How Do We Think About All That We Have?

Usually we think of owning so much stuff. Our house, our car, clothes, TV, furniture and so on and so on.

We don't think much about being stewards of things. That is why they have been given to us--to take care of and use wisely.

So when we talk about stewardship in the church we often think it just has to do with money.

That is wrong. It has to be with our point of view. How we look at things. Do we see ourselves as someone who has been successful in life so we are able to buy a lot of stuff? Or do we think of ourselves as someone who has been blessed by God to be able to work and earn and grow?

It is all in our point of view, you see.

Do we think that the church is asking for money because it needs money, or do we think that God has blessed us and given us the ability to give? Do we think that we should pick a dollar amount that would make us feel good and give that to the church? Or do we think that all that we have comes from God, and we are so thankful that we desire to give a percentage of what God has given us?

How has God blessed you this year? What is the percent that you give to God? Seven percent? Three? Ten percent?

It is easy to take our yearly income (a good guess) then

figure what is ten percent of that? Divide that by fifty-two (weeks in a year) and that would be a tithe or ten percent.

Is our weekly giving close to this amount?



Or take our weekly giving amount and times it by fifty-two and see what percentage of our yearly income it is.

This month we will be challenged to see things differently.

Family Activity: Thanksgiving Blessing Tree Make this craft together and display in an area where the tree will produce family conversation. shape. Cut a tree trunk shape out of brown construction paper. Glue it on a large piece of poster board. Add the family handprints as leaves above the tree trunk, turning it into a beautiful fall tree. If you are enthusiastic, go outdoors together and look for a medium sized tree branch with several smaller branches extending from the main branch. Place the branch into a container that will hold its weight. Tie your colorful handprint blessings with yarn to the tree branch limbs.

How to Pack a Shoe Box

- **Get a Shoebox** – Pick up a specialty OCC shoebox in the Church Welcome Center or use an average-size cardboard or plastic shoebox.
- **Girl or Boy?** - Decide whether you will pack a box for a girl or a boy, and the age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14.
- **Fill with Gifts** - Select a quality “wow” toy such as a doll, soccer ball with pump, or stuffed animal. Then add other fun toys, hygiene items, and school supplies.
- **Do Not Include** - Used or damaged items, war related items, chocolate or other food items; liquids or lotions of any type including bubbles, hand-made or knitted stuffed toys; anything of a political, racial or religious nature; sharp objects; glass containers, mirrors or fragile items; playing cards of the 4-suit variety.

- **Pray** - Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift. You can also include a personal note and photo.

- **\$9 SHIPPING LABELS** – Donate \$9 online and receive a shipping label to Follow Your Box and discover the destination of your shoebox gift, or include a check of \$9.00 per box payable to Samaritan’s Purse.

If you are preparing more than one shoe box, funds may be combined into one donation check.

Did you know that the land the Community Life Center sits on is what used to be a rather large garden? A garden that year after year produced a bountiful harvest of corn, beans, tomatoes, strawberries, and many other healthy vegetables. Because I grew up in the neighborhood, I would watch Mr. Gumpf till the soil, plant seeds, nurture and harvest his garden every year. It sure was hard to resist the temptation to pick the delicious looking strawberries as I rode my bike past the garden.

Today our CLC sits on that fertile soil that Mr. Gumpf nurtured many years ago. We, as a church family, are now planting seeds, nurturing their growth and preparing a bountiful harvest for our Lord on that soil through all the activities and worship that take place in the building. It has been a blessing to our

church family and the community. A place not only for activities but a place where participants hear the word of God, sing His praises and are nurtured to grow as disciples.

A few weeks ago, Pastor Allan explained to us how the mortgage payments on the CLC will have to increase to pay off the loan in 10 years. He encouraged us to give what we could to the Here We Grow Fund to cover the monthly increase of the loan. There is also another avenue of giving to this fund called the "Tree of Life."

The Tree of Life is physically located on the wall at the top of the church lobby stairs. It is a gold leafed tree with acorns and foundation stones around it. On the leaves, acorns and stones there are names engraved of people who have given a donation in remem-

brance of a loved one, a congratulations of a special occasion or a family legacy by people who have been blessed by life in our church. All donations to the Tree of Life will be used for payment toward the mortgage of the CLC and the property purchases that were necessary for its construction.

God will continue to bless the ministry we do in the CLC because we do it in His name. May we be faithful stewards of His property.


