New Incentives - All Babies Are Equal (NI-ABAE) provides cash incentives to caregivers in northern Nigeria to increase childhood vaccination rates. When caregivers bring their infant in for routine immunizations, we provide a small cash incentive and information about the importance of vaccinations.

The All Babies program operates in government clinics in partnership with state and local governments and immunization partners.

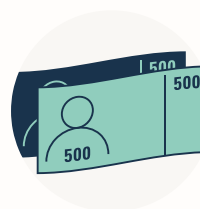

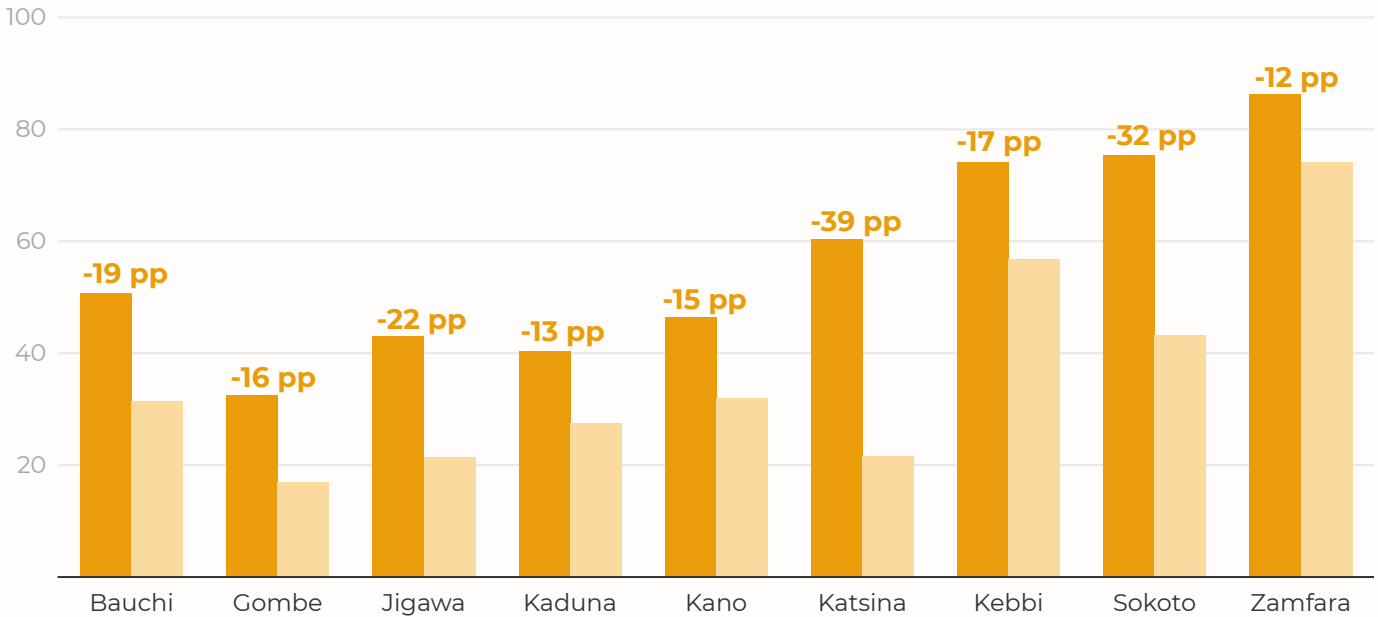
# Program Overview

This chart demonstrates the change in zero-dose children in areas where the All Babies program operates.

