**BEHOLD! WE COME TOGETHER TO SERVE FOR THE
GLORY OF HIS HOLY NAME**

*“You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind.”
Matthew 22:37*

Jesus gave His life to serve, not to be served. Putting other’s needs before our own needs is a sign of becoming a mature disciple, of following Jesus’ example. Humility is really a sign of strength. God expects us to nurture and develop the gifts He has given us and then generously return a portion with increase. He doesn’t want us to waste or hoard the gifts He has given us. He expects us to grow our gifts, use them wisely and be generous with them. God really does provide for those who are grateful and generous with their blessings of Time, Talent, and Treasure.

In the gospel of Matthew chapter 25, Verse 40 Jesus says, “Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.” (Matt. 25. 40)

Many of us have put off doing something because we think we are too busy. We’ve all said, “I’ll do it later when I have time.” Unfortunately, too many of us apply this attitude to our Faith. Jesus’ call is urgent, in the here and now, in our current circumstances. Don’t delay, how is God calling you to use your gifts today?

St. Paul says: “To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.” (1Cor. 12. 7). Therefore, reflect about what gift God has placed in you to use it for the common good of everyone in the community.

HERE’S A QUESTION ON PRAYING FOR THE DEAD

I know that we pray for the dead, but why do some people have Masses offered very often, sometime as often as weekly or monthly for many years?

When the Catechism of the Catholic Church considers the Creed’s words “I believe in life everlasting,” it states, “Each person receives his eternal retribution ... at the very moment of his death ... either entrance into the blessedness of heaven – through purification or immediately (No. 1022). We cannot know a soul’s fate, although the tone of a person’s life probably provides a clue. The Catechism, quoting St. John of the Cross, reminds us, “At the evening of our life, we shall be judged on our love” (No. 1022). Few of us manifest the perfect

love that merits eternal life, so God's mercy has established a means of purification – purgatory – by which the soul is cleansed and made worthy of heaven (see No. 1031). Our faith assures us that our efforts on behalf of the dead can assist this purification. "From the beginning the Church has honoured ... the dead and offered prayers ... for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice" (Catechism, No. 1032). We cannot know how long a soul's purification lasts, but theology teaches that prayers are not wasted. Thus, if we pray for a soul that has already entered God's presence, our prayers will benefit another. In fact, some individuals pray specifically for "those who have no one to pray for them." *Fr. Reginald Martin*
