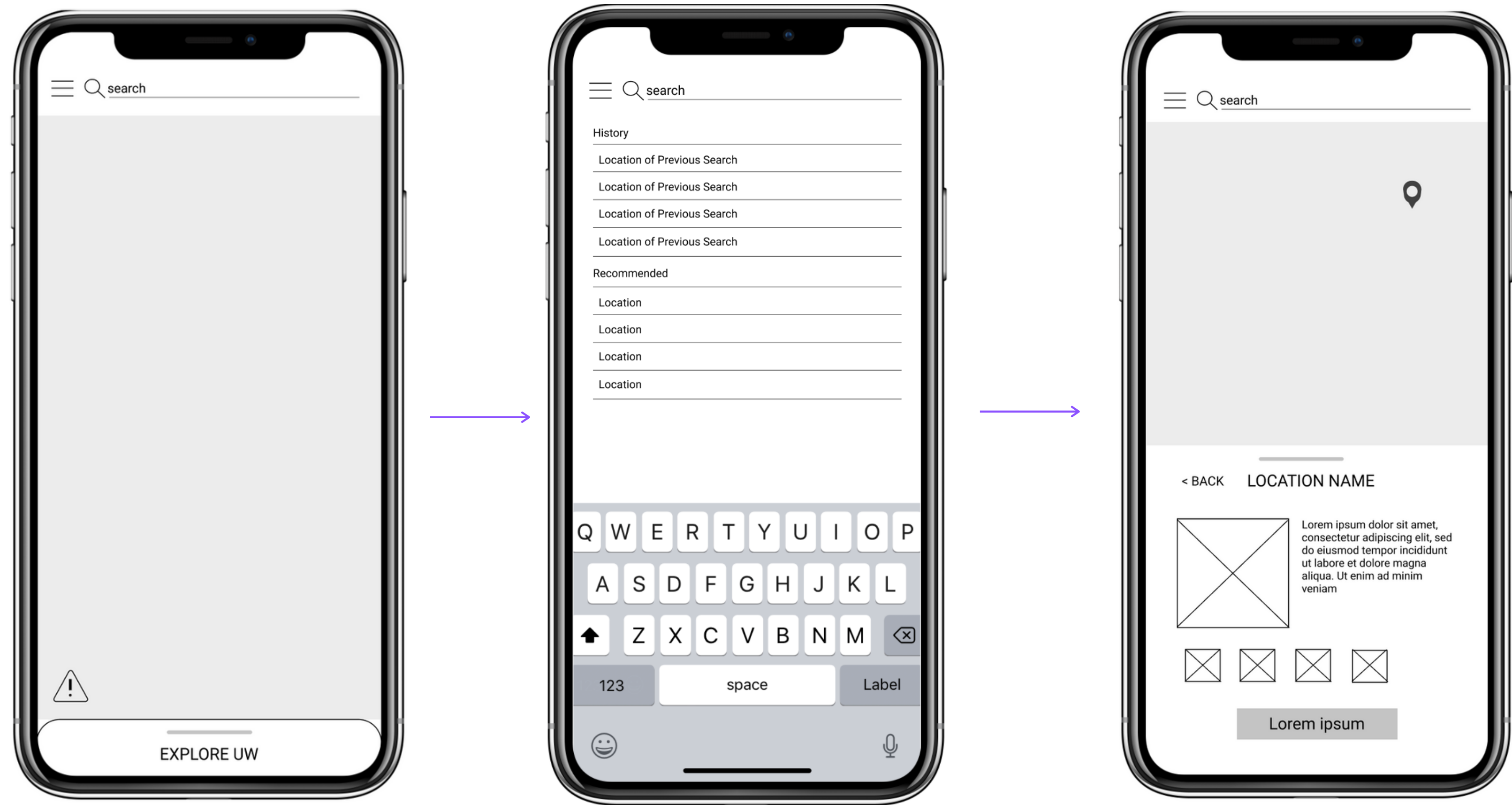
- 1 User can type in a location in the Search Bar for navigation
- 2 When a user enters the Search Bar, their history and recommended searches for the user to look up

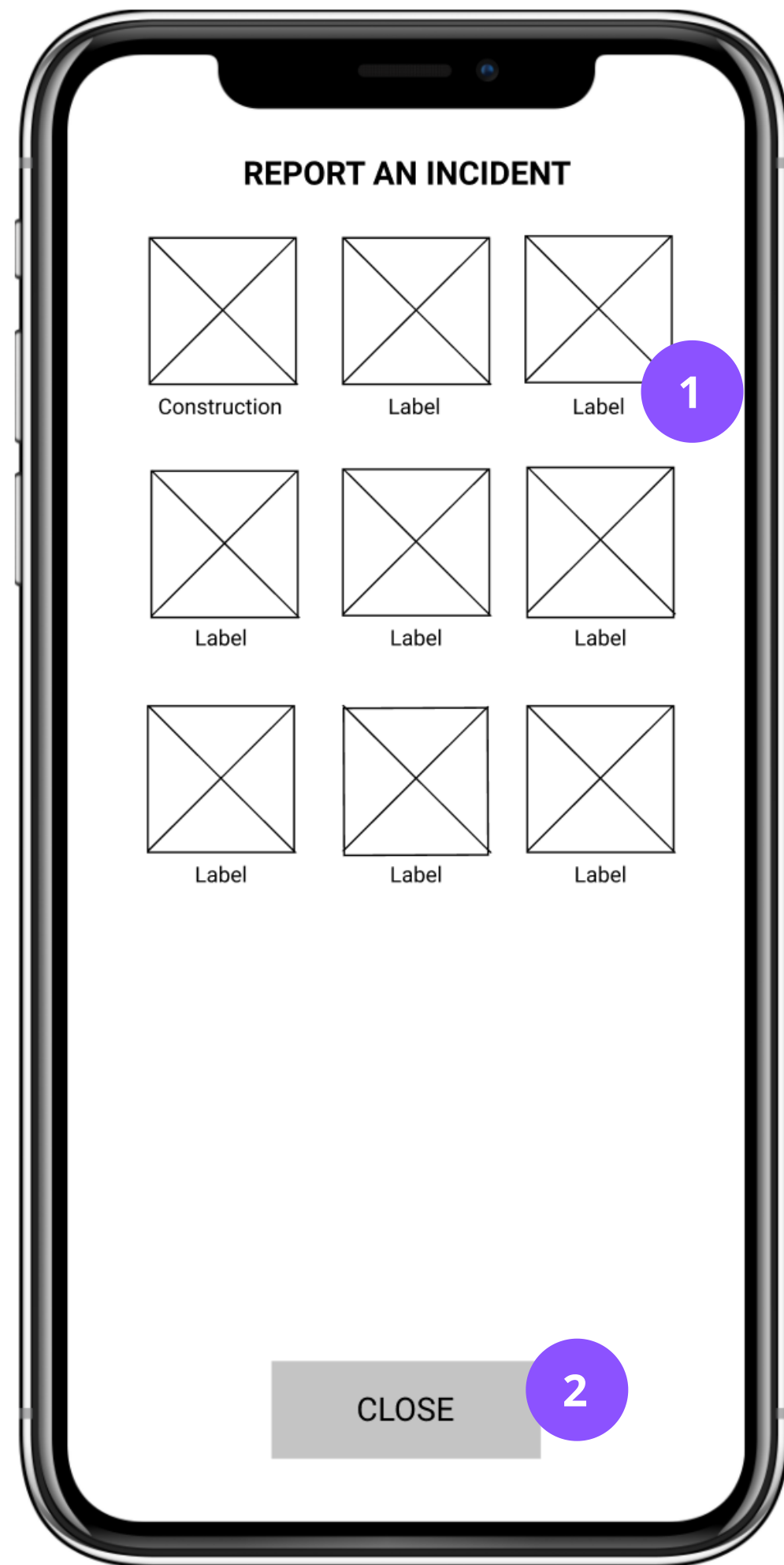


Search Bar : Searching for a Location

- 1 Map indicates where the location is
- 2 Location Biography gives a short description of the selected location and suggestions for similar places in your area
- 3 Once everything is selected, and confirmed, user can begin routing their navigation