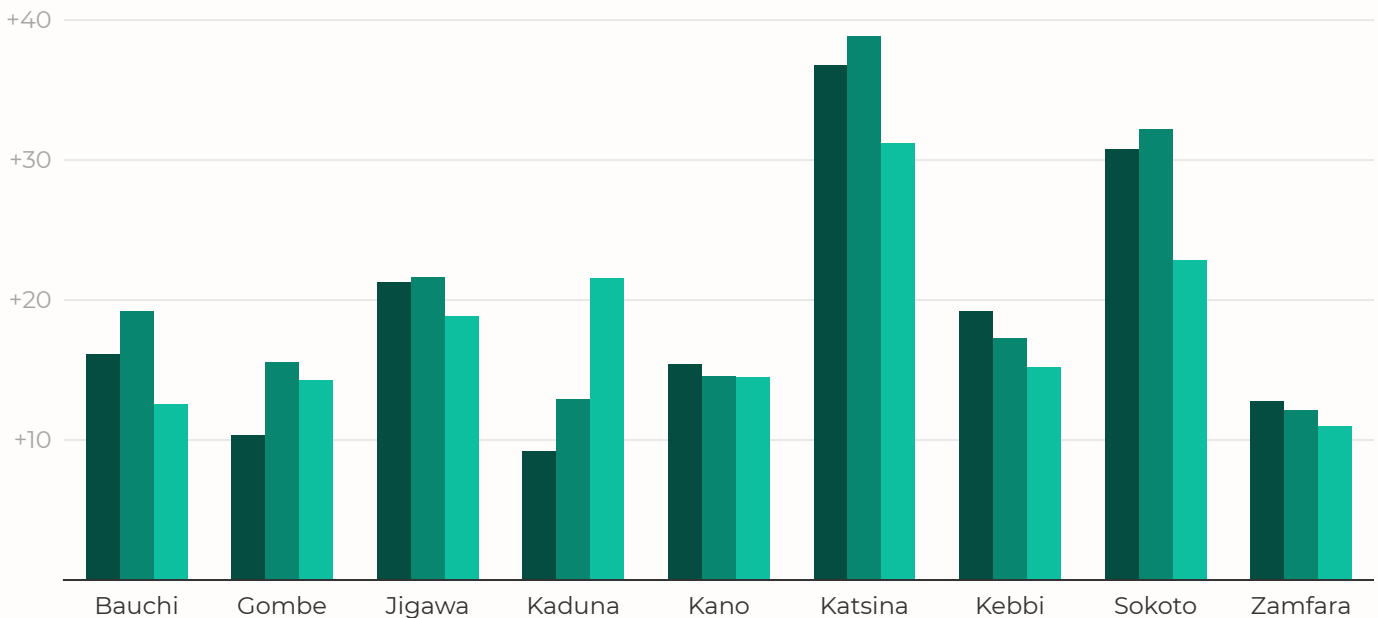
■ Baseline (before program rollout) ■ Follow-up (after program rollout)

