Healthcare Management

I have been Clinical Director or Specialty Lead of my department since 2003 and have a good understanding of NHS Management under various governments. I have recently been on the Councils for The British Society of Otology and Royal Society of Medicine, which are both involved in standard setting and education of ENT surgeons, as well as the allocation of prizes and awards.

As part of the audit cycle I am constantly evaluating the efficiency of our clinics, theatres, as well as patient satisfaction.

Clinical Experience

I have been an active, practicing NHS Consultant in general otolaryngology with a special interest in otology and audiology over the last 18 years. In addition to a heavy general workload, I carry out approximately 30 stapedotomy operations a year (quoted by the SAC as the most in UK). I run specialist otology and dizziness clinics, working closely with the audiology department. I performed live surgery each year on the Merseyside Ear Course till the retirement of the organiser Prof T Lesser in 2016. I also run general, paediatric and rhinitis clinics.

I see a similar mix of cases in my private practice where I also carry out medico-legal consultations, including medical negligence.

Research Experience

Although more involved in research in the past (see publications), I am involved in the following fields of research which often involve medical students and surgical trainees:

Sleep Disordered Breathing and Snoring

Since 1994 I have been investigating the diagnosis and treatment of snoring disorders. Currently I am focusing on outpatient diagnosis of site of noise vibration and severity of sleep disorder breathing.

Otology

I have used my large otology workload to carry out research and audit into various topics including dizziness, stapedotomy and grommet insertion.

Rhino-sinusitis

Wythenshawe Hospital has a large respiratory medicine department with six Professors and a research laboratory. Current studies include laryngo-pharyngeal reflux and cystic fibrosis.
