Athanasian Creed


- P Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.
- Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.

Athanasian Creed

- P And the catholic faith is this,
- C that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.

- For the Father is one person,
- the Son is another,
- **P** and the Holy Spirit is another.
- But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.



- so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

- The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone.
- The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.

- The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.
- Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers;
- one Son, not three Sons;one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

- And in this Trinity none is before or after another;
- P none is greater or less than another;
 but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other and coequal,
- so that in all things, as has been stated above,

- The Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.
- Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.