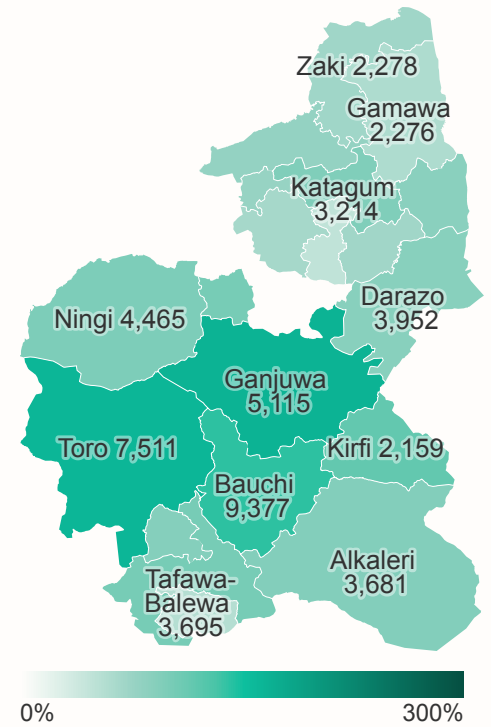

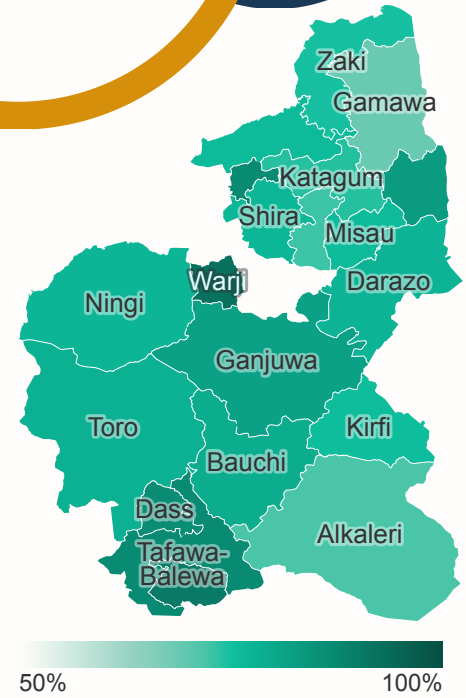

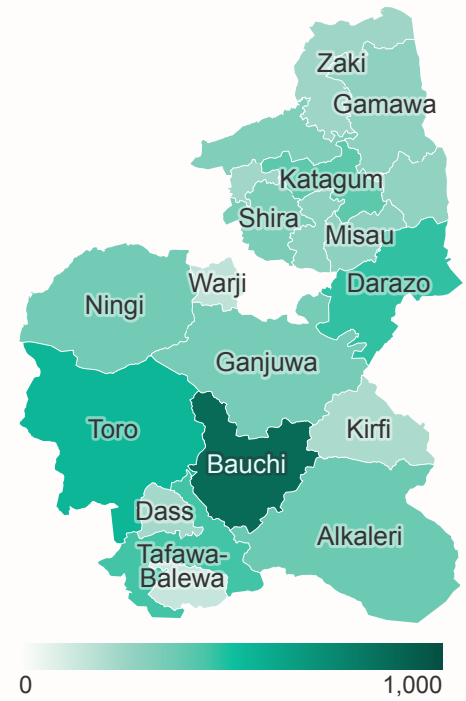

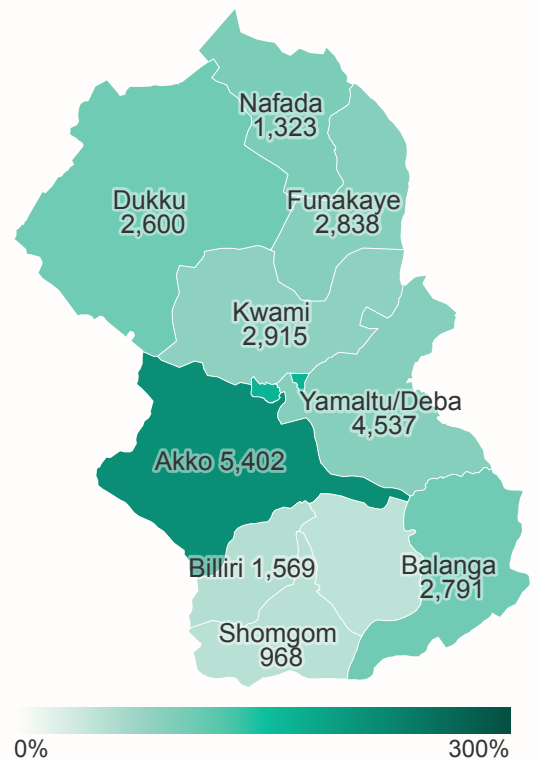

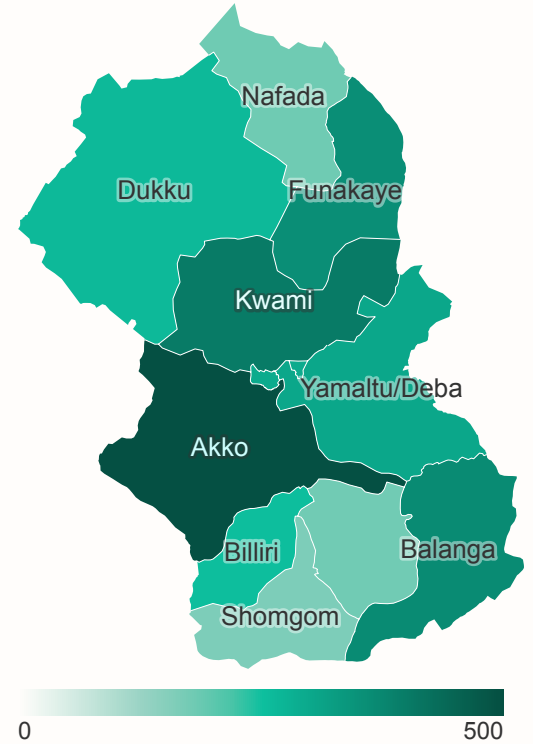

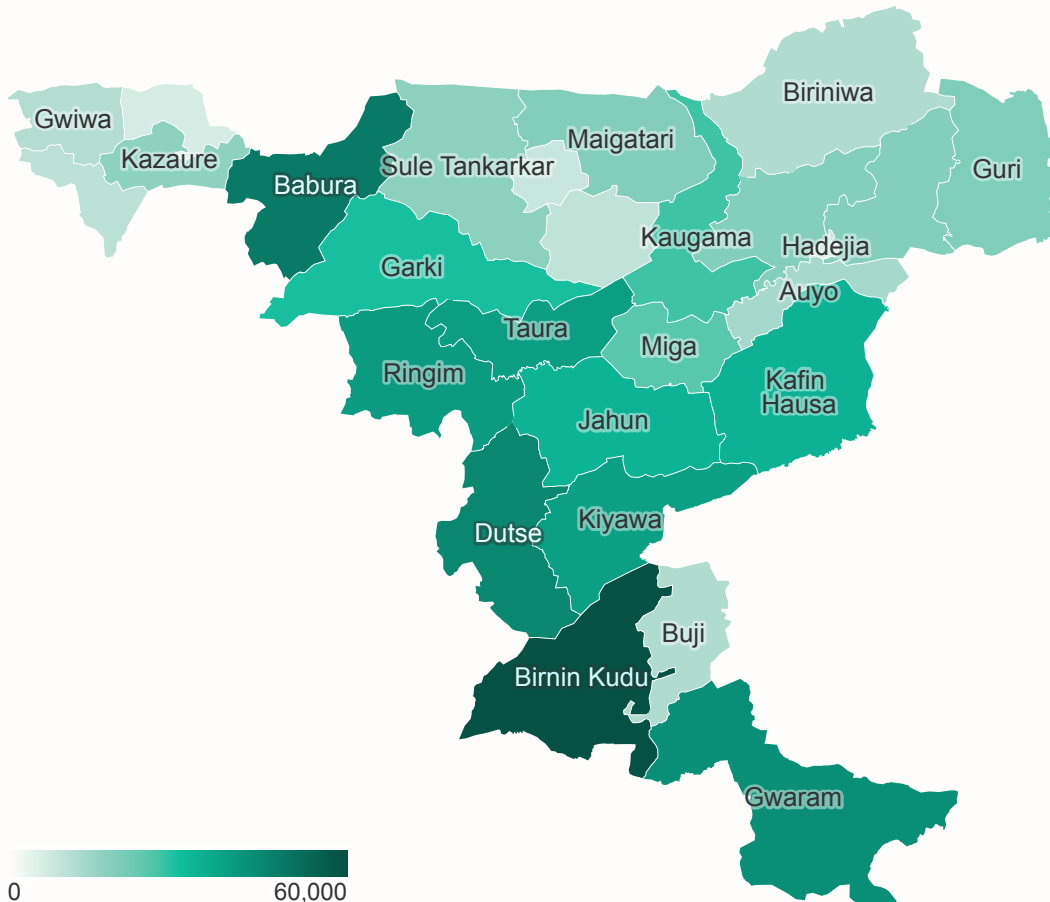

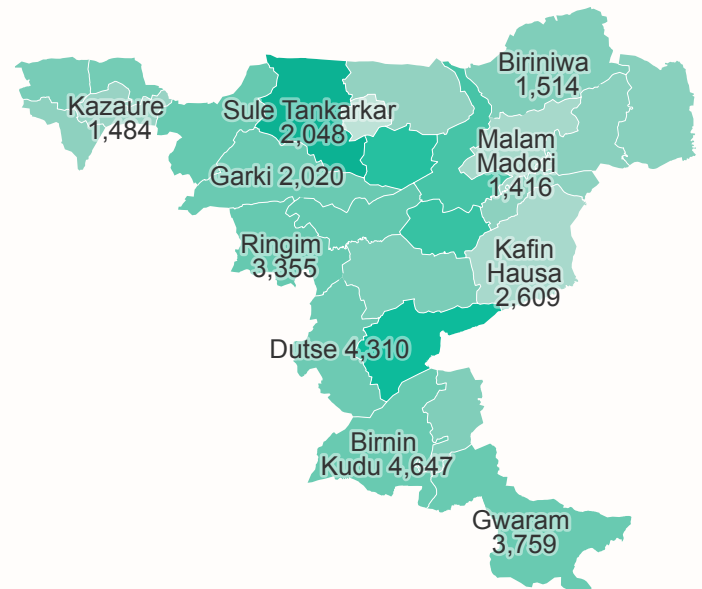

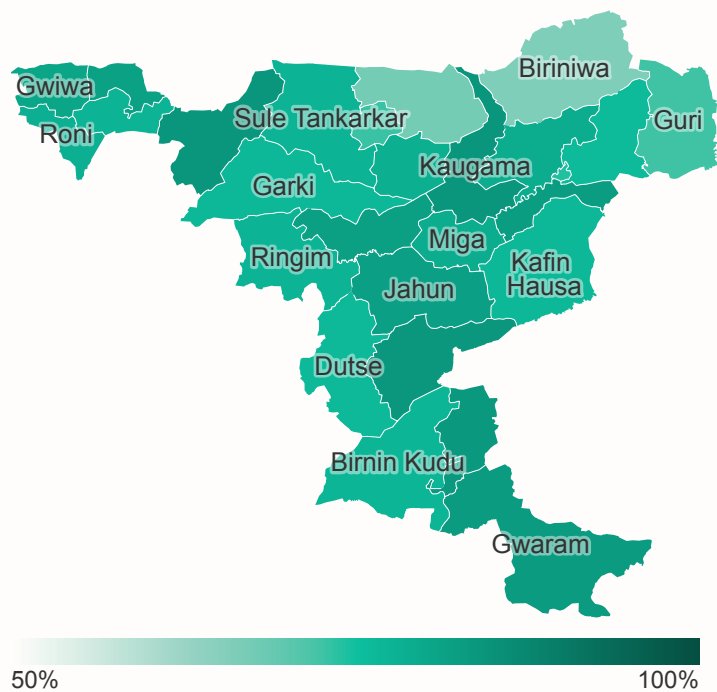

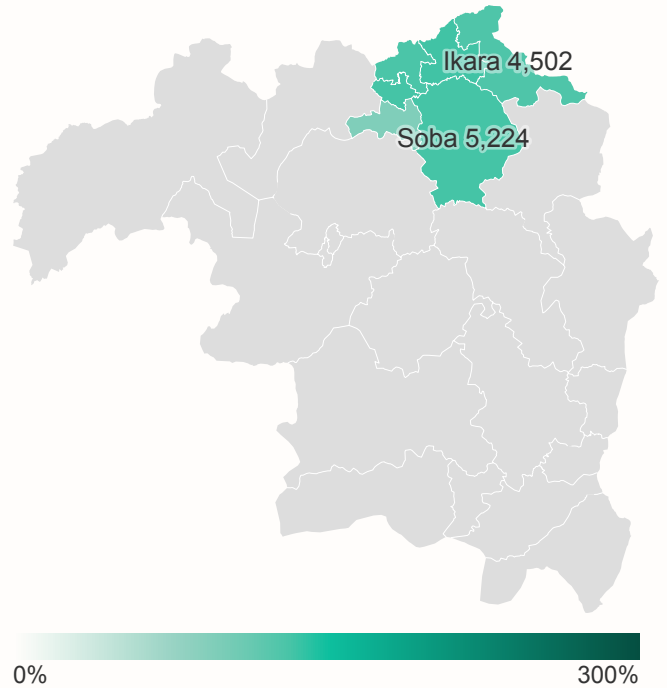

