

Sano Connect EBB Qualifying Quick Reference

A subscriber is eligible for the Emergency Broadband Benefit if they (or someone in the household) participates in one of these federal assistance programs:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as Food Stamps
- Medicaid
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program, including at US Department of Agriculture Community Eligibility Provision schools
- Received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year
- Tribal Specific Programs:
 - Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
 - Tribal Head Start (only households meeting the relevant income qualifying standard),
 - Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (Tribal TANF)
 - Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations

OR

If the household is below a certain income level:

OR

If the household has had a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough:

The subscriber will need **two** documents: one to show the income change and one to show the current income.

- Loss of income documents:
 - Layoff/furlough notice
 - Unemployment application, approval letter, or benefit statement
- Current income documents:
 - 2020 state, federal, or tribal tax return
 - Social Security statement of benefits
 - Veterans Administration statement of benefits
 - Retirement or pension statement of benefits
 - Unemployment or Worker's Compensation statement of benefits
 - Divorce decree, child support award, or a similar official document showing your income
