



TATI 2022 - Application FAQ

What does TATI mean?

TATI is an acronym for the **Teaching Artist Training Institute**. A free training in arts education best practices for individuals interested in working with students with disabilities. Participants learn through observational classroom visits and professional development seminars.

Who Should Participate?

TATI participants are those with a genuine interest in working with students with disabilities. Previous TATI graduates have included teaching artists, administrators, classroom teachers, museum educators and arts therapists. Individuals currently working in the field are also encouraged to apply.

What is the Cost?

TATI is free for all participants.

Where is TATI?

TATI 2022 will be hybrid (both virtually and in person) in collaboration with P37 in Staten Island.

When is TATI?

TATI 2022 will take place over the course of six Thursdays: Occurring on six Thursdays both remotely and in person. January 13th*, January 20th, January 27th, February 3rd, February 10th, and February 17th*. Please note the *asterisk denotes a remote session.

Can I participate in TATI if I am not fully vaccinated from COVID-19?

Unfortunately, not at this time. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and NYC Department of Education schools regulations, all participants must be fully vaccinated to participate in the TATI 2022. Please note that to be considered fully vaccinated by CDC guidelines, two weeks must have passed since you received the second dose in a two-dose series or two weeks must have passed since you received a single-dose vaccine.
