# What is a flow?


 A specialized form of note taking for debate that helps you keep track of the round, organize arguments, and organize speeches



## What do you need to flow?

- At Least 2 Sheets/Sides of Paper (Can be Digital)
- Two different colored pens

## What does a flow look like?








# Notes on the Flow

- Flow vertically or column by column.
- Line up responses with the argument they're responding to.
- Use arrows for extensions.

- Round vision requires flowing all your strategic options.
- Organized speeches require organized flows.
- Less time writing down responses means more time to prep.