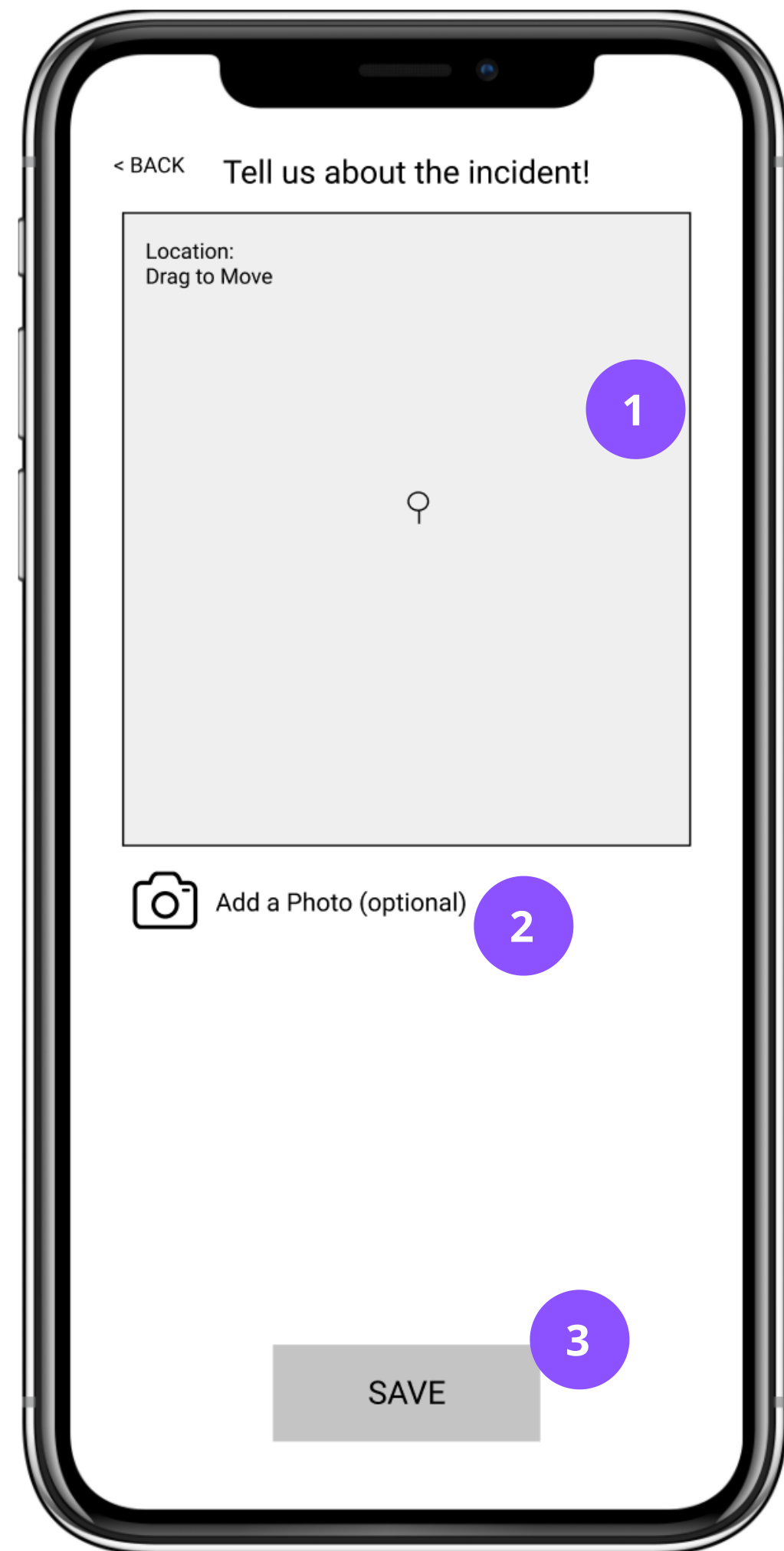
Searching in the Search Bar Flow





Report an Incident: Selecting the Incident

- 1 Options for types of reportable incidents (Events, traffic, construction, protests)
- 2 Users can close out from the report page if they decide they do not want to report an incident anymore



Report an Incident: Event Input Page

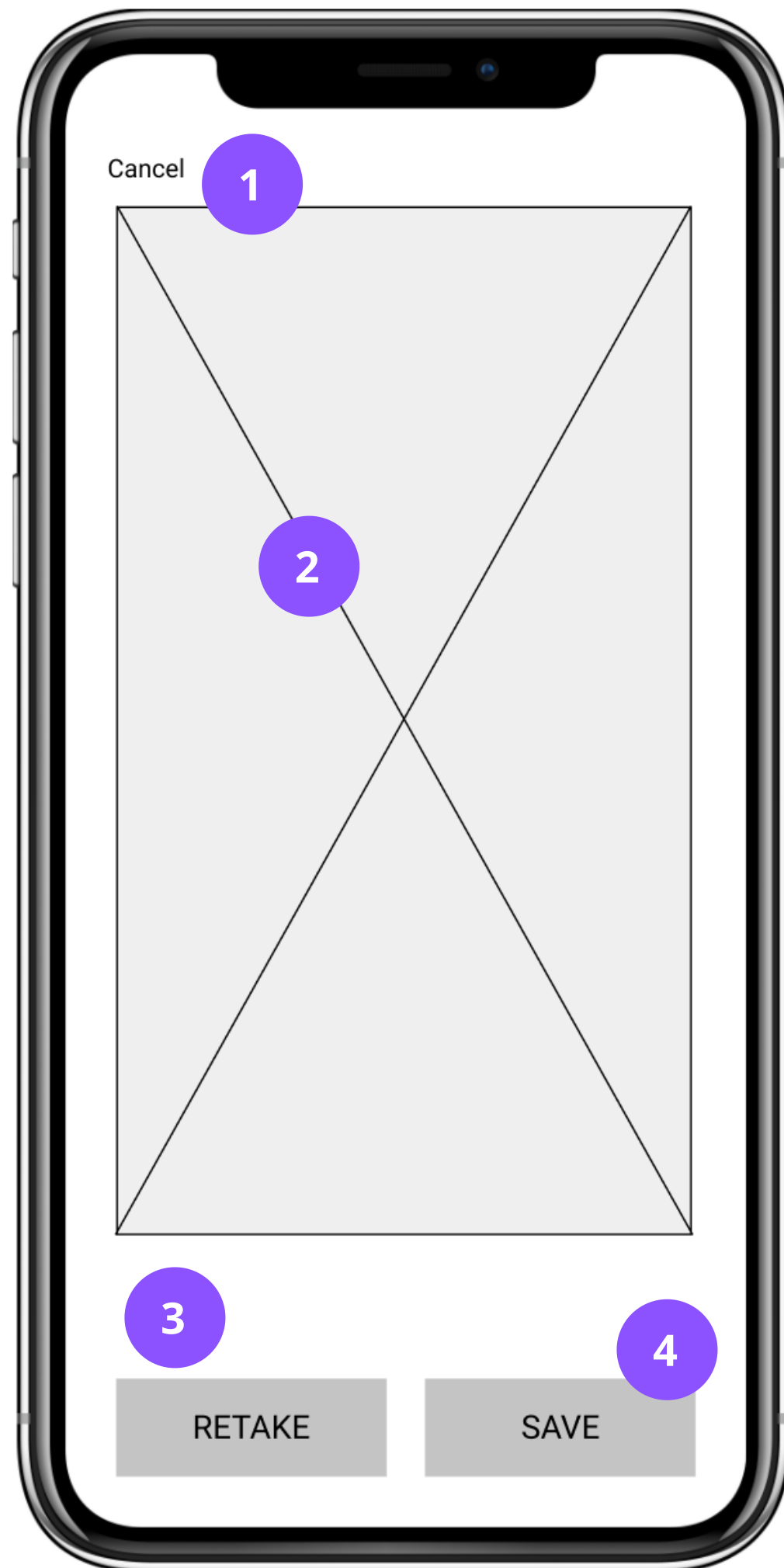
- 1 Drag the location on the Map to report where the incident was located
- 2 User can add a photo of the incident (this is optional)
- 3 Saves and adds report to map for the whole community to see



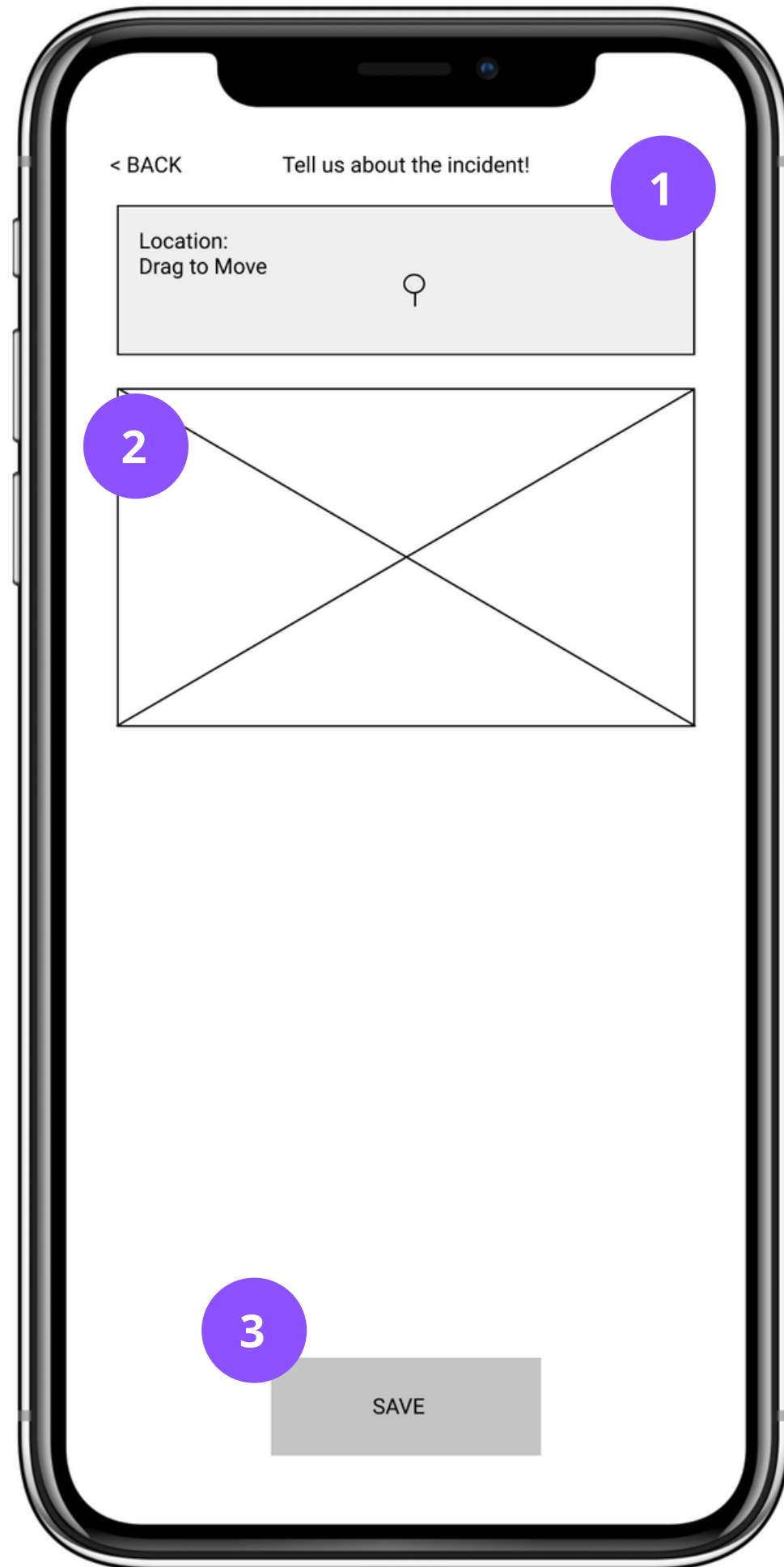
Report an Incident: Add a Photo

- 1 User can "Cancel" if they no longer want to take a picture
- 2 User can add a photo of the incident using their phone camera