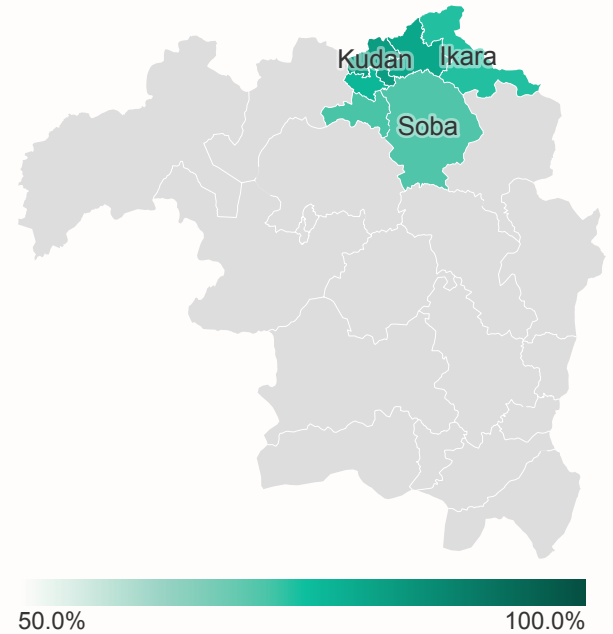

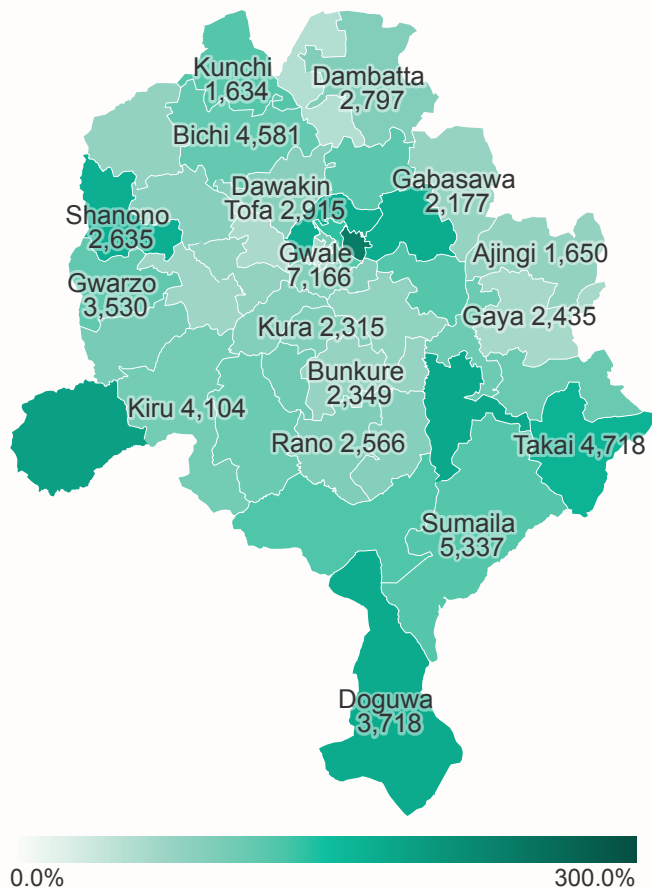

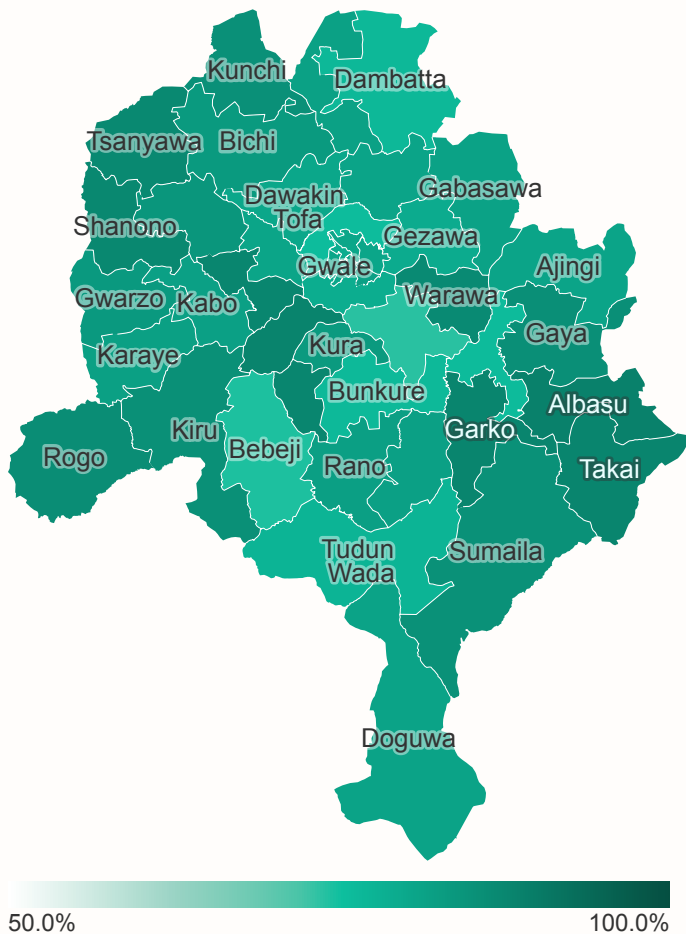

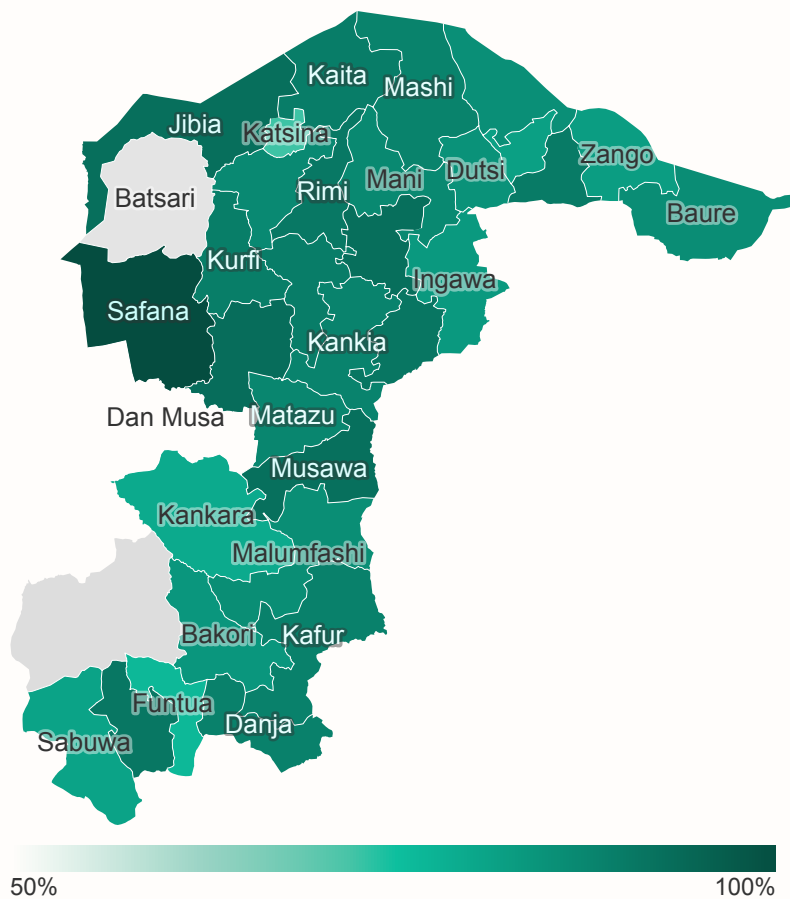

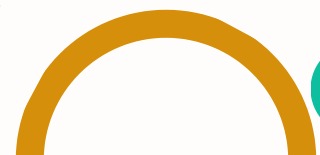

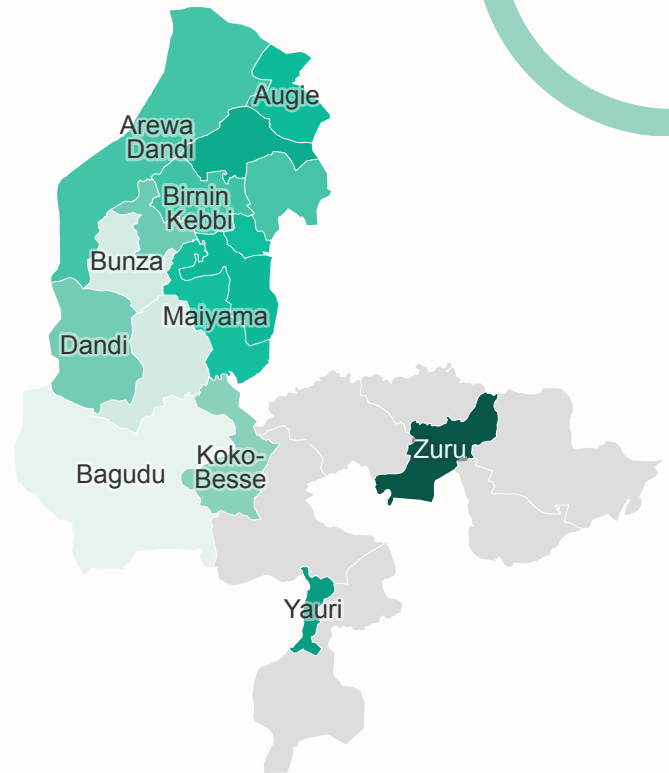

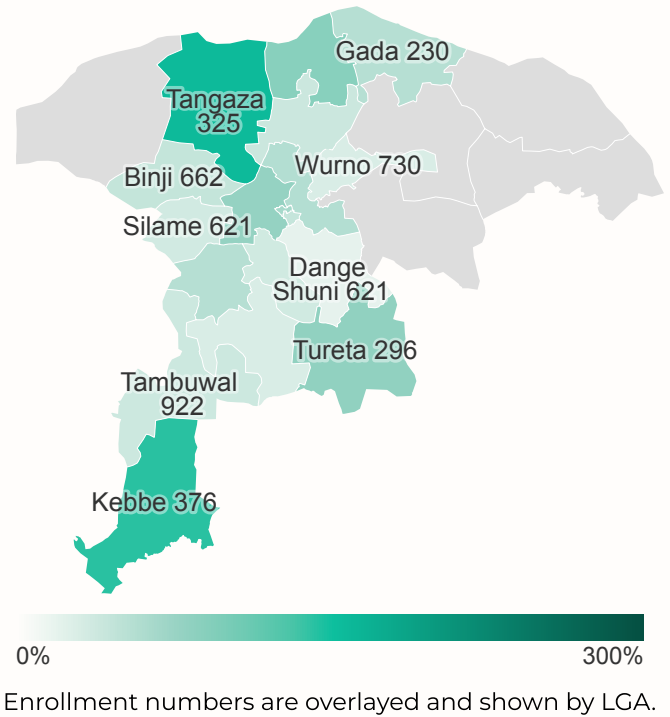

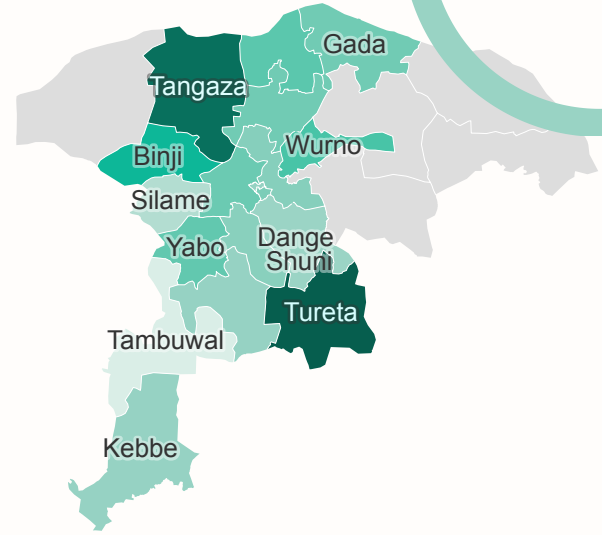

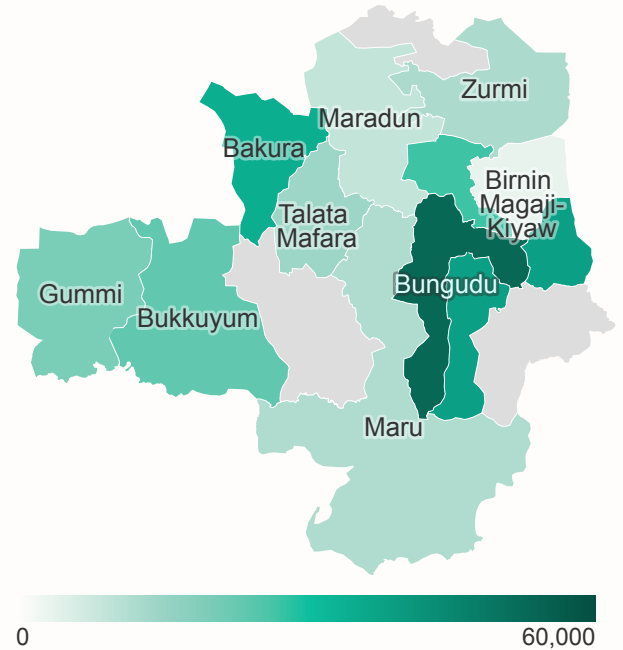

