

What is the North Central Lakelands Planning District?

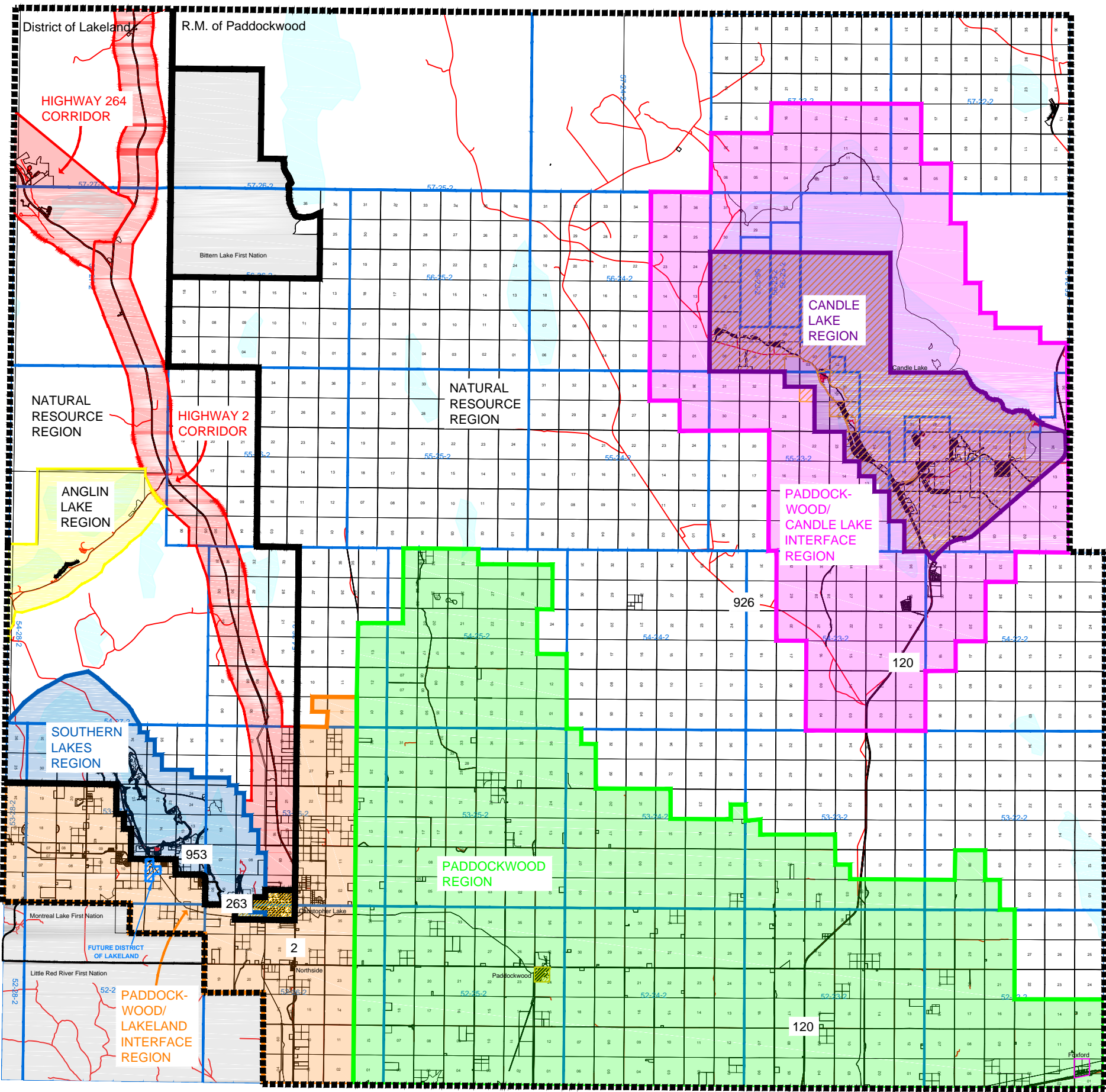
A Planning District is formed when several communities choose to develop and implement plans together based on common interests, concerns and an opportunity to realize benefits through cooperation.

Planning is an activity that supports quality of life and economic prosperity, therefore the development of a plan as a District of communities with common interests is a common step. In Saskatchewan, the framework for planning is governed by *The Planning and Development Act, 2007* (see [here](#) for more information).
