What do you cover in the Enterprise Programme?

The Enterprise Programme is designed to support participants through various stages of exploring, planning, establishing and growing their business. The programme explores:

- Human-centered design
- How to find business opportunities
- Storytelling for your business or brand
- Experimenting with your business idea

Stage 1: Enterprise Online

Time for you to test your idea, identify your customer and connect with others in an informal, engaging and supportive environment.

Stage 2: Enterprise Connect

Roll up your sleeves, it's time to take your tested idea and turn it into a reality! The workshops provide technical support to develop your business concept, understand your legal and operational responsibilities and build a viable business plan.

Stage 3: Enterprise Meet Ups and Events

We regularly host bespoke seminars, webinars and networking events to learn from industry experts and stay connected.

Stage 4: Accelerator Programme

An intensive programme designed to rapidly scale early-stage businesses. Stay tuned! We're launching this year.

Participation in the programme is free.

How are workshops structured?

In Enterprise Online, facilitators are joined by Prince's Trust staff to take you and your cohort through the programme over three, two-hour sessions via Zoom.

In Enterprise Connect, facilitators are joined by Prince's Trust staff to take you through the programme over seven sessions via Zoom. The programme is delivered in collaboration with the ADF Financial Services Consumer Centre.

All programmes include free access to a selfdirected learning platform.

What if I'm not sure I want to start a business?

That's fine! Many come through the programme as a way to learn new skills, identify personal strengths and create new networks as a pathway to employment.

What else do you offer?

Alumni are invited to join our members only online groups, promote your business through our Buy Veteran campaign and be eligible for funding and marketing opportunities through our partners.
