This week the 1st graders created projects out of boxes that depicted various places in their community such as a school, church, the zoo, a fire station or library.






2nd Grade Native American Projects




This week the 2nd graders created projects depicting various Native American homes which reflected the different parts of the country in which they lived.






6th Grade Nativity Artwork
