


# Welcome

(8 weeks)

style of the questions. Adapt to how each topic is presented on the test.



## Grades 6-9 **Enrichment Classes**

#### **Grades 6-9 - Math Courses** (8 weeks)

Algebra 1 Learn to solve and graph linear equations. Master essential properties of algebra including the distributive and associative properties, the rules of exponents, and function notation.
<b>Geometry</b> Discover definitions, postulates, and theorems, and learn how to write proofs. Study parallel lines, polygons, circles, and solids. We throw in a sprinkle of constructions for added fun.
Algebra 2  Master the many types of functions and their inverses. We cover linear, quadratic, polynomial, exponential, logarithmic, and trigonometric functions and their graphs.

Our curriculum is designed by instructors who have advanced degrees in their subject areas and have taught or currently teach introductory courses at the university level.

We make sure our students are more than just "excellent sheep." By challenging them to think critically and independently, we equip them with the skills and confidence to make original and insightful contributions to their classes and receive recognition from their instructors.

We understand that the key to academic success is habit as much as ability. Therefore we focus on building strong study skills in our individual and group lessons in addition to content knowledge.



#### Grades 6-9 English Courses - First Session (4 weeks in July)

Classical Mythology and Storytelling (6th/7th grade, Reading Focus) From Shakespeare to Star Wars, contemporary literature, film, and music rests on the pillars laid by the Greeks, Romans, and other ancient mythmakers. Prepare your students for high school literature by treating them to the time-tested tales that have shaped Western and Eastern culture for thousands of years. Learning Greek and Latin root words in the context of these stories, students will hone the reading and writing skills necessary for classroom and standardized test success.

## **Introduction to Grammar and Literature** (7th/8th grade)

Students new to grammar and literature will dig deep into the classics, learning the same way William Shakespeare, Jane Austen, and Robert Frost learned. Scrutinizing famous novels and speeches, this class will super-size students' vocab, help them analyze sentences, and teach them to identify rhetorical devices. Along with these practical skills, they will likewise learn how to express their thoughts and cultivate sympathy for the diverse peoples they will encounter in school, work, and life.

#### The History of Ideas (8th/9th grade)

When students can't tell Genghis Khan from Julius Caesar, how can they possibly get that perfect five? This course eases the burden of demanding AP History, Literature, and Composition by relating the major events of history to developments in philosophy, literature, and science. Reading college-level texts every day, students will grow a plus-size vocabulary. Similarly writing every day, they will develop the skills needed to succeed on timed essays, college applications, and university research papers.

#### **Grades 6-9 English Courses - Second Session** (4 weeks in August)

#### Writing and Investigative Journalism (6th/7th grade)

In this course, students will learn how to collect, evaluate and present information in the form of newspaper articles. Each week, students will conduct original research, interviewing subjects and collecting information and data from corporations or government agencies, and "publish" their findings in the course's online journal. By the end of the course, students will have learned how to solicit information from multiple sources, evaluate the quality of the information they collect, and compile information into coherent pieces of writing. Additionally, students will hone their grammar skills by editing the work of their peers before publication.

#### **Argumentation and Debate** (7th/8th grade)

As innumerable distractions seek to dull their minds, students will sharpen their wits by learning the foundations of logic, the principles of rhetoric, and the art of debate. They will discover how to break down claims, use and abuse logical fallacies, and write sneaky questions that always get your way while developing platinum-level vocabulary. For the college-bound teen, these skills will help to meet future professors' demands for accurate research, sober arguments, and concise expression.

#### Writing and Research (8th/9th grade)

Transitioning from junior high to high school requires research skills that daunt many students. This class introduces them to precisely those skills. Students will learn how to use academic databases, distinguish peer-reviewed sources, and write according to the MLA, APA, and Chicago style guides, skills which they will use in their own original research paper. At the same time, they will discuss plagiarism, citation, and other concerns common to the high school and college classroom.





### English as a Foreign Language (8 weeks)

These courses take a long-term approach to language development and address underlying issues. Each class includes vocabulary, grammar, clear, concise writing, and plenty of reading. Students will also develop verbal skills as they interact with their instructor. We offer multiple levels:

## **College Admission Program**

Applying for college admission can be confusing, difficult, and frustrating. We can hurdle any obstacle and ensure that your application highlights the best version of yourself.

Here's how it works:

Program Price: \$3450

#### **Step 1: Parent Meeting**

Counselor holds meeting with parents and students to discuss important aspects of the application process, such as selecting appropriate "reach," "match," and "safety" schools and weighing tuition costs.

#### **Step 2: Create Common App and Naviance Accounts**

Counselor will help the students set up his or her Common App and Naviance account and ensure they are aware of all required materials (SAT scores, teacher recommendations) and deadlines.

#### **Step 3: Finalize School List**

Counselor meets individually with each student for 1-2 hours to finalize a list of 5-10 schools to which the student will complete applications, ensuring a proper balance of "reach," "match," and "safety" schools.

#### **Step 4: Draft the Common App Essay**

Counselor and student brainstorm essay topics that the student feels confident he or she could write about passionately and compellingly. After the student selects a topic, the counselor will guide him or her through multiple drafts of the essay until it is polished and ready to submit.

#### **Step 5: Draft Supplements**

Counselor and student evaluate what additional supplements are required and develop a plan to write 2-3 essays that can be used for multiple applications.

#### **Step 6: Finalize Applications**

Counselor meticulously reviews each individual essay and application before student submits.
