"Inside the Gate", Mount Olivet Cemetery Tour May 21, 2023

Setting aside time to focus on Respect, Remembrance and Reflection Did you know that buried in our cemetery are the unmarked graves of Union soldiers who died when Mount Olivet was commandeered and used as a hospital by retreating Federal troops from the First Battle of Bull Run. Also found inside the gate is the grave of an early church trustee who rode with JEB Stuart at Gettysburg. Step inside the gate to find the grave of Lemuel Marcey, a local constable, who lead the "Good Citizen League" posse that broke up the saloons and brothels in what is today Rosslyn. And lying beside her sister, is Sue Landon Vaughn, one of the women who it is thought helped establish Decoration Day.

We hope everyone in the congregation – children and adults – will find that a visit to our cemetery provides an opportunity to pause and reflect on the rich history of our church, the perseverance of our forebears and the natural beauty of this historic piece of land. We think of our cemetery as a museum without walls that offers a glimpse into the lives and challenges of those who came before.

The Parking Lot Committee Wants to Hear From You!


