

Cookie Policy

WHAT IS A COOKIE?

Cookies are small data files that websites send to your computer when you use the internet. Cookies are not used to run programs or deliver viruses to your computer.

We, and our third-party service providers, use cookies and similar technologies to collect information about, and relevant to, your use of the Website (www.getkarma.co.uk) ("Website"). Information from cookies may include information relating to your use of the Website, information about your computer, browser type and geographic data.

This is the cookie policy of Karma Technologies International Limited of 18 Finsbury Square, London, United Kingdom, EC2A 1AH ("we"). This cookie policy applies to the Website.

WHAT SORT OF COOKIES DO WE USE?

Strictly Necessary: These cookies are essential to enable you to move around the Website and use its features. Without these cookies, services you have asked for (such as remembering your login details) cannot be provided. We also use these cookies to help us keep your data safe and secure.

Functionality cookies: We use these cookies to enhance the functionality of the Website. They are not essential in order to use the Website. If you do not accept these cookies, you will not be able to use some functionality. Functionality cookies provide you with improved functionality to the Website; such as remembering your language preference, your privacy settings and integrating your use of the Website with social media. If you accept these cookies, these cookies may share information with suppliers who provide services on the Website. The information shared is only used to provide the service and not for any other purpose.

Analytics and customisation cookies: These cookies collect information about how you use the Website; for instance, which pages you go to most often, what searches you perform and if you get error messages from web pages. We use this information to help understand how the Website is being used. We also use the information to determine how effective our marketing campaigns are. We use the information to help us customise the Website for you. The information collected is aggregated and is therefore anonymous to us.

We use Google Analytics. The information generated by the Google Analytics cookie (including your IP address) will be transmitted to and stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google will use this information for the purpose of evaluating your use of the Service, compiling reports on activity and providing other services relating to activity and internet usage. Google may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where third parties process the information on Google's behalf.

Security cookies: These cookies form part of our security features, for example by helping us detect malicious activity or violations of the Website terms of use.

WAYS IN WHICH YOU CAN REFUSE OR CONTROL COOKIES

You may block cookies by adjusting settings on your browser. However, if you restrict our cookies, you may not be able to access parts of the Website.

Unless you have configured your browser to refuse cookies, our system will issue cookies as soon you visit the Website. You can however delete those cookies.

When you first visit the Website, a pop-up header will be generated alerting you to our cookie policy. It will re-appear in the event that you change your cookie settings at some time.

Strictly Necessary Cookies are needed in order to deliver the Website to you and can't be turned off in our systems. However, you can set your browser to block Strictly Necessary Cookies. This prevents your browser from accepting the Strictly Necessary Cookies but then some parts of our Website might not work. All other cookies can also be blocked or deleted by changing your browser settings, as described below.

The "Help" section on the menu bar of most internet browsers will tell you how to prevent your browser from accepting new cookies, how to have the browser notify you when you receive a new cookie and how to disable cookies altogether.
