

What is MOAA?

The Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) is the largest and most influential military officer association in the nation. Founded in 1929, it is a non-profit organization with almost 350,000 members. The national headquarters is located in Alexandria, Virginia.

Objectives of MOAA

To foster fraternal relations among retired, active duty, reserve component, and former officers of America's uniformed services and to protect the rights and interests of all members of the uniformed services and their families and survivors.

Who is Eligible to Join MOAA?

Membership is open to active duty, National Guard, Reserve, retired, and former commissioned officers and warrant officers of the following uniformed services: Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Space Force, Coast Guard, Public Health Service, and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. **Surviving Spouses** of deceased officers are also eligible for membership.
