# The Collect for Purity

## The Summary of the Law

# Readings Isaiah 6.1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple.

Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew.

And one called to another and said:

'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.'

The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke.

And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs.

The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.'

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

# The Gospel

This is the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 3: 1-17

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews.

He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.'

Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.'

Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?'

Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit.

What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit.

Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above."

The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes.

So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.

'Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?'

Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony.

If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things?

No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man.

And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

## Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel Praise to Christ our Lord

Reflection: The Rev'd Canon Bob King

To God the Father, who created the world;
To God the Son, who redeemed the world.
To God the Holy Spirit, who sustains the world;
Be all praise and glory, now and for ever.
Amen.

The reading from the Old Testament, from the book of the Prophet Isaiah is a very special reading.

Well, it's very special to me.

On Sunday July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1994 I read that passage in Hereford Cathedral on the day I was to be Ordained as a Deacon.

Gosh 27 years ago.

To me there has always been a bit of an Irony that the 3<sup>rd</sup> of July is also the feast day of St Thomas the Apostle. Doubting Thomas. The disciple that did not take things on face value but needed to see and understand for himself.

I read about the year in which King Uzziah died and the dreams that Isaiah was having about the seraphs attending the Lord on His throne.

The seraphs (and remember this is the OLD Testament, before the Son of God had arrived on earth) who said "Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of Hosts"- Three Holies! All equal and a great title for a hymn which we will have at the end of this sermon.

I continued to describe the thick smoke that filled the house and then I had to read the words

"Woe is me, for I am a man of unclean lips" etc etc.

I read those words as a Lay person

An hour later I was Ordained

I became Reverend.

I was still Bob

I was still a husband, son, brother

I was still a Father, Friend, Uncle

I was still a man of unclean lips

But I was Ordained.

All the other parts of me were the same, just my role had changed.

During my life I had learned work skills. – to be a catering manager, a salesman and now a deacon and a year later a priest.

I had amassed knowledge, I had read books, I had remembered some of the things I had been taught and was trying to put them into practice.

However, this year I seem to have forgotten one of my mentor's teaching. – Always delegate the Trinity Sunday Sermon to someone else!!

I remember we all had lunch after the Ordination Service, and I had a very large and refreshing Gin and Tonic. Gin, Tonic and Ice - each element blended together. Individually they're unique yet when mixed in a glass the three elements become one, each playing a very important part but equally blended to produce a perfect, life-giving and very drinkable libation.

I always marvel at ice – incredible stuff. Is it water? Or when frozen is it ice? Or if you boil it, is it steam?

No, it's just water – in 3 different forms.

After we had eaten and everyone had gone home I decided I was hungry so I had a Mars Bar.

Chocolate, Caramel and Nougat. All different ingredients but all have to be present in a Mars Bar – none of them more important than any of the others. They are equal but all essential and a Mars Bar is not a Mars Bar without the three of them.

Thinking about Mars Bars I'm reminded that God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit are with us as we work, rest and play. Their relationship with each other, totally intertwined, is like the relationship we strive for with the Trinity and with those around us – working, resting and playing.

St Augustine said this about the Trinity by the way.

He said, each part, Father, Son and Holy Spirit is equal. Not one greater than the other or even greater than the other two added together.

Interesting theory. I have always thought. A new slant on Pythagoras Theory. The square of the hypotenuse is equal to the sum of the squares on the other two sides.

No, I never got that at school either.

Once again 3 things:

The Trinity is all about Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Interestingly, it is not described anywhere in the Bible, but it is the bedrock of our faith.

All three of them are different. Yet in their diversity they live and work in unity and harmony.

God has always been present since before time began - the catalyst for creation.

Jesus always present and born in human form as we read in the New Testament.

The Holy Spirit always present and revealed on the Day of Pentecost, although there are many references to the Holy Spirit throughout the Bible such us:

'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me.' Jesus himself said it in the synagogue as Grace told us last week.

The Spirit comforts and guides and inspires.

The Son teaches and acts and gives us examples to follow.

The Father creates, loves and is constant.

A pretty good trio.

Why worry about it?

What we do know is that the Trinity allows and encourages us to be like Nicodemus.

To wrestle and wonder and ask questions.

To listen and be amazed at the teaching of God through Jesus as revealed by the Holy Spirit.

To know that we can all be born again – but that is another sermon.

So, what is the Trinity all about?

I, like many others before me, struggle with an exact answer. And to be honest that is the joy of the Trinity and the excitement of this Sunday.

We are always looking for a definitive answer.

It appears that Christians are happy to believe in this concept on the surface but then get their doo dahs in a terrible knot about the semantics just like poor old Nicodemus did.

However:

Nicodemus, who was a Pharisee, knew that Jesus was the Son of God. He could feel it in his bones and heard the amazing stories about Jesus performing signs and wonders.

That is why he sneaked to see him at night. He took a massive risk but was determined.

You would have thought that the Son of God would have made it easy for him, but he didn't.

He challenged Nicodemus and told him that he needed to cast off the old and be born from above. Born into new life, far richer than simple flesh and bones. WOW that is amazing.

Jesus said it was not always clear, a bit like the wind that blows, where does it come from? Where does it go? None of us know for sure but we do know it is there.

The Spirit is like that. It is not tangible but it's there, revealing the love of God to us and taking us to the next stage of Jesus' ministry which as again we heard last week did not end with Jesus but lives on through us.

So again, I ask:

I ask as the man who is many things as we all are but always basically Bob.

How do we define the Trinity?

I'm not completely sure.

But I think this Hymn sums it up pretty well in the last verse:

## **Holy Holy Lord God Almighty**

All thy <u>works</u> shall <u>praise</u> thy name, in <u>earth</u> and sky and sea.

Holy, holy! <u>Merciful</u> and mighty,

God in <u>three</u> persons, <u>blessed</u> Trinity.

Amen
