October's Book of the Month:
The Catechism of the Catholic Church

Last week, I finished reading the Bible in a year. I was very glad to have re-encountered the Lord's mysterious path for the Salvation of the world by reading all 46 books of the Old Testament and 27 books of the New Testament. I was very gratified to find out that many of you read the Bible in a year, either via the reading plan I shared with you last October or by participating in Fr. Mike Schmitz's *The Bible in a Year* podcast.

Fr Julian and I have encouraged you to participate in the Cathedral's *Book of the Month*, as it's important to grow in the knowledge of our Catholic Faith. Why? The prophet Hosea offers a stinging rebuke to priests who overlook the intellectual formation of their people: *My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. Because you have rejected knowledge, I reject you from being a priest to me* (Hos. 4:6).

For a new year-long intellectual journey, I'd like to invite you to join me in reading *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC). What is it and why is it important enough to read it? A catechism is an organized presentation of the essential teachings of the Catholic Church in regards to both faith and morals. The 2865 articles are organised by the 4 foundational pillars of our Catholic Faith:

the *Nicene Creed*: what we **believe**
the *Liturgy* and the *Sacraments*: how we **worship**
the *Ten Commandments*: how we **live** our life of faith
the *Lord's Prayer*: how we **pray**

The CCC is very intimidating, both in its size and depth of knowledge, so please use the attached **One-Year Reading Guide** in today's bulletin as an aid. While the CCC was primarily composed by those responsible for catechesis, such as bishops, priests, and catechists, there are other variations that are much more accessible: the *Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church* and also the *Youcat: Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church*. Whatever one uses, it's important that we gain knowledge about the truth and beauty of our Catholic Faith.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is available at the Gift Booth for \$30 or from your favourite retailer.

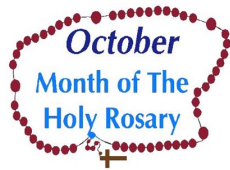

READING GUIDE

How to Read the Catechism of the Catholic Church In One Year – *One Day at a Time*

The topic of reading the Catechism of the Catholic Church came up during weekly small group faith sharing with some of my friends in the Cursillo Movement. Several guys expressed a desire to read the entire Catechism. Most acknowledged that they had only ever used it as a reference book when questions of the teachings of the Church arise.

Those who had tried to read it admitted to frustration at how they had become bogged down in Part I of the four-part volume. Of course, the mere size of the tome just became too overwhelming for some guys, and they never got through it. The fact that some of the sections are very “deep” and need to be read slowly and over and over hampered the progress of others.

Following our faith sharing session, I reflected on all of this and my own unfulfilled desire to read the Catechism. I prayed over it and asked the Holy Spirit to lead me if I am meant to read this holy book. I was led to examine the Catechism and to see if I could figure out a way to break it down and develop a plan for reading it that would overcome some of the hang-ups discussed with my friends.

The reading plan that follows addresses many of the common barriers to reading the Catechism. I want to be clear that the objective here is just to *read* the entire book. It is not an in-depth *study* of it. In-depth study could come later after reading it through at least one time. Let’s face it, if we read the entire Catechism just one time in our entire life, we will be among a very small percentage of Catholics who will have ever read it even one time!

Let’s look at the one-page reading guide. See how the year is broken down into 52 rows for the weeks, and seven columns for the days of the week. So you can begin following it on any day of the week, at any time in the year. And one year later you will be finished. Notice the paragraph numbers to be read each day are listed in each cell of the table. The first three days are devoted to the Prologue. Then on the fourth day we begin reading Part I, day five Part II, day six Part III, and day seven Part IV. So at the end of week one, we will have read a little from all parts of the Catechism. The idea is to keep it interesting and not get bogged down in one part.

Notice that the columns that contain paragraph numbers from Parts I and III are white. The columns that contain paragraph numbers from Parts II and IV are shaded. Scanning down the form we can see that through week 39 we are reading from all parts of the book every week. In fact, we will finish the shortest section, Part IV, in week 39.

On average over the course of the year, we are reading about seven paragraphs a day. When paragraphs are shorter, we read more of them—when they are longer, we read fewer. Most days we stop reading at a natural break point. So now the 2,865 paragraphs in the Catechism just don’t seem so intimidating when we take it *one day at a time!* Won’t you join me?
