The role of the Government of Aruba is to stimulate the creation of a robust waste sector from a value-chain perspective.

07

Re-structuring of Aruba's waste portfolio will be based on a long-term mindset, circular principles, & will be tackled from an integrated approach to waste management & policy design.

08

Oversee the waste sector by developing & implementing appropriate regulation enforcement of the regulatory frameworks & consistent auditing.

09

Any person, household or business that has or (temporarily) rents a waste bin or container, regardless of size or volume, is (financially) responsible to maintain the surrounding area clean on which the bin or container is placed.

10

The waste hierarchy will serve as the guiding principle for waste sector, the commercial sector, the community at large, & the Government of Aruba.
