

Day 1-2

Cruise to Koh Lipe (2hr cruise)

In the local Chao Ley language, 'Ko Lipe' means 'Paper Island'. Ko Lipe is home to a number of Chao Ley (literally, people from the sea), who were granted the right to settle on the island back in 1909.

You can walk from one end of Ko Lipe to the other in just 30 minutes. The island has 3 main beaches; Pattaya beach, Sunrise beach, and Sunset beach, all within 15 minutes walking distance of one another. In addition, a number of uninhabited islands, such as Koh Adang and Koh Rawi, are just a short boat journey away

Just west of the island, are some of the best diving spots in the world, near the Jabang area one can see black rock beach and many coral reefs that stretch far and deep for the ultimate scuba diving experience.



Suggestions...

We suggest staying in Koh Lipe for one night at anchor and leave only the following afternoon to Koh Rok Noi.

The vast amount of snorkeling spots in the area must be explored and the beaches are just incredible, whatever your favourite watersport is this is the place to do it.

Day 3

Cruise to Koh Rok Nai (2hrs)

Contains two small islands: Nok and Nai, Nok Island is very suitable for diving, the water quality is very good, there are many fish. There is a white sand beach on the island, and if you dive here, you can also see a lot of coral reefs. There is a waterfall in the southwest of Nai Island, which is the landmark of the island. The waterfall flows directly from the height to the sea.

The shallow reefs here are a destination for amazing snorkeling, jet skiing and all water-sports. There are spots situated on both sides on the two islands where you will find many sea life and the currents are generally not very strong making it an easy going swim and relaxing time in the water. Using a tender boat you can even go right up to the waterfall.



Suggestions...

We suggest spending a full day near here to properly enjoy the reefs. Hopping on board for a great lunch and sun bathing. Enjoy all the watersports you have the energy for. Later in the evening we will sail to island of Ko Libong, so when you wake up you will have the views of the largest island this side of this side of the sea.

Day 4

Cruise to Ko Libong (2hrs)

The largest but certainly not busiest island in Trang province, Ko Libong lulls travellers into a simpler state of mind with its unusual landscapes. Lucky visitors might catch a glimpse of an endangered dugong. Close cousins of the manatee and more distantly related to elephants, around 130 chubby and amiable dugongs, also known as "sea cows".

The Dugong habitat is situated on the east side of the island, however they do not migrate, so the chances of seeing one year round is a good possibility for those willing to do the scuba dive.

It is also known for the beach resort where there are bars and great relaxing locations to be found if you want to venture onto the land itself.



Suggestions...

Keeping in mind a lot of the reef is unswimmable during low tide, there are spots where from the yacht you can dive right in or take the tender boat to a great snorkeling spot, hopefully find a couple of Dugong for an unforgettable memory of the great endangered sea animal. A full of water sports and swimming here is a must to take it all in. We can head to the island of Ko Muk next after a short night cruise.

Day 5

Cruise to Koh Muk (1.5hrs)

Cruise to Koh Lanta Bay (2hrs)

Koh Mook, often also called Koh Muk, is a small idyllic island in the Andaman Sea in the south of Thailand. Much of the island consists of deep jungle and intact nature, as well as small, charming villages. The coast, in turn, is lined with palm trees, gigantic cliffs and gorgeous beaches that invite to relax.

The absolute best attractions are the breathtaking Emerald Cave (Morakot cave) and the snow-white Sivalai Beach. The open cave has an entrance that you must swim into.



Suggestions...

Anchoring near Ko Muk, we would definitely invite you to see it's best attraction which is emerald cave. Keeping in mind that the high tide can pose a problem swimming into the cave, but a MSUT SEE! Spending a half a day in this beautiful place and taking in the jungle landscapes of this paradise island, we can then make our way to Koh Lanta bay where there is a beautiful beach to relax and take in some sun and a great

swim. Snorkeling and jet skiing is great around here.

Day 6

Cruise to Maya Bay (half day)

Cruise to Koh Phi Phi

Maya beach is famous as it is where the movie “The Beach” was shot starring Leonardo Di Caprio. The bay was actually closed down for 3 years for absolutely everyone, this means that all the natural marine life has grown back and all the coral, fish and all underwater beauties have repopulated the beautiful bay and makes it very rich in sea life once again.

Day 7

Cruise to Phuket area (overnight 4hr)

There are many small island gems around here all very very unique in their own way, so if there is time to see them all, go right ahead and enjoy them. From resorts, beach dining, swimming, water sports and exquisite island rocks to set your eyes on.

The vast variety of clear water beaches are the last to see before getting to Phuket itself. It is a wonderful area to explore from Chicken Island to Coconut beach and the resort beach club. Setting your sights on a full day out here before finishing your journey is the best way to end an epic vacation.



Suggestions...

We suggest seeing all the little hidden gems in this area, where the waters are still clear before you get to Phuket itself. Naka Island is very close to the Marina and therefore guests who need to get to the airport can easily be taken from this location with the tender boat.

But before you leave, Chicken Island and the beach resort can be one last relaxing stop. There are activities on land at the resort such as Quad biking and some inflatable slides in the water at the beach club.
