Bible Story: At the Potter's House-Jeremiah 18:1-18 **Read Together**: Isaiah 64:8; Psalm 139:17-18

Questions

- Why was Jeremiah called the "weeping prophet?"
- Where did God tell Jeremiah to go?
- What message did God want Jeremiah to tell people?
- Does God ever stop molding and shaping us into His image?
- When is a time you don't feel secure?
- What people did God put in your life to help you feel secure? How do they do that?
- What thoughts does God have about you? How does this help you feel secure in who God made you to be?

Family Activity: Play-Doh People

For this activity you will need play-doh for each person and toothpicks (or you can use shortened pieces of uncooked spaghetti noodles). Sculpt a person from the play-doh. Use the toothpicks like bones inside the body or as props outside the body to make it stand up. Would your person have been able to stand up without the support of the toothpicks?

When called Jeremiah to be a prophet, Jeremiah didn't want to do it because he thought he wasn't good enough (Jeremiah 1:6), but God assured Jeremiah He would always be with him. The only way to feel secure is to trust in our faithful God to support and protect you. This week, read Psalm 139:1-18 together. It is full of ways to understand God's love for you. Which is your favorite?
