



Leader Commitment (Code of Conduct)

Personal Leader Commitment

1. I firmly believe the biblical statements made in the Campbell Gospel Chapel – “What Do We Believe” statement attached to this code of conduct.
2. I commit to conducting myself in a manner consistent with the Safe Ministry Training “Leadership Training Course” when serving at Campbell Gospel Chapel
 - a. I will treat adults, children and young people with respect and value, without favouritism.
 - b. I will behave appropriately, being faithful to my appointed tasks, being an example to others, and being careful in how I physically interact with others.
 - c. I will never use physical punishment or abusive language - even as a form of discipline.
 - d. I will act transparently, as far as possible, ensuring that another adult is present or within eyesight when I am with a vulnerable person (including other people’s children).
3. I commit to ensuring that the spaces and activities I’m responsible for are safe and do not put people at risk of significant harm.
4. I commit to including vulnerable people (and/or their carers/significant other) in discussions about decisions that will significantly affect them.
5. I commit to encouraging openness by listening to people’s concerns with a willingness to support them and help them.
6. I commit to reporting any concerns or suspicions about harmful behaviours and significant risks to the Campbell Gospel Chapel Safe Ministry Contacts without bias or partiality.
7. I will submit to the Campbell Gospel Chapel leader screening process to ensure I’m a suitable person to work with vulnerable people. This includes my commitment to uphold the moral directives and ethical values contained in the Bible as expressed in my personal life, and my relationships with others.
8. I will submit to disciplinary steps if I am found to violate these commitments or act in an otherwise inappropriate or illegal manner at Campbell Gospel Chapel.



WHAT do we believe?

We believe that:

The Bible is the inspired Word of God.

2Tim 3:16-17

There is one God, revealed in three equal persons – the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ) and the Holy Spirit.

1John 5:7

That the Universe and all life is created by God.

Genesis 1:1-31

Jesus Christ is truly God and truly man. He was born of a virgin and is perfect in thought and action.

2Cor 5:21

That every person is by nature sinful and separated from God. Recognition of this condition, repentance, and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ is essential for salvation and restoration of a relationship with God.

Romans 10:9-10

That Jesus Christ died for our sins and rose again. He has now returned to Heaven and will come again to take all believers to be with Him.
