The Padstow to Rock Swim 2022

Date - Sunday 26 June

Thank you for your interest in applying for a place on the **Padstow to Rock Swim 2022**

The next Padstow to Rock Swim challenge will take place on **Sunday 26 June 2022**. The event is a Charity open water **SEA swim** across the Camel Estuary, starting at Padstow and finishing at Rock, with a distance of approximately one mile.

Entry for the **2022** swim can only be obtained through the ballot system.

The public ballot entry for the **2022** swim opens on the **18 October 2021** and closes on **30th November 2021**. Entries must be with us by **3 December 2021**. You will be informed by **20th December 2021** whether or not you have been successful in getting a place on the swim. Registration fees must be received by **30th January 2022**

Ballot instructions:

- Please complete the form overleaf in full. Incomplete forms will not be accepted.
- Return the form to us by post by **3 December 2021**.
- One form per person (no double entry or multiple entries allowed). Photocopies accepted.
- Under 14 years must be accompanied by a named adult swimmer – applications to be on separate forms but submitted in the same envelope.
- Send in your completed form, along with a **stamped, self-addressed envelope** to:

- If offered a place on the swim, you will need to pay a **£35** entry fee per person by **30 January 2022**, to secure your place. Please note – your swim place is **not** secure until you have paid your entry fee.
- **Places on the swim are non-transferable and entry fees for the swim are non-refundable.**
- After **20 December 2021** we will keep a reserve list of unsuccessful applicants, and may, at our sole discretion, should we receive cancellations, draw such number of places from the reserve list as appropriate.
- **The minimum age is ten years on Sunday 26 June 2022.**

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Please read carefully

Open water swimming is physically challenging and carries with it risks that we cannot entirely eliminate. These include the risk of hypothermia, collision, fatigue, and exhaustion. In open water such risks can endanger your life or cause injury. Conditions on open water could change adversely during the swim. Bear in mind, you are not in a controlled pool, you are in the sea.

We take every possible precaution. Powered safety vessels, safety canoes, and Lifeguards on rescue boats will accompany you. Though your safety depends on your co-operation and personal fitness. You need to be frank with yourself and us about your swimming ability.

In the absence of any negligence or other breach of duty by us, participation in the Padstow to Rock Swim is entirely at your risk.

Terms and conditions of entry

- We are not qualified to express an opinion that you are fit to safely participate. Before entering into the ballot for this event, you should be fit to participate, seeking medical advice if appropriate. Should you be successful in gaining a place on the swim, you should inform event organisers of any relevant existing medical conditions and any arising that might affect your fitness to participate and, in any event, you should not participate against medical advice.
- We have taken all reasonable steps to eliminate the chance of injury but there is a certain minimal risk in every activity, and you should withdraw from the event if you have any doubts.
- You must attend the pre swim safety brief by the Swim co-ordinator.
- You must act responsibly and sensibly at all times.
- You must not participate if you are under the influence of alcohol or non-prescription drugs.
- Your safety is of paramount importance. Please ensure that you follow all safety instructions and training procedures when participating in events.
- Wet suits are compulsory.
- **Liability cannot be accepted for any damage, injury or loss arising from the negligence of participants or spectators (whether through failure to observe the rules of the event or otherwise).**
- **Marie Curie, its employees, agents and volunteers accept no liability whatsoever to participant or spectators in respect of any loss, damage or personal injury which may be sustained in the course of this event other than death or personal injury caused by our negligence or other breach of duty.**



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- Photographs may be taken of you during the event by or on behalf of Marie Curie which may be used to publicise future events and the work of the charity generally, including publication on our website. Participation in the open water swim will be deemed to include your consent to such publicity.
- Age restriction: You must be at least **10 years old on 26 June 2022** to take part in this challenge. All swimmers aged **10 -14 years on 26 June 2022** must be accompanied, in the water, by a named competent, registered adult swimmer. Adult swimmers must complete the registration for children that are under 14 years old and register themselves.
- Anyone under the **age of 16 on 26 June 2022** requires parental consent. Parents or guardians must decide if the event is appropriate for their child and seek additional information if necessary.
- We reserve the right to prohibit individuals from taking part, and will do so if participants under 16 have failed to provide evidence of parental consent.
- Registration is £35 per participant and is non-refundable and non-transferable.
