1. Have you ever known two siblings that had the same upbringing, but turned out completely different? What were some of those differences?

READ 1 Corinthians 10:1-11:1

2. The people of Israel had the same experience of God's deliverance and provision, yet not all of them responded the same way. What were the same experiences they had in **verses 1-4**? What is the warning in **verse 5**?
3. As the people were being led out of slavery by God, what were their hearts set on? Practically, what did that look like (**vs. 7-10**)?
4. Can we attend or serve in church and still not have our hearts in the right place? What is the danger of going through the "spiritual motions"? How can we protect ourselves from having calloused hearts?

5. **Read 1 Corinthians 1:13**. What kind of temptations do we face according to this verse? What kind of temptations do we give in to? Why is it important for us to realize that the temptations we face are not insurmountable?
6. Who sets the limits to our temptations? Some might see this and think that he is the reason that we are tempted. What does **James 1:13-15** say? What is the correlation between God's faithfulness and our temptation?
7. We have rights, but that doesn't mean that we should do whatever we want. What are three qualities that should help us determine our decisions according to **verses 23-24**?
8. What should keep us from doing something we might normally do (**vs. 28-29**)?
9. What should be the basis for everything that we do? What does that look like practically speaking in the day in and day out? What is the difference between what Paul is saying in **verse 33** and being a people pleaser?
10. What are ways in which you tell other believers in Christ to follow your example? What is the key in being able to say that (**see 11:1**)?
