What to expect if your child's bubble is asked to isolate by the school

In the unfortunate event that Public Health England request that your child's bubble must isolate, you will firstly receive a phone call or parent text from the school. If your child is in school, you will be asked to collect them as soon as possible. Current guidance means that you are not expected to collect or isolate siblings in this instance.


Teachers at Ecton Brook will set daily work for your child. Government guidelines suggest one hour a day of English, one hour a day of maths and one hour a day of another curriculum subject such as Science, Geography, History, RE or PSHE. Guidelines also suggest that where possible, pupils should take part in physical activity each day. In addition, reading with your child remains a high priority in supporting their learning.

The majority of your child's daily work will be set on the online Purple Mash Learning platform, which can be accessed directly from the school website. Here, teachers will upload daily work and set daily tasks. Some of these tasks may include accessing other online resources, such as Scholastic Reading, but all of the necessary information will be on Purple Mash. The exception to this is Reception Year who will continue to use TAPESTRY as they have been since the beginning of September. Paper packs will be made available for pupils who have limited access to online learning.

Purple Mash



- Access Purple Mash by going into the **PUPIL** section on the school website.
- Your child already has a login and password.
- The teacher and your child have been using the platform in school so your child will already know what they need to do.



- When your child logs in they will see the home page. They should click on **Work** and they will see the page opposite. Here they will see any work tasks that have been set for them
- They will also receive alerts on the purple bell, which will guide them to work tasks.
- When your child completes work, the teacher will be sent an alert.

Home Learning support

The school website has a new tab named **Home Learning.** Here you will find useful learning links, online safety resources and useful tips on how to support your child at home. There are also some really helpful Purple Mash 'how to' guides. Paper copies of some documents are available.

Feedback

Your child's teacher and teaching assistant will be available each day to provide your child with feedback. This will mainly occur through the Purple Mash platform (Tapestry for Reception Year), where information and correspondence can be sent confidentially between pupils and teacher. Pupils who are working through paper packs will receive a phone call from their teacher or TA, daily. In addition to online communication, your child will receive one phone call per week for a catch up on their work.
