Handshake: High School Ice Breaker and Welcome

On Wednesday, August 17, our high school students connected in "Handshake", a welcome mixer for high school students on the first day of school. Enjoy some photos and descriptions.





















The Handshake event began with all of the high school students gathered on the basketball court organized by class. The S.A. officers explained the games and then asked each class to try and scream the loudest to show support for their class.







Keigo, a new sophomore student, shared "I was kind of nervous because it was my first day of school but I could talk with other students. There was an opportunity to talk with students so I wasn't alone."









The first game the students played required a "volunteer" from each class to stand in a bucket of ice water while the students took turns breaking a frozen shirt until it could be untied and warn by the volunteer. Emma, a junior, shared "You had to smack it a lot and it isn't the easiest thing. When the timer was going down it was sad because the juniors had one knot, they got it out when the timer went off and we were like "why can't they count it" so we got 2nd place".









Bianca, a Sophomore shared, "Jason was 'volun-told' to be our volunteer for the Sophomore class. Despite this, he was a good sport about it."







Next, the students got in class groups in four corners of the field and placed all of their shoes in the middle. Students took turns running to grab shoes from the pile, and the class that retrieved the most pairs of shoes won this event.







The next game was two classes competing against each other to see who could move a bucket of water over their head with their eyes closed, passing water to the end of the line. The class with the most water, who got through the most people, won.







Emma, a junior, said "I liked the water bucket one because my friends poured the whole bucket on me. Two actually."











Valeria, another Sophomore shared, "I liked that S.A. had us include body paint in a color chosen for our class. Bianca wrote Sophomores on her arm and a number 25 on her cheek."



The students created class "flags" for the next game and then these were judged based on creativity, artistic expression and have each student sign.



For the final game, students were numbered and then took turns competing against each other with pool noodles and water balloons. Leo, a Sophomore s1hared, "I liked the noodles and water balloons. That game was cool. That was my favorite game. At the end everyone grabbed a water balloon and threw water balloons at them."

PFE Mentor Scholarship Update

San Diego Academy is continuing to offer the PFE Mentor Scholarship program. This wonderful program allows a student to be matched with an older mentor for the school year. Students will meet with their mentor once a week (1 hour for K-8 and 2 hours for 9-12) and then write a reflection about their experience. The goal is for this program to be mutually beneficial for both the student and the mentor. Students in grade K-8th grade can apply to earn \$30/hour per week up to \$150/month as a credit towards tuition. High school students will meet 2 hours a week every week and will earn \$800/semester towards tuition. We held an orientation for this program on Aug 25 after back-to-school night and the program is currently FULL, however if K-8 families have not found a mentor for their student by Friday, Sept 9, we will give up their spot to those on the waitlist. High school students will need to have a mentor and be signed up online by Tuesday, Sept 6, otherwise we will open up there spots. Remember the scholarship in high school is "all-or-nothing" and you must meet four 2 hours every week for 14 weeks this semester in order to get paid.

In order to apply, you need to fill out the application and watch an Orientation, even if you have participated in the program before. Please contact the coordinator, Denise Avitia, at school@sdacademy.com to apply and if you have any questions.
