The City Garden Montessori Institute's Teacher Education Program exists to prepare Anti-Biased, Antiracist (ABAR) Montessori educators in public school environments; to increase access to Montessori training among Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) and other historically marginalized groups; and to offer relevant, rigorous Montessori education to children and their families.

Why attend the Institute for your Elementary Montessori Teacher Credential?

The Institute was established to prepare educators in the Montessori public sector to meet the needs of all children within the context of their unique identities. "We must tear out our hearts, cleanse them of prejudices and begin again so that the theory and the practice are one and the same..." – Dr. Maria Montessori

Additionally, the educators in training at the Institute are engaged in culturally relevant pedagogy that prepares a rich environment centering and engaging Black, Indigenous, and other children of color, connecting them to a fully viable curriculum in which they will thrive. Our training is comprehensive and affordable. With low summer residency (about a month each summer), and online coursework during the academic year that is relevant to the life of the classroom, adult learners find a better balance of work, life, and training.

Reasons for Delivering Montessori ABAR Pedagogy in our Training

Systems of Oppression, Racism, and Privilege are present in our culture and in our Montessori institutions. Therefore, we Prepare the Culture for our Teacher Training by:

- bringing awareness to the manifestations of racism and privilege in our own lives, in the systems we create and support, and in our broader culture;
- working together with intentionality to dismantle and reorganize the systems that perpetuate racism and privilege within contemporary Montessori education;
- delivering anti-bias education and a culture of antiracism throughout the Montessori Teacher training experiences.

Tuition & Fees

Elementary I (6-9) or Elementary II (9-12) – \$10,000 Elementary I & II (6-12) – \$13,000 The cost of tuition includes the following: MACTE Adult Learner Fee – \$166 AMS Student Learner Fee – \$240 METTC Album/Materials Licensing Fee – \$1,000

The adult learner is responsible for acquiring adult course texts that are not directly provided by the City Garden Montessori Institute (CGMI).
