REFLECTION QUOTES

And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ–to the glory and praise of God.

Philippians 1:9-11

In his letter to the Philippians, Paul tells them that he prays for their discernment, that they would be able to discern "what is best." That's the challenge, isn't it? Discerning "what is best" sounds like an overwhelming task: so many factors, so much complexity in our lives and the lives of those around us, not to mention the difficulties inherent in the interaction of our home and host cultures.

I'm sure that together we could come up with a huge list of areas in our lives in which we feel a desperate need for discernment. At the moment, my use of technology, parenting, and ministry and service responsibilities top my own list. What do I do, what do I say, how do I respond? These questions confront me each morning as I consider the day ahead, and I often only have one prayer: "Lord, give me wisdom."....

To recognize what is good, we need the stories and instruction and poetry of Scripture to be in our bones, to be part of us at the deepest level. This is more than the ability to rattle off our dutifully memorized verses (though I am grateful for AWANA and the Navigators!). As we know from the many stories in Scripture, faithfulness does not require the same exact life and decisions from each of us. And as we know from decisions we have faced before, Scripture does not tell us whom we should marry, where we should live, how many children we should have. Simply memorizing Scripture will not be enough for us to be discerning in these decisions: we need something more to recognize what God is doing, and to see how the choices we make put us in line with that work.

This is why Paul begins his prayer with love: we are, as James K.A. Smith argues, what we love. We are people oriented by our hearts, by the desires and loves that captivate us. All of our decisions, subconscious and conscious, are directed by the compass of our hearts, to use Smith's metaphor....

So then, while checklists and questions to ask in making decisions can be very helpful, if we want to become people characterized by discernment, we must start with our hearts. Who or what do we love? What do we want? Of course, to answer them honestly will lead us to confession: we have not loved God or others, as we ought, we have not sought first his kingdom. But by God's grace, even in our confession of our failure to love rightly, we are taught to love rightly, because confession orients us to the cross of Jesus. And it is there that we recognize, we discern, what is truly best.

<u>Liturgical Colors</u>: Liturgical colors can orient us to the season of the church year and help to engage our sense of sight in worship.

White is the liturgical color of Trinity Sunday, symbolizing purity, holiness, and virtue, as well as respect and reverence.

The small symbols you will see throughout these pages correspond to a "Key to Liturgy" available here or printed and found in the lobby at the Grace Kids Table. .

The Acclamation, similar to a greeting, is a way we welcome each other into this holy space and time. It prepares us for the hearing and responding to God. Our liturgy can be thought of as a conversation between each other and God. Conversations require both hearing a responding. The Acclamation prepares us for the hearing and responding to God.

TRINITY SUNDAY

Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost. The God we worship is three–Father, Son, and Holy Spirit–but is also one. Historically, theologians have described the Trinity is "one God in three persons".

Though trying to wrap our heads around the mystery of the Trinity is often an exercise in bewilderment, there is so much beauty and power in the fact that God is both three and one.

In essence, the Trinity means that God is—at very core—a differentiated community bound together by love. All persons of the Trinity are distinct: the Father is not the Son, the Spirit is not the Son, and so on. But at the very same time, these distinct persons are bound to one another in love. And, by God's grace, we are invited to become woven into this community of love.

THE COLLECT FOR PURITY

Almighty God,

to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid:

Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts

by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen. A collect is a prayer that is intended to collect or sum up the prayers of the community, typically following a four-fold pattern: invocation, meditation, petition, and doxology. The Collect for Purity helps us to hear God's word and worship by reminding us that we are laid bare when we come before him. He sees and knows all that we are and all that we bring to him.

We come to God that we might be shaped and formed by his Word.

Genesis 1:26-2:3

Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground."

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."






Praying through the Psalms each week teaches us how to pray, using the prayer book of ancient Israel. As we pray, there will be pauses for reflection.





It is right to give him thanks and praise.



We Draw Near (The Lord's Supper)

(All are invited to come forward during Communion. The act of receiving the bread and wine is a confession, that as you receive those gifts, you have already received the gift of a renewed relationship with God, through Christ. If that is not your confession, you may still come forward to receive a prayer. Simply cross your arms across your chest as an indication that you are coming for prayer.)

Communion Elements:

Cup: Wine or Grape Juice

Bread ingredients vary each week.

Rice Crackers: Organic Brown Rice Flour, Organic White Rice Flour

Prefilled, factory-sealed communion elements also available:
Communion wafer ingredients: wheat flour, water, vegetable shortening (soybean oil, cottonseed oil).

Receiving Communion


