We are currently seeking a Lived Experience Mentor to support participants of the Prison2Employment (P2E) Supportive Services and Earn & Learn (SSEL) program. P2E SSEL is an innovative and collaborative partnership that unites supportive services and “earn and learn” opportunities to assist justice-involved and formerly incarcerated individuals into the workforce. This current opening is for our location in Pomona and surrounding areas.

A Lived Experience Mentor is an individual with justice-involvement in their background, who provides encouragement to program participants in need of additional guidance and problem-solving assistance. This individual will assist with connecting participants with Re-Entry Intensive Case Management Services (R-ICMS) such as: Stabilization needs; enrollment in social services; physical and mental health; housing support; employment and education; and substance use disorder treatment.

Requirements to be considered for the position:

- Justice-involved background – prior supervision by a law enforcement agency, such as Probation, for example
- Demonstrated successful reentry into the workforce
