News of Our Mortgage

What
can I do
to
Help???

At this time we would like to present an overview of where the church finds itself in relation to the "Here We Grow" fund and our mortgage for the CLC with S&T Bank. The "Here We Grow" fund was established to help make the mortgage payments for the CLC with S&T Bank.

The balance in the "Here We Grow" fund at the beginning of the year was \$104,937. The current balance in the fund at the end of July is \$71,255. We are still receiving some contributions to this fund; however, we are averaging about \$4,323 less in contributions needed for our monthly payment of \$9,106.38.

Not to confuse you with so many numbers and dollar

amounts and to make your understanding of the situation easy, we would need an additional \$6,023 each month (\$4,323 + \$1,700) to continue to make our mortgage payments on time. If you are thinking that the church should have kept the payment at the current \$9,106, the loan would not have been satisfied in 2031 and S&T would then have re-calculated the loan payment for the remaining balance at the prevailing rate of interest at that time.

"What does this mean for me? How can I help our church? What is the church asking me to do?" Simply stated: If there are 300 giving units in the church (I be-

lieve there are more), \$6,023 divided by 300 = \$20. If you were able to increase your giving to the "Here We Grow" fund by \$5 per week, we would be able to meet the new monthly payment of \$10,800 and pay off the loan in the timely fashion that was originally set forth.

Please pray about this situation and if you find the means to help your church meet this ongoing financial obligation, please contribute what you can. The Finance Committee wishes to thank you for the continued financial support you have demonstrated through 2020 and the pandemic.

Handyperson Help Around the Church

The church is asking for volunteers to put their talents to work in making some minor but necessary repairs to the building. The church will provide the needed materials. Here is a sample of some of the items that need maintenance:

1. Conduit needs capped on left side of main entrance
2. Spindles on the handicap ramp have fallen out. They need to be put back in and the bottom brace of the railing repaired.

3. Four exterior doors need scraped, painted and some wood repaired:

- Wood door on handicap ramp
- Metal door at base of steps to rear of fellowship hall
- Wood door from side of sanctuary to back driveway
- Wood door at back of church, also needs metal plate at handle.

4. Window A/C bracket at front right of church needs

painted as it is staining the brick

5. Main entrance needs paint as well as the two poles that are rusting at the base from sidewalk salt.

Children's Sunday School, for children Pre-K to 4th grade will commence in person beginning **October 4th at 9:45am** in Fellowship Hall.


Class structure will be determined by the number of participants and their age. Children must wear a mask and social distance guidelines will be followed. Parents will be

Children's Ministry is holding a Stuff-a-Pumpkin fundraiser for the residents of two personal care homes in Beaver County.

Congregation members are asked to donate candy and snack treats. Collection Boxes will be placed at the Church and CLC Welcome Centers October 1 -18. Ideas of what to buy include candy bars,

packaged gummies, chips, gum, mints, Slim Jim's, applesauce, fruit cups, cereal bars, granola, Rice Krispie treats, popcorn, juice boxes, etc. No homemade foods or unwrapped loose candy. All items must be individually wrapped.

The collected goods will be sorted and placed in individual plastic pumpkins to be dis-

tributed to approximately 100 residents the last week of October. "I can't express how much the residents appreciate everything your church has done. Most of the residents...don't have anyone and are thrilled that someone thinks of them," said the Director of one of the homes.

Reading Program

As you know, school is different this year with many children being taught virtually or in a hybrid model. With these changes come restrictions that preclude volunteers in the school building. Thus, we are not able to hold the Volunteer Reading Program at Big Beaver Elementary School this school year. However, there is GOOD NEWS!

We have been given the green light to begin a new program at the school that will be beneficial to the school children and provide a great volunteer opportunity for church members. **The Pen Pal Project** is a monthly letter

writing correspondence between volunteers and matched second grade students at the Big Beaver Elementary School.

Just as the Reading Program was umbrellaed under Church Union in Pittsburgh the Pen Pal Project will be as well. The letter writing program will be carefully monitored by the second-grade teachers and Susan Winters.

Many volunteers are needed for this program. Unlike the Reading program where not every student in the class had or needed a reader the Pen Pal Project necessitates that every second-grade student

has a pen pal. One highlight of the program is that volunteers do not have to go anywhere. You can write at home as your schedule permits. The letters will be simple one page. Complete details about the writing program will be forthcoming.

Hello, Men of GOD, Disciples of Jesus Christ, Brothers.

Prayerfully all is well with you and your family. So good to be back in church. I had two thoughts this month. "Words of encouragement and GOD's Will."

Look men, it is on us. We need to be strong. We must let our family and others, especially brothers and sisters in our Christian family, lean on us. We must show strength in Christ and spread his love.

Listen men, listen "Nobody cares how much you know, until they know how much you care". It starts with us men, we need to start with our family, our pastors, at work, at gatherings, at the Z-Pub, at Walmart, wherever we go. We need to give "Words of Encouragement."

Do you know the Impact on somebody when we give words of encouragement?

Have you ever hesitated to speak words of encouragement because you weren't sure how they would be received? Being an encourager means reaching out even

when you're not sure. The book of Proverbs 12:25 says "Anxious hearts are very heavy but a word of encouragement does wonders."

If you have someone you know who is going through a rough time, call them or visit them and tell them you love them. You know they're going through a rough time. You're there for them. Tell them to lean on you. Pray with them. Call every week or see them. Believe it or not, two or three sentences can turn a person's life around.

GOD's Will: Too often, whether we voice our belief or not, we act as though GOD needs our help. We wrestle with GOD for some degree of control over the event in our lives thinking that is his will.

In effect, we make a proud stand and proclaim, "Okay, GOD, I think this is what you want to happen, so I'm going to work and work and work and make it come about. (I think that's what happened when we moved to Florida).

Somewhere in the back of our minds we hear the old saying "GOD helps those who help themselves." That's not true. It's never been true. Some Christians believe it's in the Bible. It's not actually. It's 100 percent contrary to the word of GOD, which instead tells us to be still.

He knows we can't help ourselves. That's why he sent his son to die for us, because we are utterly helpless to improve our sinful condition. (Romans 5:8)

While we seek to do God's will, we must not forget his call to stillness before him. When we are still and quiet in his presence, we put ourselves in the most loving and teachable position possible for his will. When we have peace in our heart, then what you hear is GOD's will.

Are we too busy trying to keep up with GOD? Let's lay down our efforts and simply be still. What we discover in the stillness may

change our call to Christian service.

Encouragement and Be Still—think about it, men. "Nobody cares how much you know until they know how much you care." GOD doesn't help those who try to help themselves, find time to be still in His presence. GOD will help us and we will have peace in our hearts when He does. Be strong. Remember, GOD says whom shall I send? Send us GOD. We are ready to serve.