Report an Incident: Add a Photo

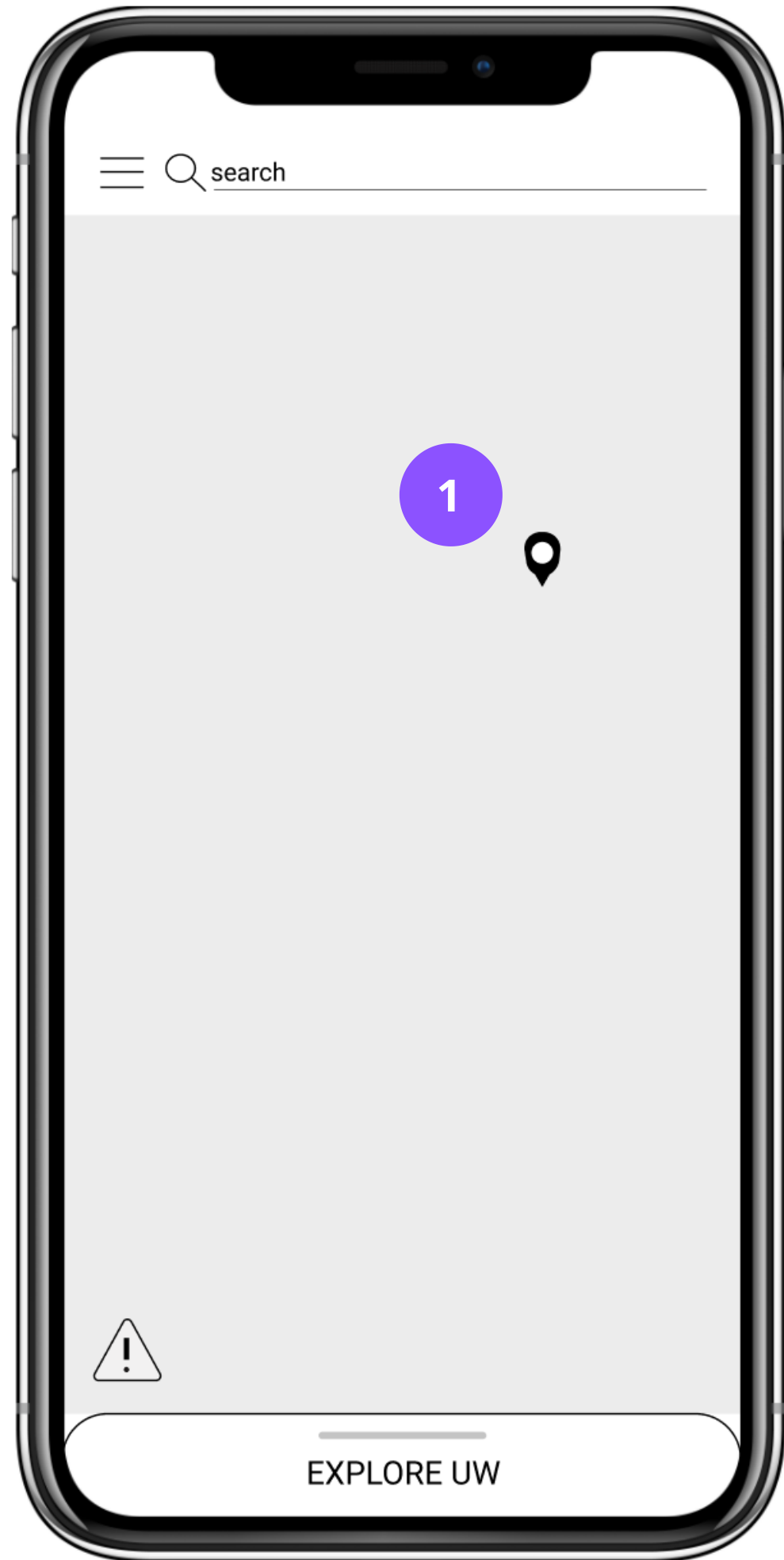


- 1 User can "Cancel" if they no longer want to implement a picture
- 2 The picture is shown on the screen for the user to see
- 3 User can retake a photo
- 4 User can save the photo



Report an Incident: Review Report

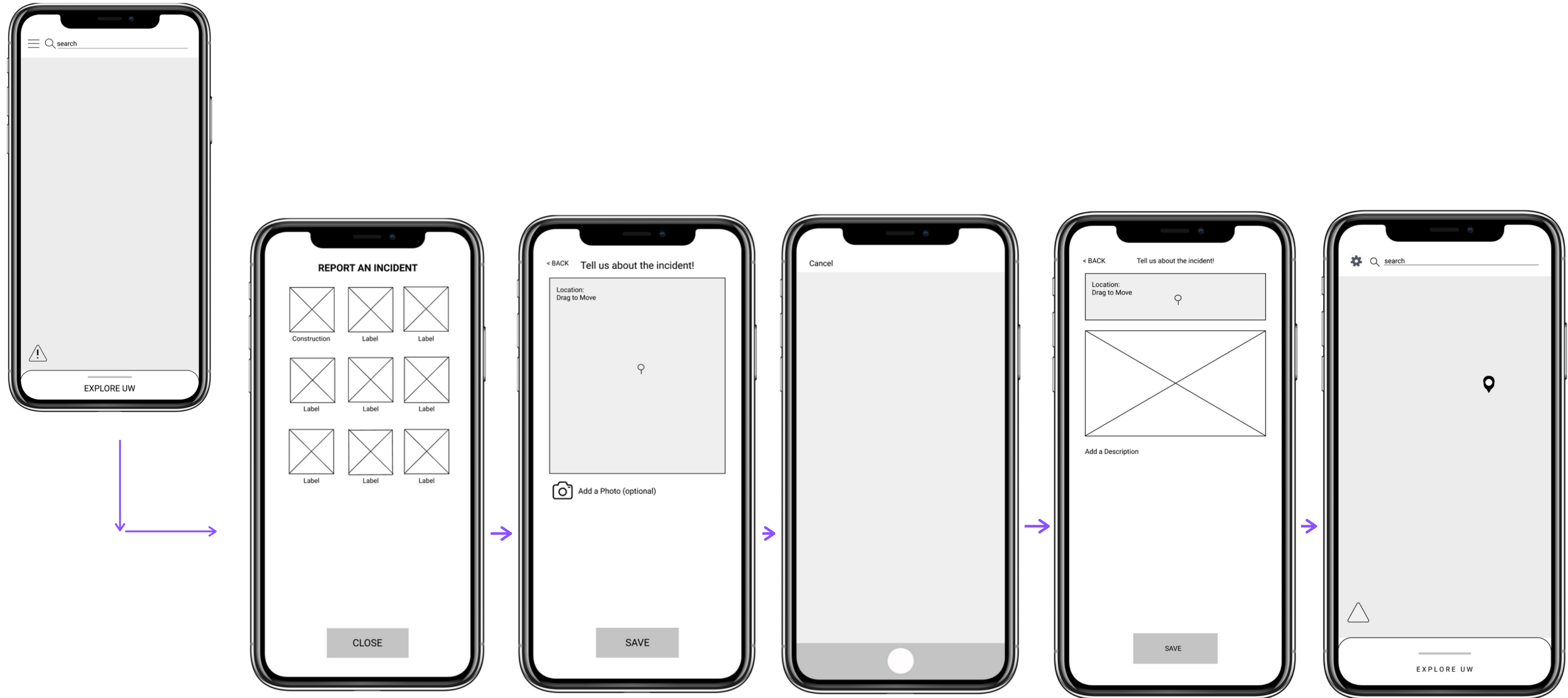
- 1 Location of incident that the user indicated
- 2 Optional Photo of the incident
- 3 User can look over their report and save it

