

Overnight cruise to Menorca from Calella
Menorca to Palma

Day 1

Cannes to Saint Tropez
De Port Cros National Park
Marseilles

Cannes is a commune located in the Alpes-Maritimes department, and host city of the annual Cannes Film Festival, Midem, and Cannes Lions International Festival of Creativity. The city is known for its association with the rich and famous, its luxury hotels and restaurants, and for several conferences.

The island of Port-Cros is Europe's first land and sea park, take a stroll in the forest with the birds or photograph the fish and seabeds... A multitude of magical moments that allow you to reconnect with nature!

Marseilles is home to the largest port in France. Marseille is now France's largest city on the Mediterranean coast and the largest port for commerce, freight and cruise ships. Marseilles—Cadaqués

With amazing beaches and perfect weather this small town is a place to see and enjoy for a day at least. The evenings offer romantic sunsets and great dining experiences.





Day 3




Day 4

Calella—Menorca
