## Key Point #1:

Three famous questions were asked by Jesus' opponents in Matthew 22, Mark 12, and Luke 20, but the frequency of verses with questions is higher in Mark chapters two and eight.

## Key Point #2

The highest frequecy of verses with questions is in John, but there are some chapters with few or no questions. Chapters 7, 9, 18, and 21 have many questions: by enemies, Pilate, or the Lord.
