MID-2022 IMPACT REPORT



New Incentives uses a cost-effective, evidence-based approach to increase routine childhood vaccinations in northern Nigeria, a region with some of the highest child mortality rates and lowest childhood vaccination rates in the world. Working within government clinics and in conjunction with existing programs, New Incentives raises awareness about vaccinations, supports vaccine supply efforts, and provides small cash incentives to caregivers after their infant has received the latest round of vaccinations. New Incentives operates in Nigeria as the All Babies Are Equal Initiative.

This impact report highlights our progress through mid-2022 as reflected in infants reached, cash transfers disbursed, vaccinations administered to infants in the program, and estimated lives saved to date.
