But it's this kind of love that ought to characterize Christian community. The kind that comes from giving your life to another person day after day after month after year, until finally your souls encounter each other. The kind that Christ gave to us.

When I told that little girl [a difficult student she had been teaching], "I love you," it had all the strength and fortitude of something infinite overcoming us both. It wasn't there the year before. But somehow along the way, unbeknownst to me and certainly against my inclinations, I'd come to love her. I'd come to realize that I would lay down my life for her.

I never chose to love her, though I certainly chose to be her teacher. I chose to smile every morning and to smile again when she got on my nerves. To wipe her dirty fingers when she smeared soil into the carpet and to listen to her babble incessantly when it should've been nap time. But none of these things were love.

Instead, love happened to me in the midst of these choices, the way sunshine happens to the horizon. You can't make the sun rise, but you can certainly choose to wait in the dark til it does. And love is the same. It's only possible when God's own transcendent love fills up the horizon of our souls and pours into the people that have our hearts. It's an experience, a three-way encounter between God, ourselves, and another. Until that happens, we haven't loved.

LECTIO SACRA

Old Testament Reading

Ecclesiastes 2:1-11

I said in my heart, "Come now, I will test you with pleasure; enjoy yourself." But behold, this also was vanity. I said of laughter, "It is mad," and of pleasure, "What use is it?" 



It is right to give him thanks and praise.



The Sanctus (Latin: "Holy") is a Christian hymn text, typically sung in response to The Sursum Corda. It is an invitation to join the voices of the church with the heavenly host, who are continually proclaiming the Father's glory (Isaiah 6:1-3; Matthew 21:9).

Communion Elements:

Cup: Wine or Grape Juice

Bread ingredients vary each week.

Rice Crackers: Organic Brown Rice Flour, Organic White Rice Flour

Prefilled, factory-sealed communion elements also available: Communion wafer ingredients: wheat flour, water, vegetable shortening (soybean oil, cottonseed oil).

(All are invited to come forward during Communion. The act of receiving the bread and wine is a confession, that as you receive those gifts, you have already received the gift of a renewed relationship with God, through Christ. If that is not your confession, you may still come forward to receive a prayer. Simply cross your arms across your chest as an indication that you are only coming for prayer.)





"Ministration" is the action of administering the sacrament (Communion)

Receiving Communion

We will come forward by rows, starting at the front and alternating sides to ensure distancing in the center aisle. As you come forward, please maintain distance with your neighbor.

Prayer for Receiving Communion

Lord Jesus, your perfect life, death, and resurrection are the source of all blessing in this life and the life to come. As I eat this bread and drink this cup, renew me in the joy and glory of knowing and serving you. I come to this table on the basis of your merit only and not my own.
