

Pastor's Message: You Meant it For Evil, But God Meant it For Good

Looking forward for the next few weeks, the largest upcoming event is Lent and its beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. Once again, we will be offering services at 1:30p and 7:00pm with Soup Suppers at 6:00pm. Lutheran Hour Lenten Devotions will also be available in the narthex a week or two before Ash Wednesday.

Our series this year is entitled "You Meant It For Evil, But God Meant It For Good". Here is a short description:

The familiar words of the Patriarch Joseph, "As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good" (Genesis 50:20) capture something of the uniqueness of Luke's account of Jesus's suffering, death, and resurrection.

Enemies, faithless disciples, hapless crowds, pragmatic powerbrokers, and Satan himself are all arrayed against the perfectly innocent Son of God. Through them, one evil purpose comes to pass: Jesus's destruction. God the Father, however, puts their plan to use and then overturns it in the victory that no one expected.

Can You Hear It Now?

In the Sunday Bible Study, Pastor has been leading us through the liturgy of the worship service. This past Sunday was a focus on what 'the church year means', and how it has different seasons and moods. Pastor shared in particular the goal of each member being able to feel the ebb and flow of penitential / reflective seasons with those of celebration through the selection of the liturgy we use for each season.

It was merely a month ago when we were hearing the Angels sing of at the birth of Christ and soon we will be finishing up Epiphany; a sort of mini overview of the ministry of Christ. Epiphany is a short 6-8 weeks' season of the church year, where we witness Christ's manifestation of his Divine Nature at His Baptism, the start of his ministry, his miracles which demonstrate His Godly power and compassion for humans. This short season ends with Transfiguration, when the disciples saw first hand the glory of Christ along with the presence of Moses and Elijah.

I hope you have been able to hear the different tones in our worship music, as we left Advent's minor sounding, thoughtful hymn tones to the high of Christmas's brilliant sounds in Joy to the World. Epiphany presents with a compilation of sounds, from the celebration of Christ's Baptism to the foreshadowing of the cross, and then wrapping up on Transfiguration with singing the last "Alleluia's" until Easter.

February will be a month of both joyous and somber hymn tunes. This year, at the end of February, we enter into the Lenten season with the repentant tones of Ash Wednesday.

Now that you know what to listen for, I am sure you'll be able to hear it now.

I Believe it is Never too Late to Say Thank you.

This past Christmas season the members of St. John gifted me a beautiful Christmas gift of donations collected from the members. Each year, I am humbled by the generosity of so many of you. I couldn't ask for more from a congregation. By singing 'new' hymns some members have shared that they now have a 'new favorite'.

I am so grateful to be a part of this congregation's music ministry. There isn't any other place I would rather be. Thank you for letting me 'play' my part.

The next book on our list is <u>Where the Crawdads</u> <u>Sing (ISBN 978-0735219106)</u> by Delia Owens. This is an exceedingly popular book that has recently been made into a movie. The description reads:

For years, rumors of the "Marsh Girl" have haunted Barkley Cove, a quiet town on the North Carolina coast. So in late 1969, when handsome Chase Andrews is found dead, the locals immediately suspect Kya Clark, the so-called Marsh Girl. But Kya is not what they say. Sensitive and intelligent, she has survived for years alone in the marsh that she calls home, finding friends in the gulls and lessons in the sand. Then the time comes when she yearns to be touched and loved. When two young men from town become intrigued by her wild beauty, Kya opens herself to a new life—until the unthinkable happens.

Where the Crawdads Sing is at once an exquisite ode to the natural world, a heartbreaking coming-of-age story, and a



surprising tale of possible murder. Owens reminds us that we are forever shaped by the children we once were, and that we are all subject to the beautiful and violent secrets that nature keeps.

CHRISTMAS 2022 WAS A BLAST! Like many countries over the world, globalization ensures that Cambodians know of Christmas. Decorations can be seen throughout Phnom Penh in December (and sometimes staying up long past the Christmas season!). Christmas classics in English can be heard in shops and malls. These external reminders of Christmas are nice, but are, unfortunately, devoid of any substance connected to the actual Christmas story. In a country with only 2% Christians, most Cambodians have no idea what Christmas is about. It is simply an imported cultural festival. But therein lies great opportunity for the church! In December, churches throughout Cambodia see Christmas as a ripe chance to proclaim the message of Jesus to those who do not yet know him. Special services and outreach programs are common in rural and urban areas. While some of our Christmas plans fell apart due to a bout with COVID-19, we did enjoy plenty of Christmas joy. Christ Lutheran Church in Phnom Penh had their Christmas service on December 18, with large numbers of members and guests in attendance, and capped by the singing of "Silent Night" by candlelight. Pastor Songim gave a great message about the gifts that God gives us in Jesus—namely our salvation. J.P. was honored to do a Scripture reading (in Khmer!). J.P. preached on Christmas morning, and in the evening we hosted the church's youth group for a party. We are honored to play a small part in what God is doing through His people in Cambodia.

J.P. TRAVELED TO KAMPONG CHUNANG to teach Luther's Small Catechism once again. Combining two groups, there were over 20 people in attendance, many of whom are key lay leaders from Pastor Kim Hai's area preaching stations. J.P. taught through all three articles of the Apostles' Creed over two days. The most boisterous conversations revolved around the third article, when we read Luther's startling words that "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him." It was a great chance to emphasize the depth of our human depravity, but also to be reminded that "the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, and sanctified and kept me in the true faith." May the Holy Spirit continue to lead these dear brothers and sisters!