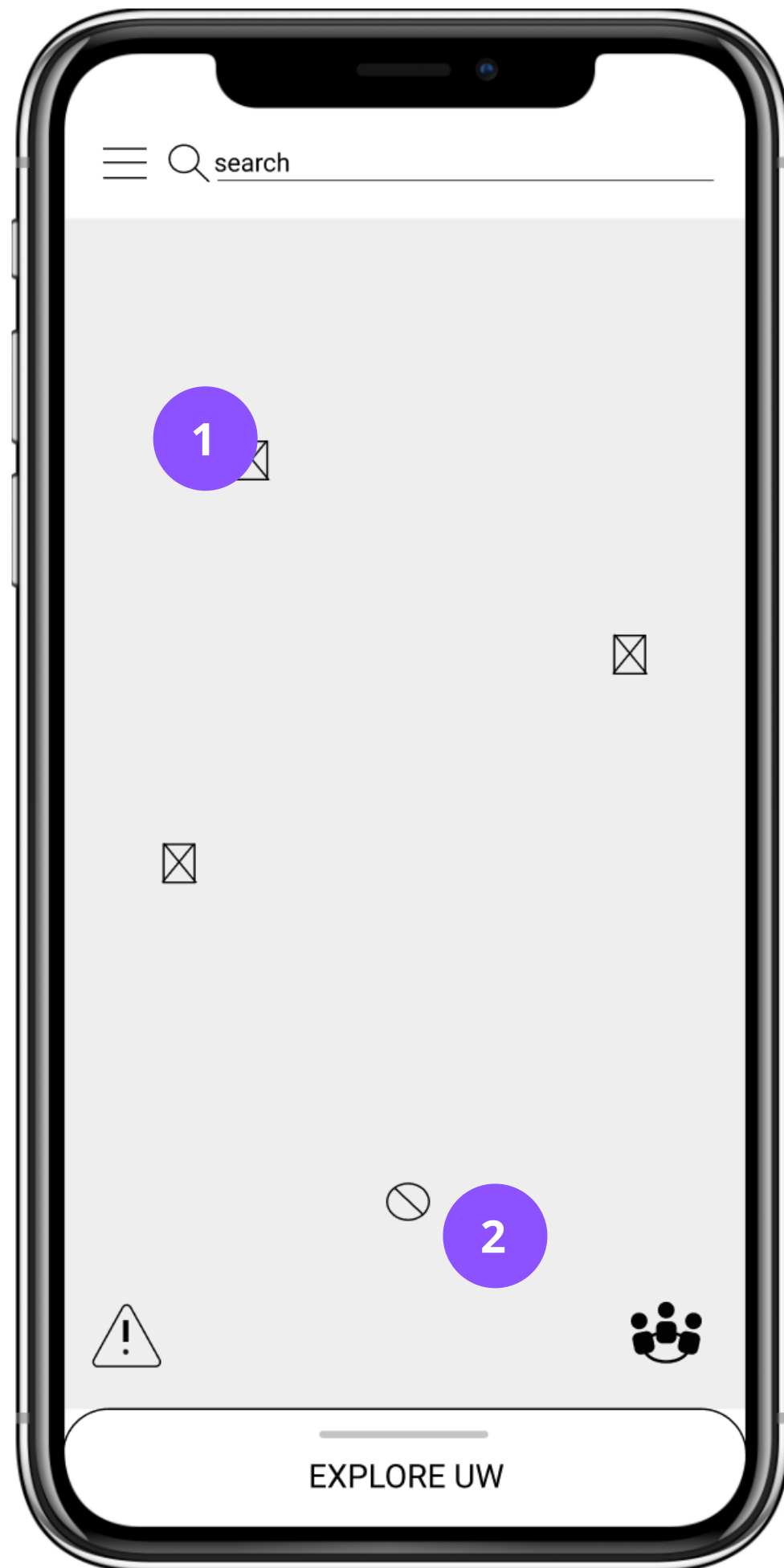


Report an Incident: Incident Location on Map

- 1 Report of Incident is now visible on the map for the public to see and be aware of

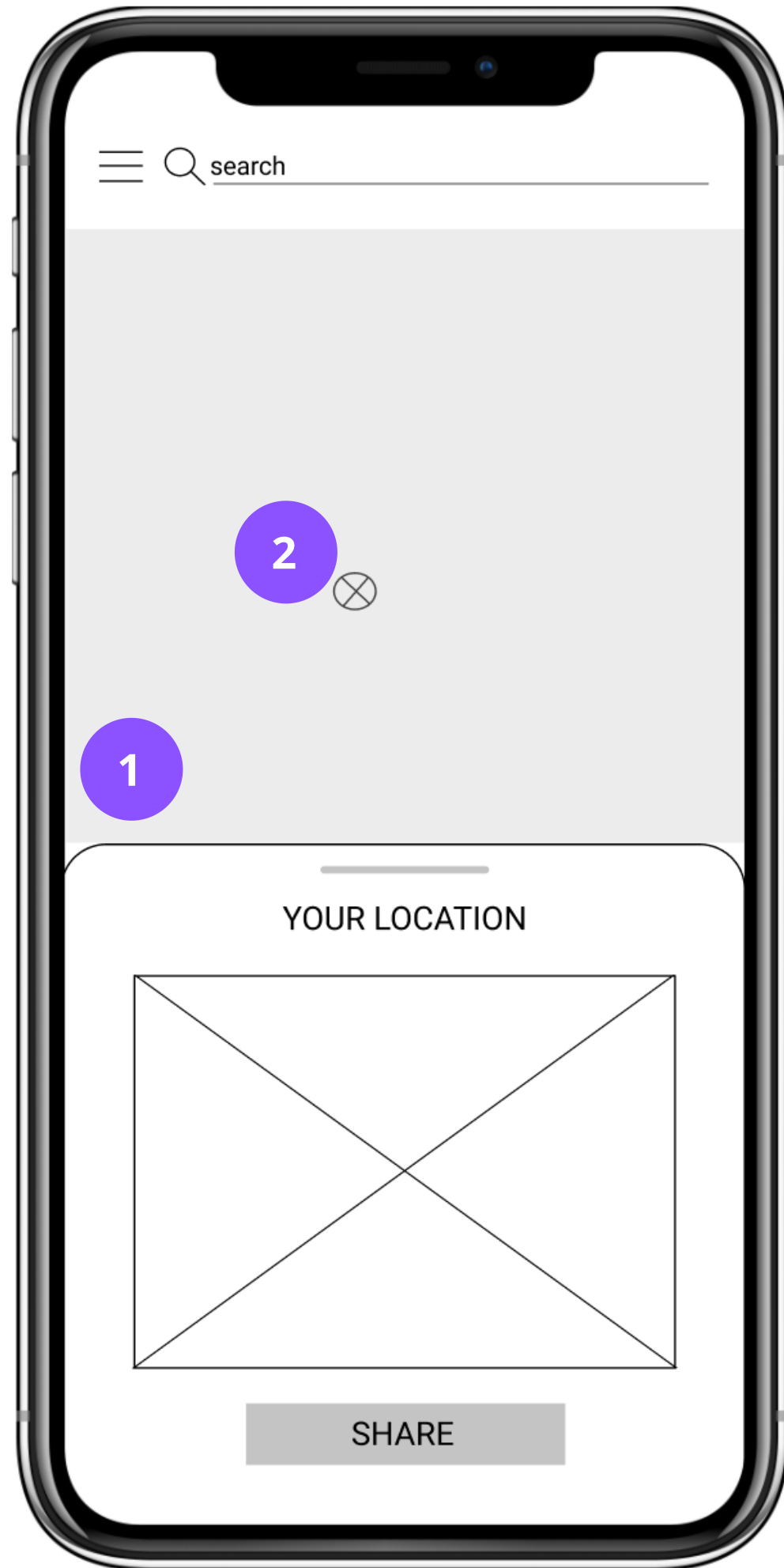
Reporting an Incident User Flow





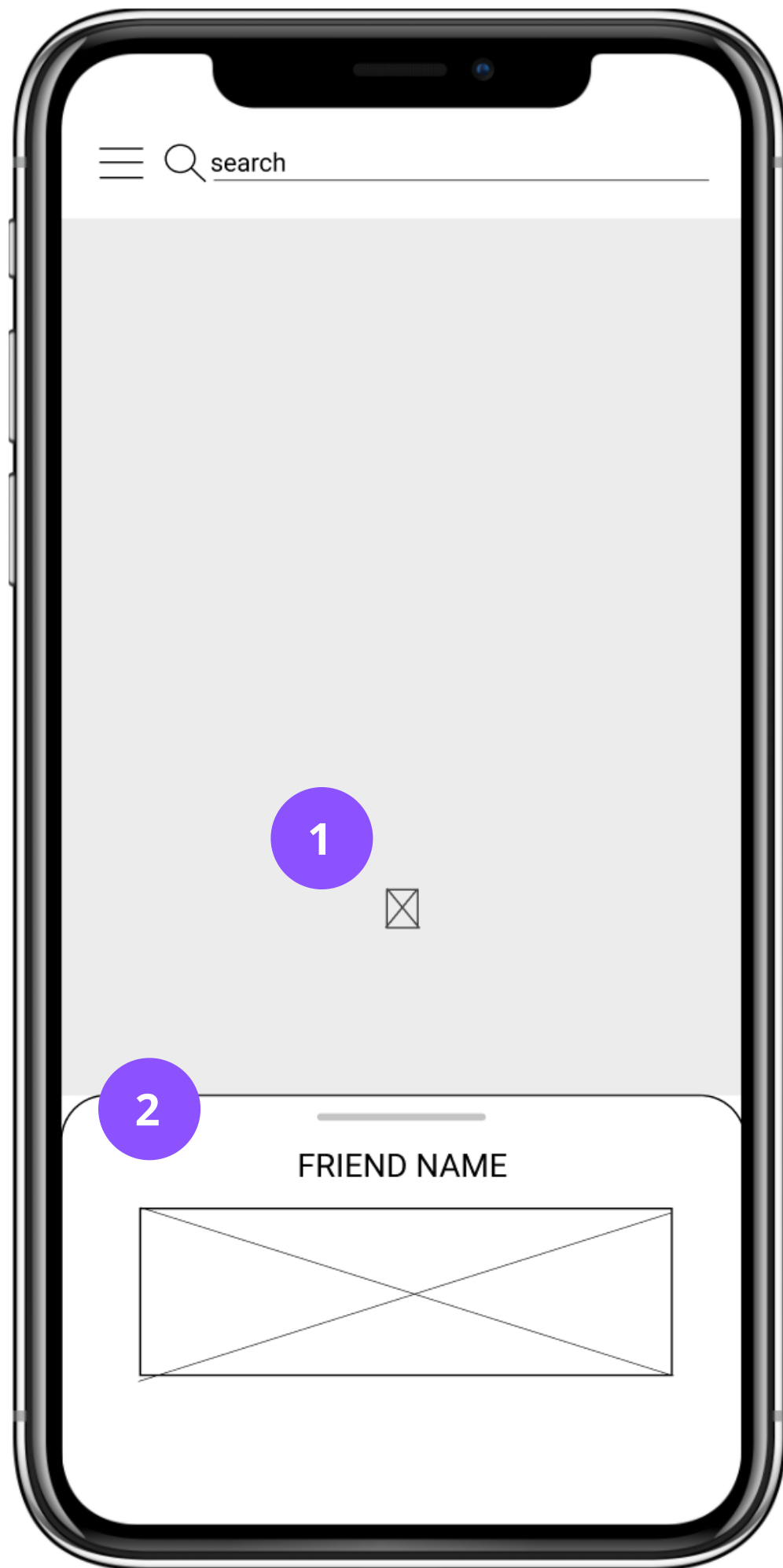
Community Page

- 1 Users can locate their friends on the map and if they have posted it, see where their friends are heading
- 2 A user can view their own location and publish their own destination



