SA Remembers Grant

A South Australian Malinauskas Labor Government will establish a special grant to ensure RSL branches, can stage a COVID-safe ANZAC Day Dawn Service in 2022. Local councils that run commemorative events where RSL sub-branches no longer operate will also be eligible to apply.

Under our South Australia Remembers Grant, all RSL branches and local councils who also stage dawn services will be eligible to apply for a grant of up to \$10,000 to assist with employing additional marshals, funding road closures, ticketing, seating, marquees or getting assistance to develop COVID management plans.

A further \$25,000 will be provided to the RSL ANZAC Day Committee to assist with planning for the Anzac Eve Youth Vigil, Anzac Dawn Service, ANZAC March, and Service of Remembrance.

The total value of the fund for 2022 would be \$500,000 and a Labor Government would work with the RSL ANZAC Day Committee in the distribution of the grants.
