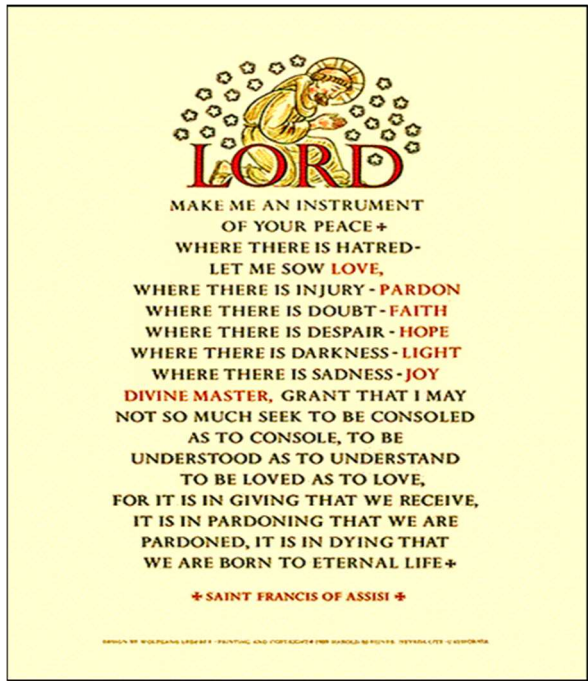

FEAST OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI – October 4

Francis Bernardone was born in 1181 at Assisi, Umbria, Italy. He was an Italian Catholic friar, deacon and preacher. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of Saint Clare, the Third Order of Saint Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land. Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in history. [Pope Gregory IX](#) canonized Francis on 16 July 1228. Along with [Saint Catherine of Siena](#), he was designated [Patron saint](#) of [Italy](#). He later became associated with patronage of animals and the [natural environment](#), and it became customary for Catholic and Anglican churches to hold ceremonies blessing animals on his [feast day](#) of October 4. He

is often remembered as the patron saint of animals.



OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY - October 7

October has been traditionally known as the month of the Rosary. The feast of "Our Lady of the Rosary" is attributed to a vision of the Blessed Mother to Saint Dominic. The Rosary ("rose garden") is called the "Psalter of Mary" because its 150 "Aves" (all 15 decades) correspond to the number of psalms. The Rosary has been called the "Jesus Prayer". While saying the prayers of each decade, the person meditates on the mysteries of our Lord and Lady's life. In addition to the Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious mysteries, Pope John Paul II recommended that the Luminous Mysteries be recited on Thursdays. These "Mysteries of Light" are drawn from the life of Christ, and the public revelation of his Divine nature and mission.

The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was instituted following the Christian victory over the Turks at the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. In thanksgiving for the miraculous victory, Pope St. Pius V instituted a feast to be celebrated throughout the world every year on October 7th. Originally known as "Our Lady of Victory," the feast was changed to Our Lady of the Rosary to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary and the power of the Holy Rosary.

Therefore, don't forget to pray the Rosary at home during the month of October asking the intercession of our Lady of the Rosary to pray for us and for the world. Also join us in saying the Rosary in the church after the morning Mass from Tuesday to Friday.

National Day for Truth & Reconciliation

Past Thursday, September 30 was the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. On the weekend Masses of October 2nd & 3rd, we will acknowledge National Day for Truth and Reconciliation in our Parish. This is to bring awareness to our country's past ensuring that the tragic history and ongoing legacy of residential schools is never forgotten but work towards peace, justice and reconciliation.

We have invited our parishioners David Acco and Julie Lepage who are indigenous to share their culture and bring awareness to our parish community. Therefore, we are inviting parishioners attending Mass in person or online to wear an orange item of clothing to honour survivors of residential schools, their families, and their communities.

You will have an opportunity to speak with David and Julie after every Mass on this weekend as well to make a contribution, if you wish, to a local women's shelter working with indigenous women. As a community we are dedicated towards taking the first step towards reconciliation with our indigenous brothers and sisters. We invite you in the meantime to watch a presentation that David and Julie gave back in June for our community. The aim of the presentation was to help us to increase our understanding and awareness of the cultures of the many Indigenous peoples of our country.