Community Page: Your Location

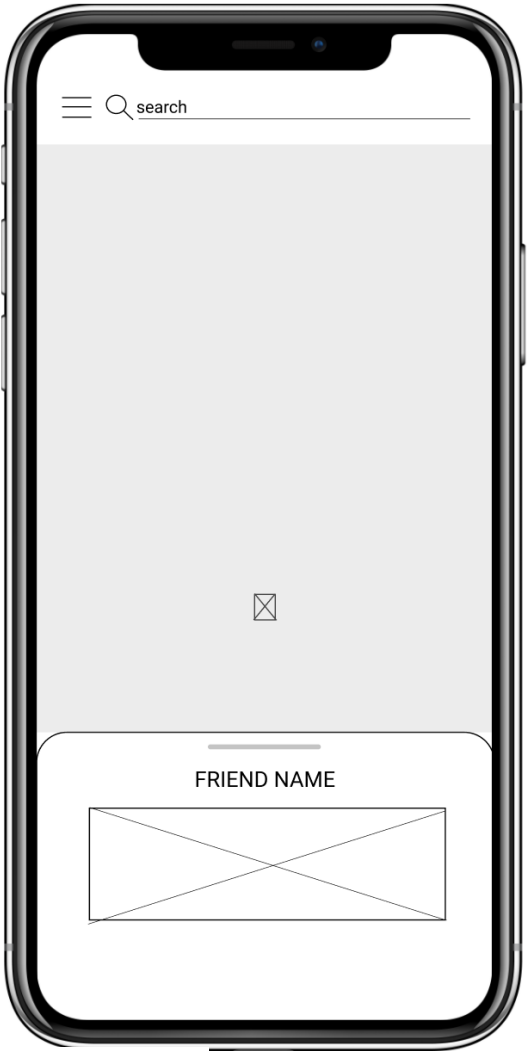
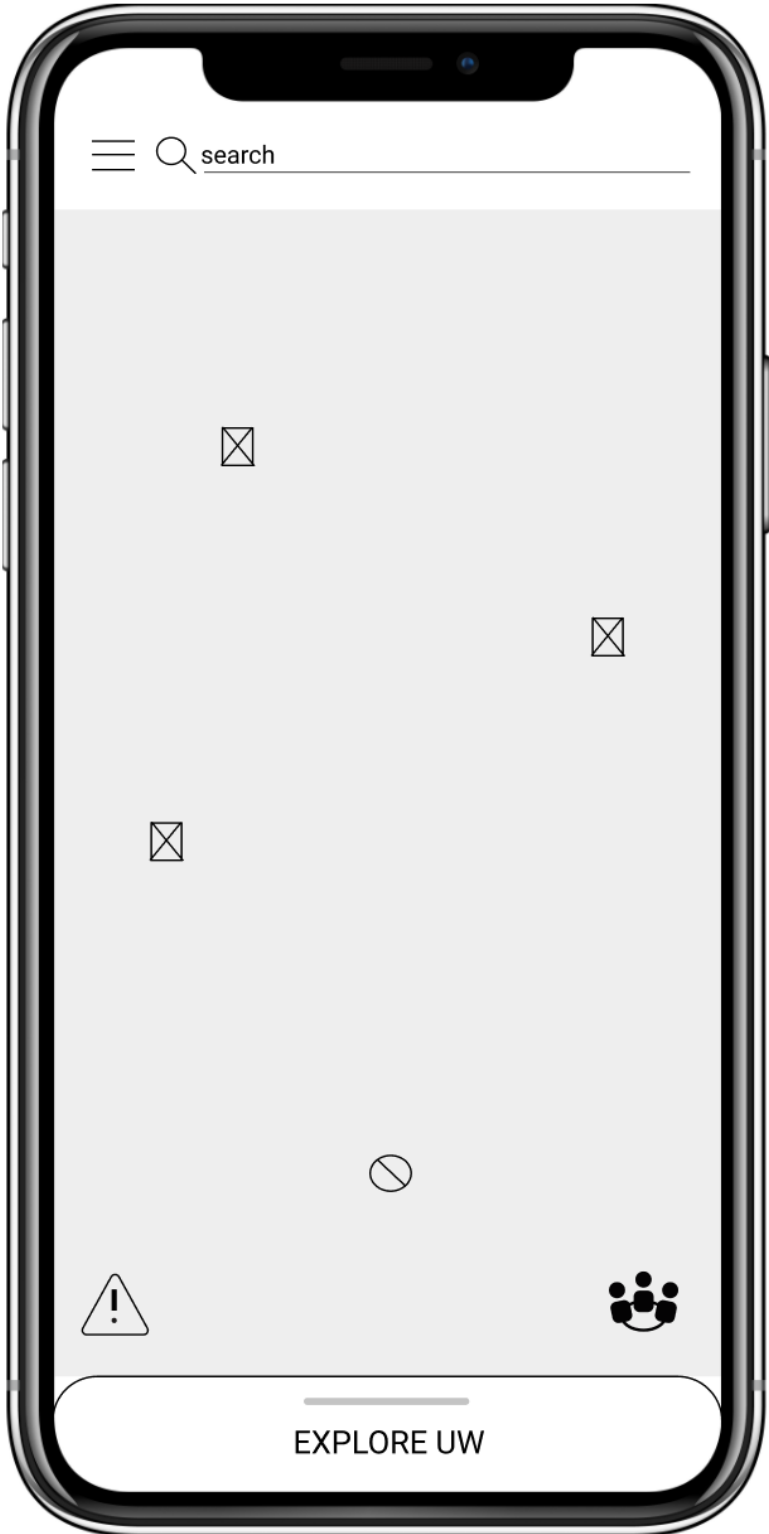
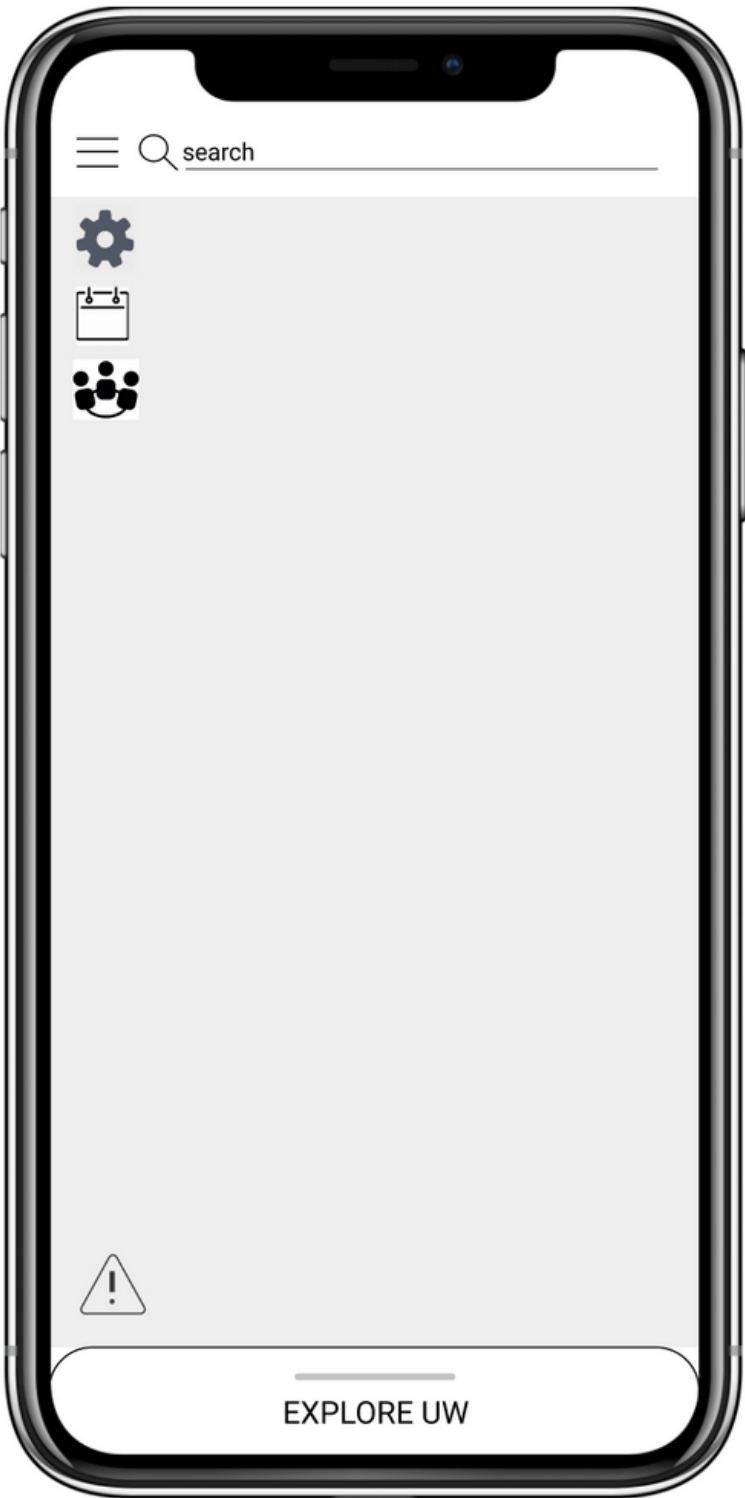
- 1 Location Sharing allows a user to share their location and destination on the map for their friends to see
- 2 Image marks the user's personal location

