What if a speaker asks many questions in sermons, as I do?


Why do I ask lots of questions?

... Some will probably say, "These was Bible studies not real sermons."

. . because questions are associated more with Bible studies than sermons.

... There are reasons why some are uncomfortable with questions.

- . . because many do not know the Bible well
- . . because of the nature of the top-down education system
- .. because some people are tired or do not feel well
- . . because it is more difficult to think for yourself
- . . because it is uncomfortable to think about personal responsibility




. . The main reason I ask many questions is because of how I view sermons.

- . . Diagram: Most people think of a sermon this way . . .
 - . . top-down, three circles diagram
 - .. from God -- to speaker -- to listener

. . the problem with this common view

- . . This assumes that the listener can not get anything from text himself.
 - . . It assumes he is totally dependent on the speaker.
- . . It ignores the direct connection between listener and God.
 - . . Believers have a direct connection to God,
 - . . and the Holy Spirit works on the hearts of unbelievers.
- .. The common view (in part) reflects Roman Catholic thinking.
 - .. with only the priest being able to receive truth directly from God
- . . In East Asia, this common view probably reflects Confucianism.



. . a corrected sermon diagram

- . . This has an additional dotted line between God and the listener.
 - . . 1 John 2:27 fits this chart -- rejecting the need of false teacher
- . . The relative level of the speaker and listener varies with maturity.
 - . . Mature believers will be on the same level with the speaker.
 - . . New believers will be at a much lower level (as shown on the left).

. . What am I trying to do by using questions and teaching methods?

- . . I am encouraging listeners to learn directly from God themselves.
- . . I am encouraging listeners to ask and answer questions themselves.

. . Applications

- . . Don't despise questioning.
- . . Don't depend totally on the speaker!
 - ... If the speaker doesn't ask an application question,
 - . . ask yourself one. "What does God want me to do?"
 - . . If the message is poor or difficult to understand,
 - . . don't just find fault.
 - . . Get your own message from the passage!
- .. THINK! God wants His people to think!
