Dear Senators Crapo and Whitehouse:

On behalf of the United States Nuclear Industry Council (USNIC) I commend the approach taken to expand clean energy as set forth in your discussion draft of the Energy Sector Innovation Credit (ESIC) Act. It is especially encouraging that you have expressly included nuclear in your text, acknowledging the instrumental role the industry can play in our nation's long-term energy and climate strategy.

As you know, the goals that have been set for reduction in carbon emissions cannot be met absent continuing and advancing the use of nuclear technology. Moreover, American leadership in nuclear development and deployment is essential to a cleaner more resilient energy future.
