

Fall 2021 Kentucky Campus Guide for Response to COVID19

Because of the resurgence of the COVID-19 pandemic, with the arrival of the δ and λ variants, we have implemented a guide that will keep all students, employees, and visitors in our community safe.

Vaccination in 2021

- With the release of several vaccines for Covid19, students are urged to take the vaccines as soon as it is made available to them.
- Students at CCCB – Kentucky are asked to self-disclose that they have received the vaccine to the Site Director.

Regardless of the availability of a vaccine, the CCCB-Kentucky campus will continue to maintain certain protocols to further safeguard the extension site's students, faculty, and staff.

Social Distancing Plans

- We use fewer chairs in the classrooms and social spaces in accordance to CDC guidelines.
- Masks or facial guards will be required on campus when in classroom and social spaces.
- We have no chapel services or dining facilities, so no large gatherings on CCCB's Kentucky campus.

Visit Policy for Visitors

- Anyone exhibiting symptoms of illness are asked to schedule a visit when they're healthy; virtual visits are an option to choose on the campus visit request form.
- Visitors that have known contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within 2 weeks of the visit must wait to visit campus at least 14 days after the known exposure.
- Masks must be worn when visiting campus, and groups may be limited depending on the time and the situation.
- All visitors to admissions will have their temperatures taken with a touchless thermometer upon arrival to campus; anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or above will be asked to reschedule their visit for a later time.

- CCCB Kentucky will continue to clean and sanitize, especially high-touch areas on campus; hand sanitizer is available for use, and regular hand-washing is expected.

Screening Methods

- We will refer students who have been exposed to COVID-19 or who demonstrate symptoms to various testing options in the Florence area.

Instructional Environment

- Students have required to wear a mask within the classroom and are strongly encouraged to wear them when gathered with other students.
- Students who have symptoms of COVID-19 are asked to watch class remotely. Attendance will be taken of students viewing class remotely.
- We have purchased technology to stream and record every class for the benefit of any student with symptoms or who have tested positive for COVID-19.
- Instructors who have COVID-19 symptoms will teach their classes remotely.

Field Residency Participants

- Students participating in a field residency must follow the guidelines developed by their respective residency site.

Dorm/Residential Measures

- We have no dormitory or residential space on the Kentucky campus.

Waiver of Liability

- We will ask CCCB students and employees to sign a waiver which demonstrates that they agree to attend class online if they feel unwell and they will self-quarantine for symptoms of COVID-19. Students must agree that they will not hold the school responsible if they catch any illness, including COVID-19, from any other student, faculty, or staff.

Reporting Responsibilities

- As students return to campus for any reason, we ask that they report that if they are exhibiting symptoms of illness to the student development office prior to their return for guidance on when to return to campus.
- If students are tested outside of the Boon County area, they have a responsibility for reporting this to the Site Director.
- The college will notify the campus of any positive cases reported and will communicate with anyone that is known to have had direct contact with the individual.

These guidelines will continuously be reviewed as we continue to monitor pandemic information from the CDC and receive recommendations from the Boone County Health Department. They are subject to change as the situation may require it.