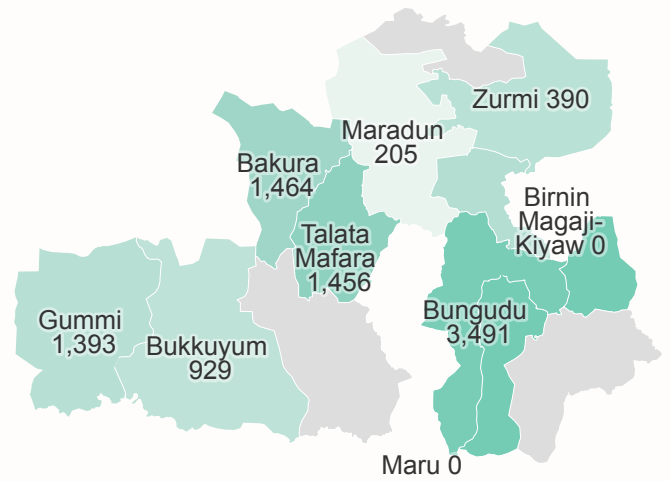


# Zamfara Uptake

Jan - Mar 2024

This chart and map show the estimated uptake among under 1 infants within a 5km radius of program clinics.

Infant population is estimated for the clinics where our program operates and is based on data from the Humanitarian Data Exchange (HDX) and other sources, assuming a