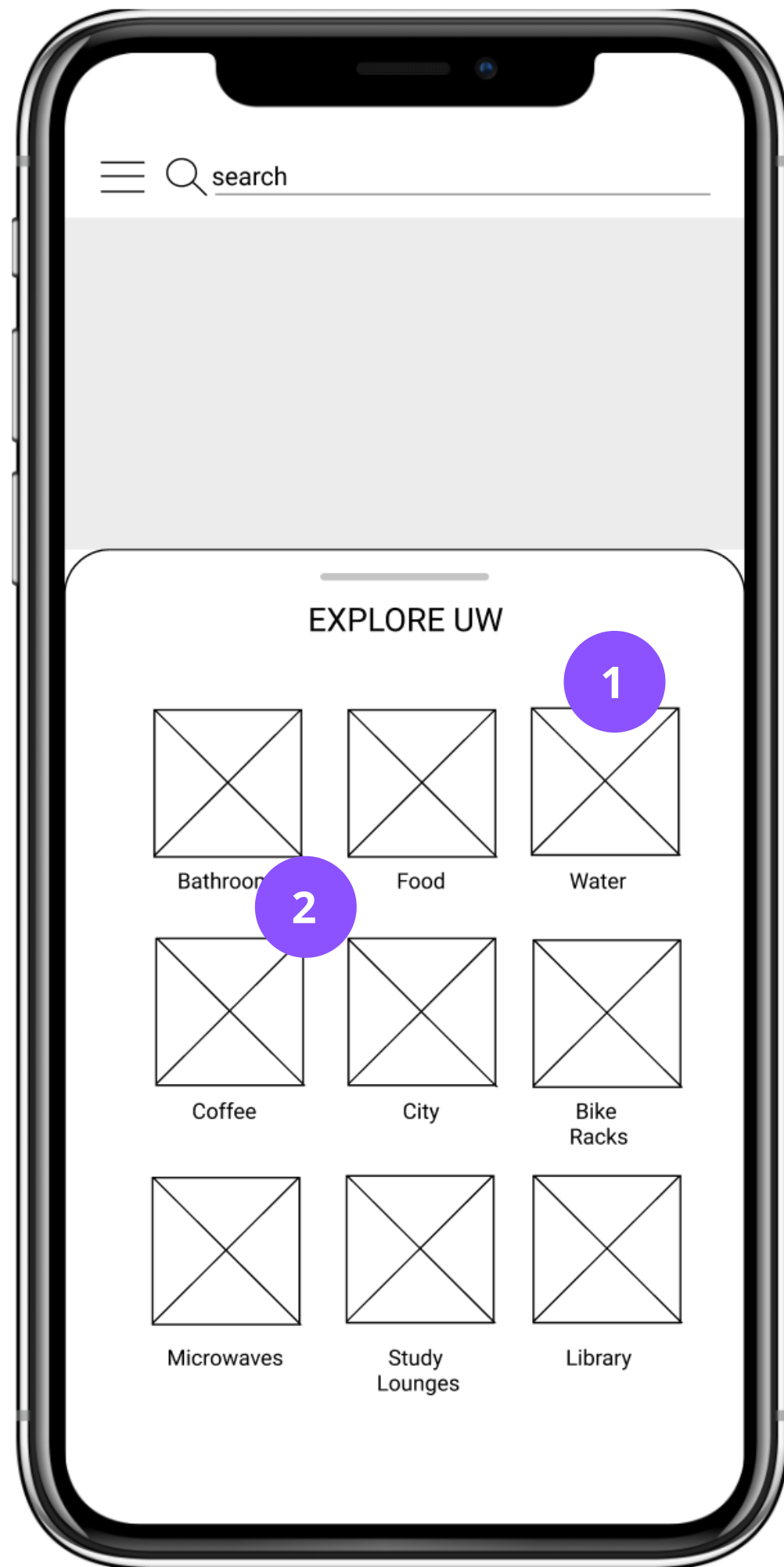


Community Page: Find your Friends

- 2 Friends bio, location and information pops up for the user to see

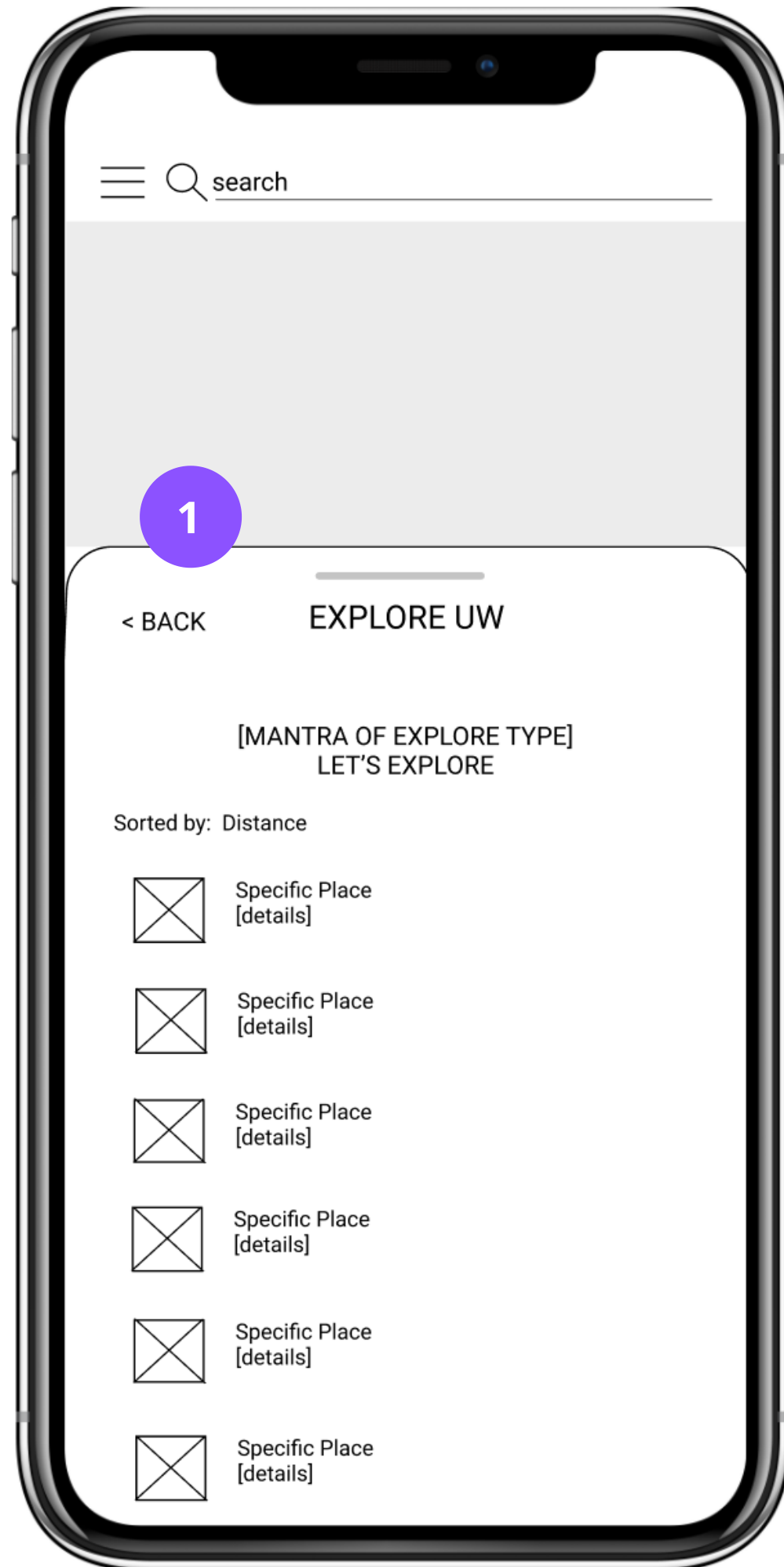
Community System Flow





Explore UW Slide-Up

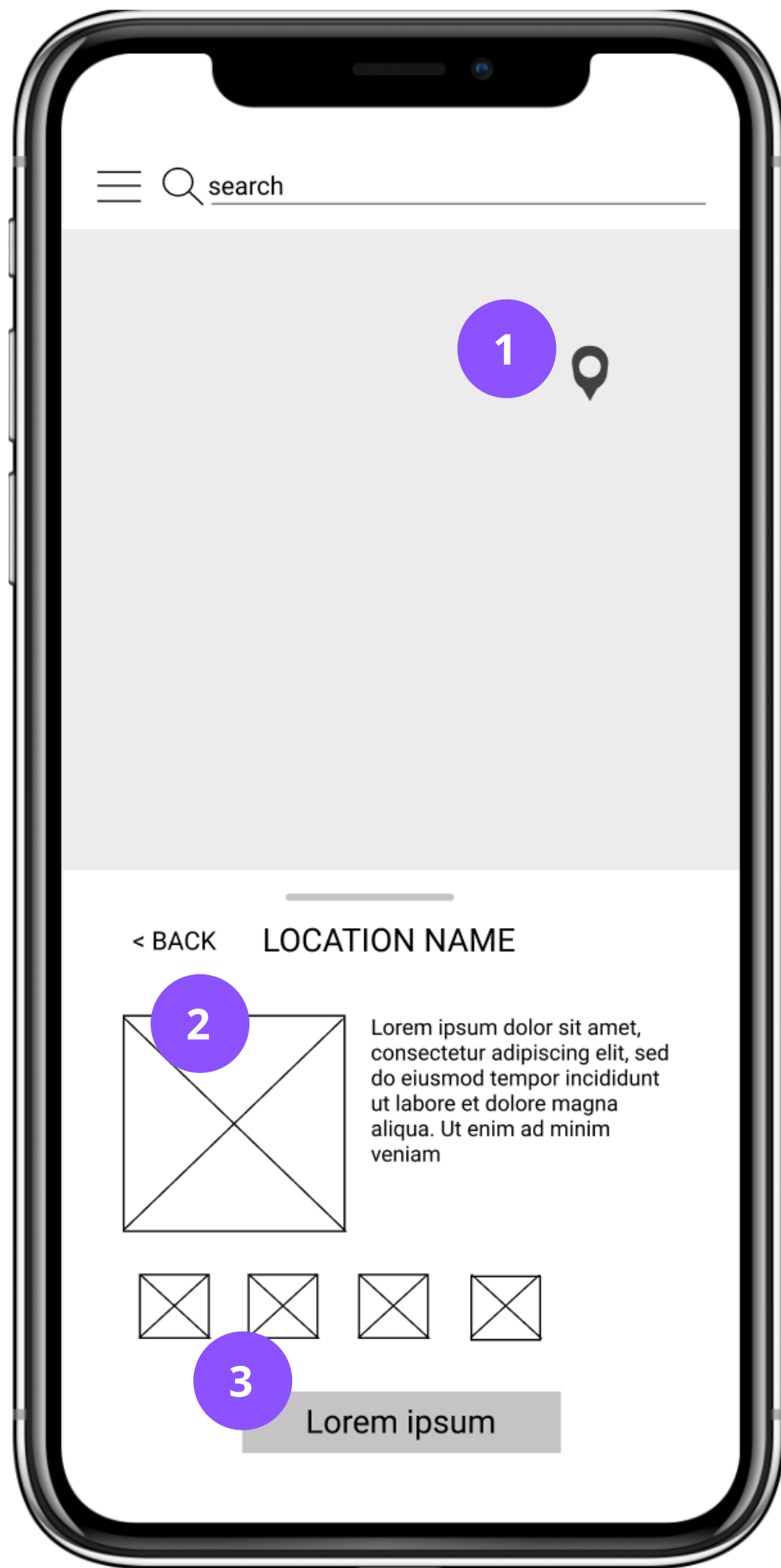
- 1 Choose the different types of locations to explore on the UW campus or in the University District

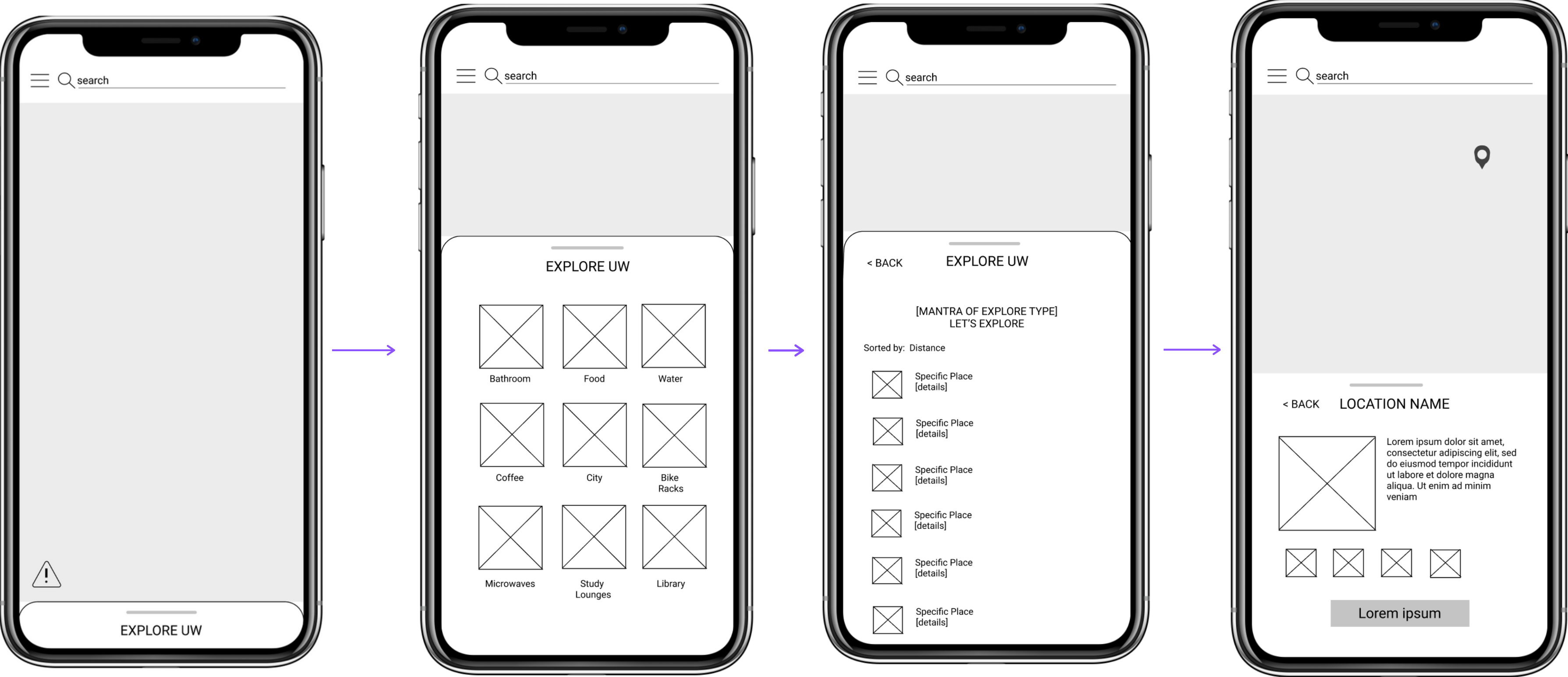
