

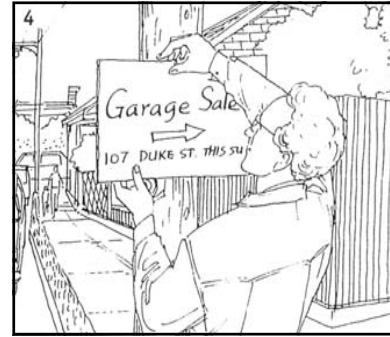
The Garage Sale

At the end of the day, Jim has \$190. He is very happy because now he can buy the boots in the local shop.

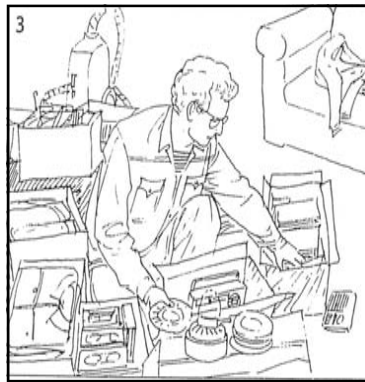