birth rate of 4%. Estimated Enrollment can exceed 100% in some cases due to catch-up infants (infants who are missing or have not received doses of vaccines for which they are eligible, per the immunization schedule) and other factors.

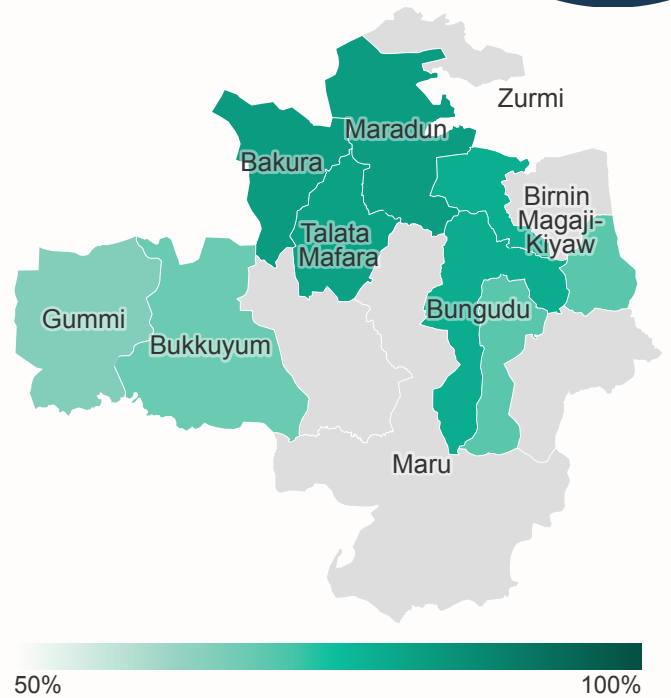
# Zamfara Immunization Rate

## Jan - Mar 2024

This map shows the Penta 3 immunization rate