Location amenities and other quick option sections for users to explore and navigate too.

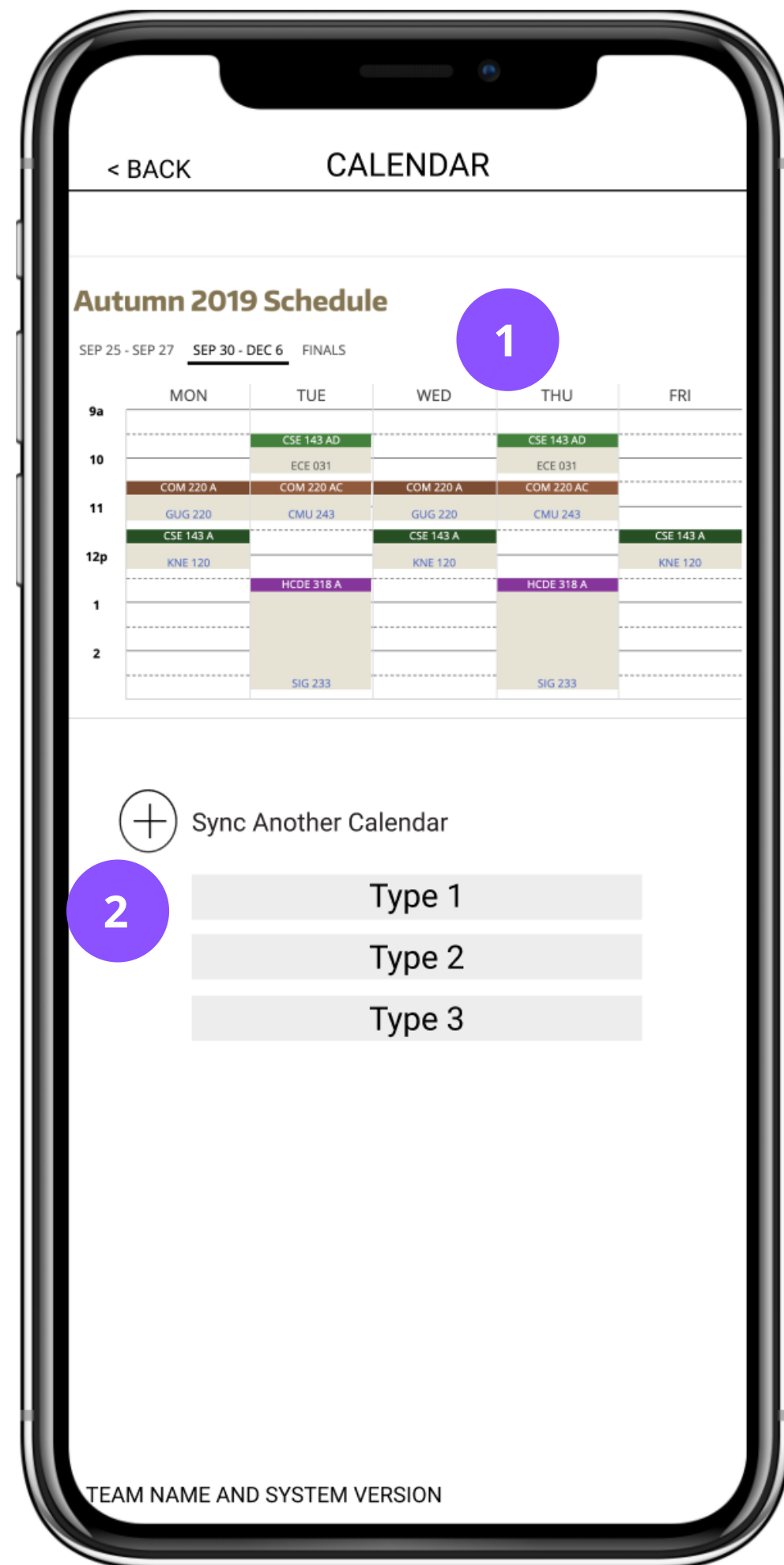


Explore UW Slide-Up: Choosing the Location

- 1 Once location is selected, the location on the map will appear
- 2 Information about the destination appears, and user must choose a method of transportation
- 3 User must select "Go" to navigate to their chosen location

