The kids are beginning to fall in love with the sport, keep up with the pro disc golf videos, and take interest in practicing to better their skills.



Kansas City Mission Trip

During the mission trip to Kansas City in June, We were able to work with Agape Pamoja (Greek: sacrificial love, Swahili: Together/community) to renovate a house that will be used for a refugee family from Africa. We went on the trip for 1 week, and were able to take half the staff as well as five of The Bridge youth leadership class students. While working on the house, some of the Agape Pamoja Congolese youth worked alongside us. Through that, we were able to get to know them better and encourage them. We were also able to play with many of the Congolese kids while we were at the job sites. During one of our days there, we had a grill walk in one of the rough neighborhoods in Kansas city. The neighborhood consisted of lots of refugees, Hispanic, and African American