among infants enrolled in the All Babies program. Out of the number of infants due to receive Penta 3 and other vaccines during the 14-week routine immunization visit, this is the percentage of infants who received at least the third dose of Penta 3.

In the chart, you can see retention rates for infants enrolled in the program for Penta 1 (6-week RI visit), Penta 2 (10-week RI visit), Penta 3 (14-week RI visit), Measles 1 (9-month RI visit), Measles 2 (15-month RI visit). Some infants may return a few weeks late after due dates which will be reflected in subsequent reports.

The numbers in parenthesis indicate the number of enrolled infants who received the vaccine.

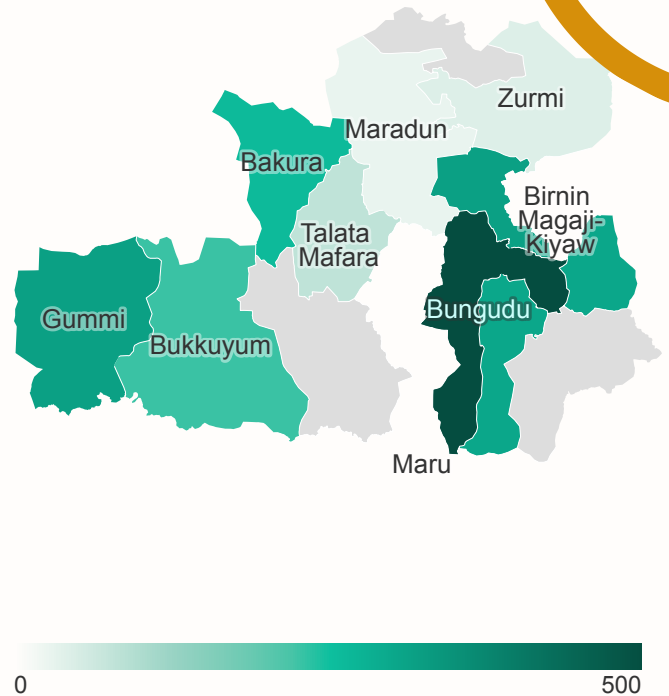


# Zamfara Activities