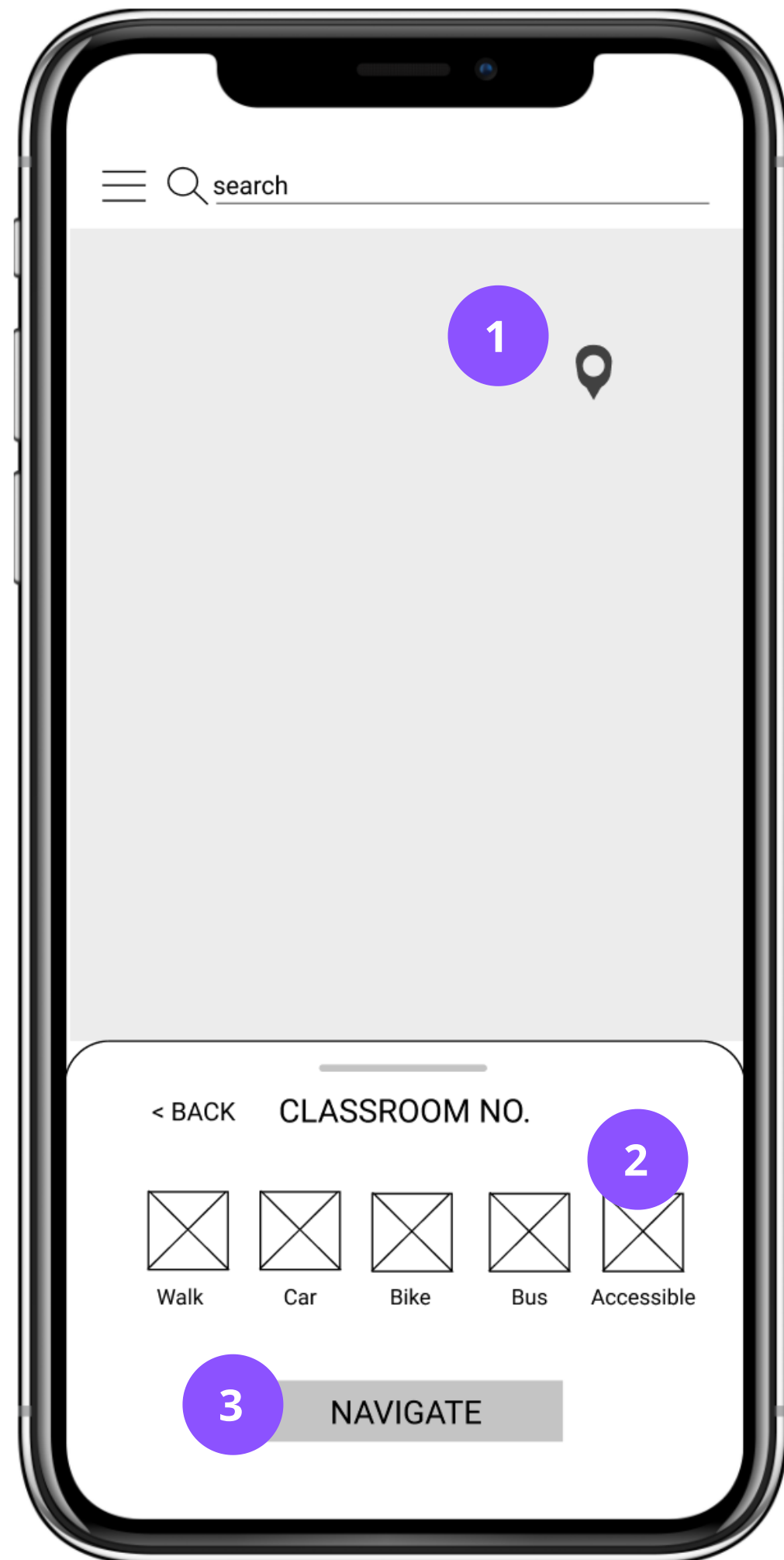
Calendar Function: Calendar Page

User can view their UW Quarter Calendar and navigate to those buildings

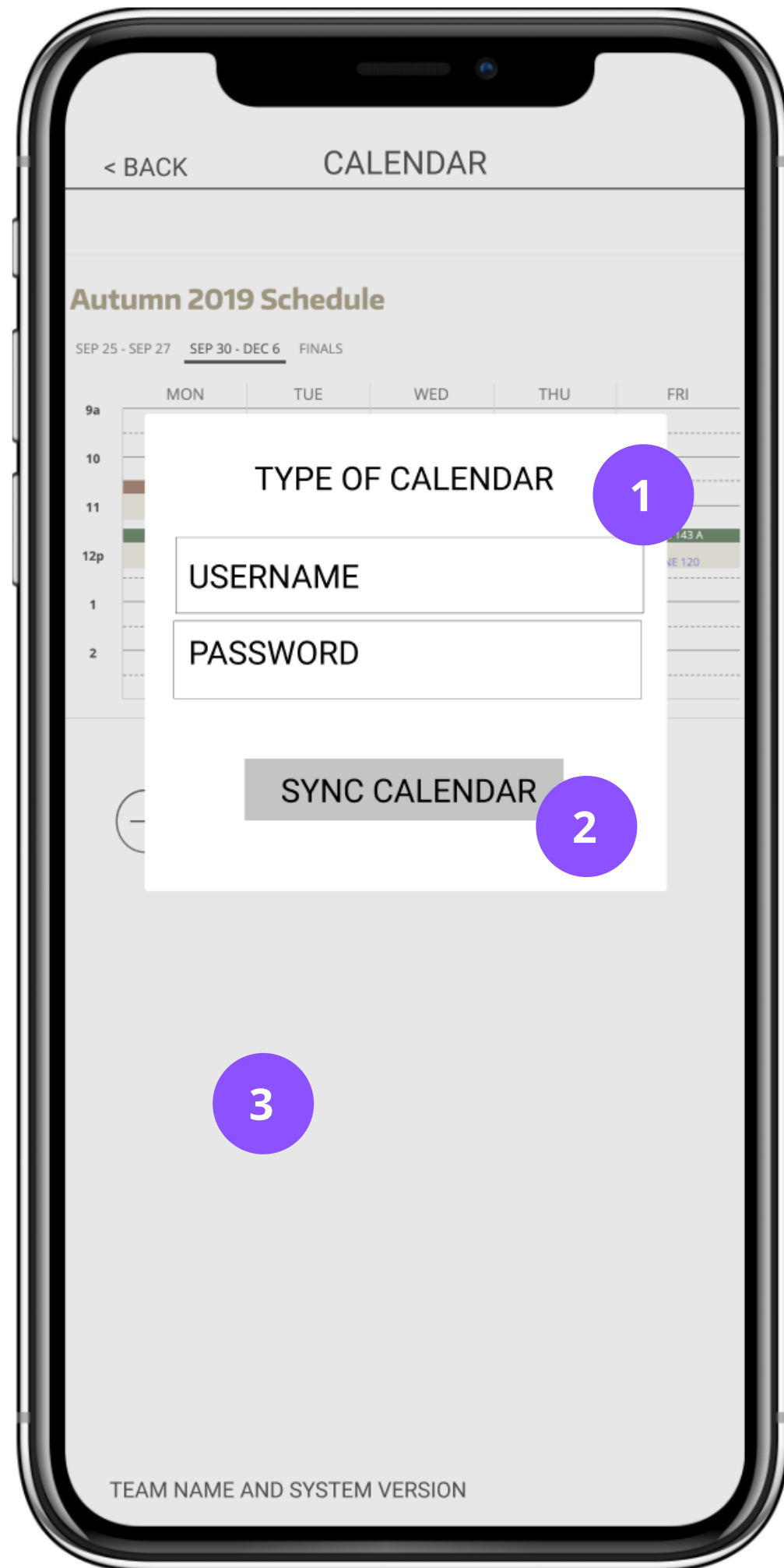

Calendar Function: Finding the Classroom

- 1 User can view the location of the building and the classroom
- 2 Users can choose their method of transportation before they begin their navigation
- 3 User can start navigation, once the mode of transportation has been selected



Calendar Function: Finding the Classroom

- 1 Users can Log-In to the accounts of their other calendars
- 2 Users can sync that calendar to this map to streamline their application usages
- 3 Users can tap out of the Sign-In pop up by clicking anywhere greyed-out
