Recommended Reading




Recommended Titles

Prayer and the Priest Christian Meditation & Priestly Life Personal Reflections by PRIESTS IN MINISTRY



Priests everywhere today find their zeal worn down by overwork, tensions in communities, and the social climate. In this book, they share very personally how they found the spiritual depth they needed in the practice of Christian meditation. While the stories vary according to the experiences of the writer, there emerges from this collection of voices a single affirmation of the transformative power of meditation. The deeply personal stories show how meditation has penetrated their lives, their relationships, and their faith, and helped to shape and regenerate their vocations. Anyone struggling with their prayer life – priests, those training for ministry, and lay people – will find this book a source of hope, inspiration, and practical wisdom.

Living with the Mind of Christ STEFAN REYNOLDS



Fr Laurence describes this book as the 'bridge' between today's interest in Mindfulness and Christian contemplation as practised through the ages. Dr Stefan Reynolds shows how Mindfulness can be an entry point into Christian meditation and the riches of mysticism. The book speaks from a solid Catholic tradition yet is accessible for everyone. He shows that the Mindfulness of Christ sets us free from unnecessary worry. Stefan Reynolds is a Benedictine oblate of the WCCM and an associate of the Irish Cistercians. He gives regular retreats and seminars on Christian mysticism.

Strike the Cloud *Understanding & practising the teaching of The Cloud of Unknowing* GRAEME WATSON



This book presents the main themes of the 14th-century classic *The Cloud of Unknowing* in a contemporary form. G Watson helps us discern whether we may be called to contemplative prayer, explores the effectiveness of the one-word prayer, explains the significance of the 'cloud of unknowing' and the 'cloud of forgetting', and shows how active and contemplative approaches to God are complementary. He then reflects on humility and charity as two virtues fundamental to human living, explores how contemplative prayer deals with the roots of sin and examines whether such prayer may be considered Christian in the fullest sense. This book will be helpful for anyone wishing to know more about contemplative prayer. Excerpts of the talks are available on CD under the title *Talks on the Cloud of Unknowing*.
