



Governing displacement after the Arab uprisings? who governs who and what? and to what end?

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This seminar looks at the governance of displacement in the context of the Arab revolts and their aftermath. In the first part, we conceptualize refugee governance in a region that is characterized by weak regionalism, fragmentation and protracted conflicts. In the second part, we explore key trends, dynamics and policies (both local and international) that have shaped refugee trajectories and pathways of precarity and dispossession. We also look at how refugees as actors in their own right have shaped governance from below.

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
