



UNIFORM POLICY: DRESS CODE

We believe students are powerful and capable of changing the world. At One School, our students will be solving real world problems and working with professionals in business, ministry and nonprofits and the dress code ensures students are presenting themselves respectfully and with professionalism. The uniform is also a key component of our school that fosters a sense of community, it helps us visualize that we are all on the same team!

Students that violate the dress code will meet with a building administrator to discuss the violation and may be asked to borrow used uniform items to dress appropriately for the remainder of the school day. Repeated violations may result in a parent meeting, potential loss of student privileges and further consequences.

Our dress code is based on creating a sense of TEAM by dressing in team colors daily. (Black, white, gray, yellow and khaki).

Tops:

- T Shirts and Polo shirts - long or short sleeve in white, black, gray, yellow
 - no school logo required - ALL are acceptable
 - Sport teams/college logos/bible verses allowed
 - No phrases, advertisements, or other writing allowed.
- Oxford shirts and blouses - long or short sleeve in white (no logo required)
- Sweaters – cardigans and vests in black, gray, white, yellow (no logo required)
- One School logo wear – including sweatshirts, jackets, athletic wear

NO:

- crop tops, spaghetti strap tops, low-cut or immodest tops
- holes in garments
- pajamas or sleepwear
- Hoods or hats are not to be worn in the school building.
- NOTE: Outside jackets are not to be worn through the school day (if students need to layer, they can wear sweaters, cardigans, or nice sweatshirts that are within the one-school color scheme)

**Bottoms:**

- Pants in khaki, black, gray
- Shorts in khaki, black, gray – no higher than 3 inches above the knee

Girls Only:

- Dresses, skirts and jumpers in khaki, black, gray – knee-length or longer
- Shorts no more than 3" above the knee
- Leggings or tights UNDER SKIRTS AND SHORTS ONLY in white, black, gray, yellow

NO:

- short or immodest bottoms - no bicycle shorts unless under a skirt
- blue jeans
- Leggings or biking shorts unless worn under a skirt

Shoes:

Comfortable dress shoes or tennis shoes with socks or tights.

NO: sandals / flip-flops (Crocs are OK)

Chapel:

NO specific required Chapel dress.

P.E. DRESS CODE

We require a P.E. dress code so that students have an optimum experience and are ready for active movement in our Physical Education class. By wearing a P.E. uniform, students will be able to move freely without regard to damaging their school uniform.

Students in grades K-8 will only be permitted to wear their P.E. uniform on P.E. class days. The schedule of P.E. class will be communicated to parents by the classroom teacher.

Students in grades K-5 will wear their P.E. uniform all day and students in grades 6-8 will be required to change in and out of their P.E. uniform before and after class.

P.E. Uniform

- Tops: T-shirts (One School shirts, plain white, plain black, plain gray, plain yellow)
- Bottoms: Modest shorts or sweatpants (black, grey, white and yellow)
- Shoes: Tennis shoes



DRESS DOWN DAYS - FRIDAYS AND VARIOUS SPIRIT DAYS

On Fridays and occasional theme based spirit days, students have a “dress down” day. These days serve as an incentive for a strong positive community and to give students a chance to express their individuality while adhering to the guidelines of respectful attire within the school community. The following rules will apply unless a specific theme is announced for the dress down/spirit day:

Overall, it is the same dress code as normal for the quality of clothes, the length of skirts, dresses and shorts with the following added allowances:

- Can wear jeans (without holes)
- Add colors outside of normal color scheme
